# Recycling

Recycling dumpsters are available at Dorothy Cavener Park, in the area of NW 52nd and Hammond Avenue on the first Saturday and Sunday of each month. Recycling includes paper, plastic, glass, aluminum and tin cans.

## ANNUAL BUSINESS FIRE/SAFETY INSPECTIONS

Within the next several weeks, a Fire Company will be visiting your **BUSINESS** establishment to complete a Business Safety Survey. In order to prepare for the upcoming visit, the following are specific items that will be assessed:

- Address must be visible from the street
- Fire extinguishers must be inspected and tagged annually by a licensed company
- Automatic fire sprinklers or kitchen hood systems must be inspected and tagged annually by a licensed company
- Exits should be clear, accessible, and marked with proper signs and lighting
- Emergency lighting should be in place where no natural lighting is available
- Electrical panels must be enclosed and have an accessible area of at least 3 feet surrounding the panel
- **Extension cords** are not allowed for permanent fixtures
- Flammable and combustible liquids should be kept to a minimum and stored in approved containers
- Storage areas must be accessible without hazards
- Fire lanes must be properly marked

### JANUARY IS BIG TRASH PICKUP MONTH

Ward 1 Wednesday January 9, 2013

Big Trash INCLUDES, but is not limited to: household appliances, furniture, carpet, mattresses, box springs, water tanks, fencing and similar non-contracted items, bagged grass, and brush produced as refuse from single-family dwellings. Compressors must be removed from all appliances **BEFORE** collection may be completed. Doors on refrigerators and other bulky items **MUST** be removed before placement on curb.

Items **EXCLUDED** under the definition of big trash include hospital and medical waste, poisons, acids and caustics, explosives, dirt and rocks, sewage and liquid waste, nuclear materials, gasoline, kerosene, propane tanks, degreasers, lubricants, tires and rims, antifreeze, paint, and commercial construction debris, bricks or concrete. Call sanitation at 491-6474 if you have any questions.

SIZE OF MATERIAL: Big trash shall be a length not exceeding 10 feet or a weight exceeding 250 pounds. Tree trimmings and branches must be placed together in piles with individual branches not longer than 8 feet and dead trees (not more than 6 inches in diameter).

The TOTAL amount allowed at the curb is 8 cubic yards (equal to what you can place in the back of 2 full size pickup beds level with the top of the cab).

# SANITATION DEPARTMENT – ICE AND SNOW

The sanitation department has always attempted to provide garbage service throughout the city regardless of the weather. When the city experiences ice storms, we must alter the way we gather the garbage for the safety of our workers. For the safety of our citizens, it is suggested that they hold their trash until the next scheduled pick up day.

When there is ICE on the ground, garbage "will not be picked up." When there is SNOW on the ground, garbage "will be picked up Curbside only."
