- Winterize your vehicle and keep a full tank of gas
- Insulate your home including windows and doors
- Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected every year
- Put together a supply kit including enough food and water for each person and pet
- Have flashlights and batteries handy Have extra sets of warm clothes and blankets

BUSINESS SAFETY INSPECTIONS

The Warr Acres Fire Department will be conducting Business Safety Inspections in an effort to eliminate, correct, and reduce hazards. These inspections/pre-fire plans are designed to help prevent fires while protecting life and property. Some common code violations we have seen in previous years which require correction include: out of date/untagged extinguishers, blocked exits, blocked electrical panels, malfunctioning emergency lighting, no exit signage, and untagged sprinkler systems.

COLD WEATHER SAFETY

The Centers for Disease Control offers the following tips for extreme cold weather temperatures:

SUPPLIES:

- Stock up on food that needs no cooking or refrigeration, such as bread, crackers, cereal, canned foods (don't)
- forget a non-electric can opener!) and dried fruits. Remember baby food and formula if you have young children.
- Water stored in clean containers (5 gallons per person)
- Medicines that any family member may need.
- Blankets, matches, first aid kit, battery-powered clock or watch and extra batteries.
- Help seniors prepare by storing food in the event that travel becomes hazardous. Prepare for power outages with working flashlights.
- Keep phone numbers for the electric company, gas company, water company, etc. handy for emergency purposes.

NAVIGATION:

- Walking and driving in harsh weather can be dangerous for senior citizens. Special devices can make shoes grab onto icy sidewalks, while door mats help absorb ice, snow and water.
- During winter, keep your vehicle's gas tank near full to help avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines. Keep your vehicle equipped with blankets, booster cables, flashlights, extra batteries, and a windshield scraper.
- Never pour water on your windshield to remove ice or snow; shattering may occur.

INDOOR SAFETY:

- Use fireplace, wood stoves, or other combustion heaters ONLY if they are properly vented to the outside and do not leak flue gas into the indoor air space.
- Ensure adequate ventilation if you must use a kerosene heater.
- Do not place a space heater within 3 feet of anything that may catch on fire.
- Monitor body temperature. Infants less than one year old should NEVER sleep in a cold room because infants lose body heat more easily than adults; and unlike adults, infants can't make enough body heat by shivering.

OUTDOOR SAFETY:

- Dress warmly and stay dry.
- The outer layer of clothing should be tightly woven, preferably wind resistant, to reduce body-heat loss caused by wind.
- Wool, silk, or polypropylene inner layers of clothing will hold more body heat than cotton.
- Do not leave pets outside in cold, wet, snowy weather. If it's too cold for you: it's too cold for your pet.

RECYCLING NEWS:

Just a reminder that the **ONLY** plastic items that the recycling dumpsters can accept are those with a "1" or a "2" inside the recycle triangle. Most butter bowls, yogurt, cottage cheese and sour cream containers are NOT eligible for recycle with us. These are guidelines set by Waste Management. Please remember to rinse your items prior to bringing them to the recycling dumpsters. Please note the following items that are accepted:

- Aluminum cans, NO foil or pie pans
- Tin cans
- Glass clear, brown and green
