REMEMBER - SCHOOL HAS STARTED AGAIN!

Please stay alert to children walking to and from area schools.

Pay particular attention to the school crosswalks. The crossing guards are public safety employees and work under the supervision of the Chief of Police. Motor

vehicles and pedestrians are required to follow the directions of a crossing guard. Failure to follow such direction is subject to traffic laws and may result in conviction or fines.

NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY



- A social neighborhood is a safe neighborhood
- Know your neighbors. Become familiar with the three homes in front of you and the two on either side.
- Report crime call 911 to report all suspicious activity (NEVER approach a suspicious person)
- <u>Be social</u> host social events (a social neighborhood is a safe neighborhood)
- Work together develop a method of notifying fellow neighbors of suspicious activity.



Don't get frustrated with the 911 Dispatcher when more details are requested after the basics are given. This does **NOT** mean an officer has not yet been sent. The first information you give the 911 call taker is dispatched over the police radio **as soon as the information is given**.

KEEP WARR ACRES NEAT & CLEAN

As a reminder, code enforcement does not allow parking on lawns, heaping refuse such as tires, furniture or large piles of brush on lawns, unless it is time for big trash day, or having appliances, scrap wood, etc. stored on front porches. Also, lots covered in weeds or excessively tall grass are not allowed.

Be a courteous neighbor. When walking your dog, please be kind, don't leave poop behind.

- Practice your plan and be sure all family members know what to do.
- City offices are **LOCKED** during a **tornado warning**.

NO TEMPORARY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR PAYMENTS!

Please remember that the City of Warr Acres does NOT accept temporary checks in payment of any utility bills or licensing fees. Checks must be pre-printed with the name, address, routing number, and account number and be completely filled out.

FIRE ESCAPE PLANNING



FEMA advises that in the event of a fire, remember that **EVERY SECOND COUNTS**, so you and your family must always be prepared. Escape plans help you get out of your home quickly. In less than 30 seconds, a small flame can get completely out of control and turn into a major fire.

PREPARE and **PRACTICE** your fire escape plan twice a year with everyone in your household, including children and people with disabilities. Some tips to consider when preparing your escape include:

- Draw a map of your home and show all doors and windows. Find two ways to get out of each room. Make sure all doors and windows that lead outside open easily.
- Teach children how to escape on their own in case you cannot help them.
- Have a plan for everyone in your home who has a disability.
- Practice your fire escape plan at night and during the daytime.

REMEMBER. in the event of a fire:

- 1. IMMEDIATELY leave the home.
- 2. NEVER open doors that are hot to the touch.
- 3. DESIGNATE a meeting place outside and take attendance.
- 4. ONCE OUT, STAY OUT! Never go back into a burning building for any reason.
