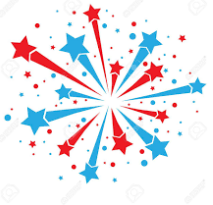

CITY HALL WILL BE CLOSED

INDEPENDENCE DAY

Thursday, July 4, 2019

NO trash will be picked up on the day City Hall will be closed.



For those whose normal trash day is Thursday - there will be a **CURBSIDE ONLY** pickup on Wednesday, July 3, 2019.

JULY IS RESIDENTIAL BIG TRASH PICKUP MONTH

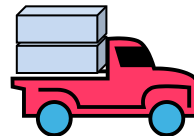
- Ward 1 - Wednesday, July 10
- Ward 2 - Wednesday, July 17
- Ward 3 - Wednesday, July 24
- Ward 4 - Wednesday, July 31

INCLUDES but is not limited to: household appliances, furniture, mattresses, fencing (up to 4 panels) and similar non-contracted items. Compressors must be removed from all appliances **BEFORE** collection. Doors on refrigerators and other bulky items **MUST** be removed.

EXCLUDED items include hospital and medical waste, poisons, acids and caustics, explosives, dirt and rocks, sewage and liquid waste, nuclear materials, gasoline, kerosene, propane tanks, degreasers, lubricants, tires and rims, antifreeze, paint, and commercial construction debris, bricks or concrete. For questions call sanitation at 491-6474.

SIZE OF MATERIAL: Lengths not to exceed 10 feet or a weight exceeding 250 pounds. Tree trimmings and branches must be in piles with individual branches not longer than 8 feet and dead trees not more than 6 inches in diameter.

The **TOTAL** amount allowed is 8 cubic yards (roughly equal to 2 full size pickup beds level with the top of the cab). If you exceed this amount, you will be charged extra on your utility bill. The back of this newsletter will give general overview of how the charges are calculated.



PLACEMENT AND LOCATION: Place at least 5 feet from mailboxes, cars, shrubs, or anything else that could interfere with hand loading or mechanical equipment. Items shall be placed at least 10 feet away from utility poles, guywires, signs, fire hydrants and gas meters to allow mechanized pick up.

BIG TRASH DAY INFORMATION

There is a limit to how much trash you can put out, and if you exceed this amount, you will be charged extra on your utility bill. The amount you can put out is eight (8) cubic yards, which is equal to what one can place in the back of 2 full size pickup beds. A base flat fee of thirty-five (35.00) dollars shall be made for the removal of the material up to and including the first cubic yard. Additional material may be included and removed at a charge of fifteen (15) dollars per cubic yard up to a maximum of forty 40 cubic yards (Ord. 1124, 2012)

ZIP CODE REMINDER

Please be sure to include the 4-digit code **after** your zip code. This will help to ensure that the City receives its sales tax on retail sales and that it does not go to Oklahoma City. If you are not sure what 4-digit code you need to put after your zip code, you may contact the Post Office to obtain this information. You may also use their website at <https://tools.usps.com/go/zip-code-lookup.htm>, you will need to select the find by address option. Once you input the requested information, it will let you know what your 4-digit code is.

HOUSE NUMBERS: WHAT ARE YOUR DIGITS?

Residents of Warr Acres need to ensure that their home has house numbers on it. The numbers should be 4 inches in height and put somewhere they are visible from the street. A large number of houses in Warr Acres do not have house numbers on them and this could pose a problem for the police, fire and city personnel. House numbers can be found at hardware stores and even at some general stores.

SAFETY TIPS FOR HOT DAYS OF SUMMER

1. Check on the elderly, neighbors, family, and pets daily.
2. Frequently drink water before, during, and after outdoor activities.
3. Plan laborious outdoor tasks for the cooler parts of the day.
4. Move to a cooler environment at the first signs of heat illness, which includes: headache, dizziness, nausea, muscle twitching/cramps, and dry, hot, flushed skin.
5. Never leave a child or pet in a vehicle unattended.
6. Make certain pets have plenty of water and shade.



COOKING SAFETY

The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking. Most cooking fires in the home involve the kitchen stove. If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight the fire on the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled. For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed. If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire. Call 9-1-1 from outside the home.



REMINDER FOR REGULAR TRASH PICKUP

If you have bags left or cans that haven't been emptied after the trash route has been completed, it could be because the bags or cans **EXCEEDED the weight limit of 50 lbs.** While the trash cans cannot exceed 40 GALLONS, the **WEIGHT of those cans cannot exceed 50 lbs.** Please observe the following rules for putting out your residential trash:

1. **ALL** trash **MUST** be placed in a can or trash bag. Loose items are **ONLY** allowed to be placed at the curb for bulk trash month on your designated pickup day.
2. **NO** bags OR cans can exceed a weight limit of 50 lbs. If the bags or cans exceed 50 lbs., they will **NOT** be picked up as this poses a risk of injury to our sanitation workers.
3. **GRASS AND WEED** cuttings **MUST** be placed in trash bags, securely tied, and placed **AT THE CURB.**
4. If **ONE** man cannot pick up the bag or trash can, it **EXCEEDS THE 50 LB WEIGHT LIMIT!**
