## CITY HALL WILL BE CLOSED THE FOLLOWING DATE

Remember, <u>NO</u> trash will be picked up on the days City Hall will be closed. <u>For those</u> <u>whose normal trash day will be missed</u> - there will be **CURBSIDE ONLY** pickup on: **Wednesday, March 27, 2024.** 

## APRIL IS RESIDENTIAL BIG TRASH PICKUP MONTH

Items must **NOT** be placed out for collection earlier than three (3) days preceding the regular scheduled big trash collection day.

Ward 1 Wednesday April 3rd, 2024 Ward 2 Wednesday April 10th, 2024 Ward 3 Wednesday April 17th, 2024 Ward 4 Wednesday April 24th, 2024

Big Trash <u>INCLUDES</u>, but is not limited to: household appliances, furniture, carpet, mattresses, box springs, water tanks, fencing (up to 4 panels) and similar non-contracted items, bagged grass, and brush produced as refuse from single-family dwellings. Compressors must be removed from all appliances **BEFORE** collection may be completed. Doors on refrigerators and other bulky items **MUST** be removed before placement on curb.

Items <u>EXCLUDED</u> under the definition of big trash include hospital and medical waste, poisons, acids and caustics, explosives, dirt and rocks, sewage and liquid waste, nuclear materials, gasoline, kerosene, propane tanks, degreasers, lubricants, tires and rims, antifreeze, paint, and commercial construction debris, bricks or concrete. Call sanitation at 491-6474 if you have any questions.

<u>SIZE OF MATERIAL</u>: Big trash shall be a length not exceeding 10 feet or a weight exceeding 250

pounds. Tree trimmings and branches must be placed together in piles with individual branches

no longer than 8 feet and dead trees (not more than 6 inches in diameter).

The <u>TOTAL</u> amount allowed at the curb is 8 cubic yards (equal to what you can place in the back of 2 full size pickup beds level with the top of the cab). There will be an additional fee of \$15.00 for each cubic yard of bulky waste collected in excess of eight (8) cubic yards

**DON'T** store old tires outside! USED TIRES STORED OUTSIDE IS A VIOLATION OF CITY ORDINANCE 8.04.010

**DO** store tires in an ENCLOSED structure.

# Sewer Rate Format Change

In an effort to help our residents and business owners understand the Sewer Rate portion of their utility bill, we have changed the way the line item will look.

Before, the RS (residential sewer) and CS (commercial sewer) reflected the total amounts of sewer (usage per thousand gallons x usage rate+base). Now, it will be separated into 2-line items to make it a little easier to figure out how much sewer you are being charged. The first line item will reflect the base rate figure and the second line item will reflect the usage figure times the per thousand gallons of water.

Residential Utility bills will see these line item changes starting on their **April 2024** utility bill. It will show their **Residential Sewer base** line item that will reflect the \$10.50 sewer base rate. And the **Residential Sewer Usage** line that will reflect the \$4.80 x the average amount of water usage, per thousand gallons, for December, January and February.

## ANNUAL THREE-MONTH AVERAGE WATER USAGE

Every year the City of Warr Acres recalculates the next year's sewer rates based on a report from the Oklahoma City or Bethany Water Departments listing a three-month average consumption of water usage for each residential property. This means that your sewer bill from April 2024 to March 2025 could have an increase, decrease, or your rate could remain the same depending on how much water consumption you had during December 2023, January 2024 and February 2024. These new rates will be reflected on your April 2024 bill, which will be sent out around the 20<sup>th</sup> of April.

If your April 2024 bill reflects a substantial increase, it may be because you had a water leak, a toilet or faucet that continually ran during those three (3) winter months. If you had a plumber repair one of these problems during these months, then you can bring in the plumbing repair bill to Warr Acres City Hall. Our utility billing clerk can recalculate your average water usage for a lower sewer rate. But you **MUST** have a plumbing repair invoice indicating the problem occurred during the months stated above in order for your sewer rate to be recalculated.
