2006-2007 BUDGET APPROVED

At a public hearing at the City Hall on June 12th, the City Council approved the City of Warr Acres Budget for fiscal year 2006-2007. The total approved budget was \$8.8 million.

Big Trash Saturdays Discontinued

In the Council's efforts to control expenditures, they have decided to discontinue the First Saturday of the Month Big Trash Dump at the City Yard. The Council felt it was cost prohibitive. But the good news is that the Fall Big Trash Pick Up has been reinstated! On the four Wednesdays of October, the Sanitation Department will pick up all big trash placed on the curbs. Ward 1 will be picked up on October 4th; Ward 2, October 11th; Ward 3, October 18th and Ward 4, October 25th.

Honoring Senior Citizens

The "Citizens for a Better Warr Acres" are continuing their project to video the senior citizens of the City of Warr Acres in preparation for the upcoming 60th anniversary of the City in 2008. This month those interviewed were: Ms. Lorine Flood age 93, Ms. Margo Rost age 85, and Mr. & Mrs. Marvin Franklin age 90 and 87, respectively.

Ms. Flood and her daughter, Mary Lou Coppin (pictured at right), told how her family moved to her present residence at 5408 N.W. 45th Street on July 4, 1950. They could stand on their front porch facing north and plainly see Lake Hefner. It rained for the first three months, and they all shoveled mud from their front yard. John and Myrtie Bommer had moved next door in June so they borrowed water from them. The street was paved but had no curbs. Everyone walked to N.W. 39th Street to catch the bus. No one had a second car.





Ms. Margo Rost, now a resident of Southern Plaza Living Center, and her daughter, Kedre, (pictured at left) told us how her husband, the former Mayor John Rost, loved the City. He was a pharmacist and owned a drug store at 39th & MacArthur. They had the phone set up to transfer calls to their home at 36th & Ann Arbor after hours. When doctors called in prescriptions during the night, Mayor Rost would get up and go to the drug store to fill the prescriptions. One morning at about 1:00 a.m., he was driving to the drug store to fill a prescription when he noticed fire coming out of Putnam City Central Jr. High School. When he got to the drug store, he called the fire department. They came, put out the fire and saved the school. Mayor & Mrs. Rost sponsored the Miss Warr Acres Pageant for many years. Five of the winners went on to be Miss Oklahoma.

Mr. & Mrs. Marvin Franklin, now residents of Edmond, told of the early days of Warr Acres. Marvin served on the City Council under Mayor Bert Sheriff. He told us of his job in Washington, D.C., as Under Secretary of the Interior. When they first lived in Warr Acres, Putnam City Methodist Church was not very old. It was founded in 1938 and they are still members.
