### <u>"IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING"</u>

Be a good neighbor if you see suspicious persons or activity please don't hesitate to call 911. On occasion, there have been day time burglaries and our neighbors have seen suspicious activities, yet did not call our police department. Your police officers need your help by being vigilant to your surroundings.

When you see an unfamiliar vehicle or persons across the street please notify police. Many burglaries have been solved by neighbors calling in unusual activities in their neighborhood. We can arrive at the scene within a minute or two and determine if they have legitimate business in the area. The citizens can be our eyes and ears to assist us in apprehending persons bent on stealing from you and your neighbors.

## THURSDAY, OCTOBER 31, IS TRICK OR TREAT NIGHT:

- 1. Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
- 2. Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see the children.
- 3. Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before allowing your children to eat them.
- 4. Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others to see you.
- 5. Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
- 6. Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls.

Because there will be many of our children out in our community, all of us must be careful and watchful. Should anyone see anything suspicious, please don't hesitate to call the Warr Acres Police Department. Drivers, please drive carefully and watch out for children. Everyone can have a safe and wonderful Halloween if we're all vigilant.

## THE OKLAHOMA COUNTY TRIAD PROGRAM FOR SENIORS



TRIAD is a collaborative effort between the Oklahoma County Sheriff's Office, local police departments and senior citizens working together to reduce and prevent crimes against seniors.

S.A.L.T. (Seniors and Law Enforcement Together) Councils are groups which carry out the TRIAD activities. There are currently 11 active S.A.L.T. Councils, including one in Warr Acres which meets at **9:00 AM on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of each month** at the Warr Acres Community Center located at 4301 N. Ann Arbor Ave. **All seniors are invited to attend** these meetings which are for people 55+. People over 55 are targeted by crooks specifically because of their age, and the TRIAD program gives seniors additional tools and information that they can use to protect themselves.

Each month, there is a short meeting at the Warr Acres Community Center to talk about the things that have been going on in YOUR community. The information comes straight from your local law enforcement officials, instead of the evening news. There are occasional special events that you will get exclusive invitations to, all designed to keep you and your family safe from harm.

A few of the activities hosted by the TRIAD program are:

- <u>Refrigerator Card Program</u>: gives emergency responders immediate information to help serve you better in case of an emergency
- Educational Seminars: Programs available on fraud, scams, identity theft, personal safety, etc.
- <u>Grandparents Raising Grandchildren</u>: Donations are accepted from various partners. Those donations are used to assist grandparents on a fixed income to give their grandchildren a traditional Christmas experience, including a Christmas turkey for each family, along with gifts presented by Santa Claus at our annual reception.
- <u>Elder Law Day</u>: A half-day seminar dedicated to legal issues that affect seniors. Sponsored by Mercy Health Center.

**Staying informed** is the best way to stay ahead of the criminals. If you are a senior in War Acres, please make plans to attend the next meeting of the TRIAD S.A.L.T. group at the Community Center. No reservation is required. Bring a friend or neighbor!
