SAFETY TIPS FOR TURKEY FRYERS

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission is issuing safety tips for preventing fires and burns when using turkey fryers.

The majority of reported incidents occurred while the oil was being heated, prior to adding the turkey. For this reason, it is **VERY** important to monitor the temperature of the oil closely. If **ANY SMOKE AT ALL** is noticed coming from a heating pot of oil, the burner should be turned

OFF immediately because the oil is overheated.

There is a risk of injury resulting from splashing due to the cooking of partially frozen meats. **THOROUGHLY THAW** and dry **ALL** meats **BEFORE** cooking in hot oil. One reported burn incident occurred when partially frozen chicken wings were added to hot oil in a turkey fryer.

CPSC staff recommends consumers who choose to fry turkeys follow the following safety guidelines:

- Keep fryer in FULL VIEW while burner is on.
- Place fryer in an open area AWAY from all walls, fences, or other structures.
- Never use IN, ON, or UNDER a garage, breezeway, carport, porch, or any structure that can catch fire.
- Raise and lower food SLOWLY to reduce splatter and avoid burns.
- COVER bare skin when adding or removing food.
- Check the oil temperature frequently.



CONSTRUCTION AT CITY HALL

Until construction is completed, there will be **NO NIGHT DROP** available. Please mail your payment to City Hall or bring it by between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm.

Again, during this construction, the glass entrance doors will be CLOSED. The temporary entrance is through the FRONT bay door of the fire department. Thank you for your cooperation.

THANK YOU TO GOLDEN CORRAL and other Warr Acres businesses who participated in Veteran's Appreciation Day by providing free meals to veterans and currently enlisted military personnel. Golden Corral estimates that 1,046 past and present members of our armed services were served free meals and approximately \$16,004 was raised for the Disabled American Veterans organization.



MOTHERS AGAINST DRUNK DRIVING is placing a recycle bin in the area of NW 52ND and Hammond Avenue. A representative of MADD will be present at this location on the first weekend of each month following the same schedule as that of Warr Acres recycling. This bin is for collection of unwanted clothing, shoes and small household items that may be recycled to assist in the funding for MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) in Oklahoma.

MADD is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization which assists in education programs in the schools, helping children make better decisions on drinking and driving, providing victim advocacy programs, and providing victim panels for offenders to help them learn the impact of their decision to drink and drive. MADD is also a strong lobby organization in the state for tough drunk driving laws to protect our citizens. Drinking and driving arrests by underage drivers is up 21% in the last 10 years. Twenty-four Oklahoma children were killed in drunk driving accidents last year. Of the over 17,000 DUI arrests in 2010 in Oklahoma, 224 of those were underage drivers.
