MONDAY, OCTOBER 31, IS TRICK OR TREAT NIGHT:

1. Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
2. Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see the children.
3. Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before allowing your children to eat them.
4. Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others to see you.
5. Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
6. Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls.



Because there will be many of our children out in our community, all of us must be careful and watchful. Should anyone see anything suspicious, please don't hesitate to call the Warr Acres Police Department. Drivers, please drive carefully and watch out for children. Everyone can have a safe and wonderful Halloween if we're all vigilant.

“IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING”

Be a good neighbor. If you see suspicious persons or activity, please don't hesitate to call 911. Your police officers need your help by being vigilant to your surroundings. Many burglaries have been solved by neighbors calling in unusual activities in their neighborhood. We can arrive at the scene within a minute or two and determine if they have legitimate business in the area. The citizens can be our eyes and ears to assist us in apprehending persons bent on stealing from you and your neighbors.



RECYCLING IN WARR ACRES

For those residents who want to participate in a recycling program, please take advantage of the monthly recycling that occurs on the first weekend of each month (Saturday 9-3, Sunday 1-3) at Dorothy Cavener Park (NW 52nd and Hammond Ave). Please also be aware that the hours of recycling are contingent upon weather such as excessive cold or heat and holidays. Recycling includes plastic (with a “1” or a “2” inside the recycle triangle), glass (clear, brown and green), aluminum and tin cans (NO foil or pie pans). Please rinse your items prior to donating. HELP KEEP WARR ACRES NEAT AND CLEAN

Be a courteous neighbor by keeping your yard mowed and picked up of debris. Since the weather is getting cooler, pests such as spiders, mice, rats, and skunks are more likely to take up residence in overgrown yards and clutter.

SANITATION DEPARTMENT – ICE AND SNOW

The sanitation department has always attempted to provide garbage service throughout the city regardless of the weather. When the city experiences ice storms, we must alter the way we gather the garbage for the safety of our workers. For the safety of our citizens, it is suggested that they hold their trash until the next scheduled pick up day.

When there is **ICE on the ground**, garbage “will not be picked up.” When there is **SNOW on the ground**, garbage “**will be picked up Curbside only.**”
