## **DEAR WARR ACRES BUSINESS OWNER OR MANAGER:**



It is time for your annual Fire/Safety Inspection. In 2015, the Warr Acres Fire Department will be visiting your establishment to complete a Business Safety Survey. Not only is this inspection beneficial to your company and employees, but it also ensures the safety of your customers. This visit allows your Fire Department to become familiar with specific locations or conditions of hazards that might be encountered during an emergency situation.



We will be assessing items including: fire lanes, visible street addresses, clear exit pathways, proper emergency lighting, electrical panels, storage of flammable liquids or hazardous materials, extension cord usage, and annual inspection tags on fire extinguishers, automatic fire sprinklers and hood systems.

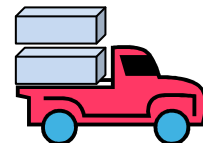


Big Trash **INCLUDES**, but is not limited to: household appliances, furniture, carpet, mattresses, box springs, water tanks, fencing and similar non-contracted items, bagged grass, and brush produced as refuse from single-family dwellings. Compressors must be removed from all appliances **BEFORE** collection may be completed. Doors on refrigerators and other bulky items **MUST** be removed before placement on curb.

Items **EXCLUDED** under the definition of big trash include hospital and medical waste, poisons, acids and caustics, explosives, dirt and rocks, sewage and liquid waste, nuclear materials, gasoline, kerosene, propane tanks, degreasers, lubricants, tires and rims, antifreeze, paint, and commercial construction debris, bricks or concrete. Call sanitation at 491-6474 if you have any questions.

**SIZE OF MATERIAL:** Big trash shall be a length not exceeding 10 feet or a weight exceeding 250 pounds. Tree trimmings and branches must be placed together in piles with individual branches not longer than 8 feet and dead trees (not more than 6 inches in diameter).

The **TOTAL** amount allowed at the curb is 8 cubic yards (equal to what you can place in the back of 2 full size pickup beds level with the top of the cab).



Items cannot be placed out for pick-up earlier than four days preceding the regularly scheduled bulk waste collection day **FOR YOUR WARD**.

## **SANITATION DEPARTMENT – ICE AND SNOW**

The sanitation department has always attempted to provide garbage service throughout the city regardless of the weather. When the city experiences ice storms, we must alter the way we gather the garbage for the safety of our workers. For the safety of our citizens, it is suggested that they hold their trash until the next scheduled pick up day.

When there is **ICE on the ground**, garbage “will not be picked up.” When there is **SNOW on the ground**, garbage “**will be picked up Curbside only.**”

**CITY STORM SHELTERS TO BE PERMANENTLY CLOSED.** All storm shelters in Warr Acres will be permanently closed effective January 1, 2015. City office buildings do **NOT** meet storm shelter standards set by FEMA (Federal Emergency management Agency) and will be **LOCKED** during a tornado warning. City officials suggest that people take shelter where they are when bad weather is approaching and have a personal emergency operations plan that they have practiced.
