Fire Chief Koger and Police Chief Patty discussed with Council Members reference the emergency protocol for their departments.

Attorney Love stated he would have a resolution composed for the next meeting, the resolution to be effective 1-1-15. Mayor Woolley stated his policy decision will be to close the City Hall, Police and Fire Dept. buildings and send non-essential employees home if a tornado is close.

7. Discussion and possible action on an audio/video system for the Council Chambers.

Officer Darryl Goodman gave an overview of the proposed audio-video system.

Chris Hodges, Sales Director for Nobel System, briefly explained how the system would work in the council chambers. Discussion among Council members reference specifications, bids received, new equipment and functions of the new system. Mr. Hodges stated estimated completion time of two weeks.

Motion by Councilwoman Maxey, seconded by Councilman Mickley to award the audio/video system bid for the Council Chambers to Nobel System, increasing the amount by \$4,000.00, not to exceed \$25,000.00.
