- City offices are LOCKED during a tornado warning.

Recycling

Recycling dumpsters are available at Dorothy Cavener Park, in the area of NW 52nd and Hammond Avenue on the first Saturday (9-3) and Sunday (1-3) of each month. Recycling includes plastic, glass, aluminum and tin cans. Closed during inclement weather.



SATURDAY, OCTOBER 31, IS TRICK OR TREAT NIGHT:

- 1. Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
- 2. Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see the children.
- 3. Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before allowing your children to eat them.
- 4. Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others to see you.
- 5. Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
- 6. Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls.

Because there will be many of our children out in our community, all of us must be careful and watchful. Should anyone see anything suspicious, please don't hesitate to call the Warr Acres Police Department. Drivers, please drive carefully and watch out for children. Everyone can have a safe and wonderful Halloween if we're all vigilant.

POSSIBLE SAVINGS ON HOME AND BUSSINESS INSURANCE

Recently the City's Fire Department had a Public Protection Classification survey conducted which included an analysis of the structural fire suppression delivery system provided in our city. We are proud to say that under the leadership of Fire Chief Stephen Coy the classification rating has been raised to a 3. This is considered an excellent rating. The Public Protection Classification Program plays an important role in the underwriting process at most insurance companies. They use this information as part of their decision making when deciding what coverage to offer or prices to charge for personal or commercial property insurance. Pick up a letter from City Hall describing this information if you would like to inquire with your insurance company about the possibility of lower insurance premiums due to this rating.
