TUESDAY, OCTOBER 31, IS TRICK OR TREAT NIGHT:

1. Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
2. Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see the children.
3. Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before allowing your children to eat them.
4. Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others to see you.
5. Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
6. Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls.

WARR ACRES FIRE DEPT & PC HIGH SCHOOL CAMPAIGN TO REDUCE TEXTING & DRIVING



The Warr Acres Fire Department, with support from PC High School and the Warr Acres Police Department presented a campaign to reduce texting and driving. As parents and students pass the wrecked vehicle and banners at 50th and Ann Arbor, they are reminded of the intrinsic danger in using mobile devices while operating a vehicle. SANITATION DEPARTMENT – ICE AND SNOW

The sanitation department has always attempted to provide garbage service throughout the city regardless of the weather. When the city experiences ice storms, we must alter the way we gather the garbage for the safety of our workers. For the safety of our citizens, it is suggested that they hold their trash until the next scheduled pick up day. When there is **ICE on the ground**, garbage "will not be picked up." When there is **SNOW on the ground**, garbage "**will be picked up Curbside only.**"
