Please watch for school zone lights as students will be going to schools for the food programs or to obtain internet use. The lights will run during the entire school day as students will be attending at different times.



5 WAYS TO PAY YOUR UTILITY BILL

1. **BY MAIL** – Please allow 7-10 days for delivery of the mail. This will avoid a late fee.
2. **ACH – AUTOMATIC DRAFT** – Please come to City Hall to sign up for this service. A voided check is required and there is no fee for this payment method. ACH payments are drafted on the 5th of each month. Please keep in mind that it may take up to two billing cycles for the ACH to take effect.
3. **IN PERSON** – City Hall is open 8:00 to 5:00 to accommodate those residents who prefer to pay their bill in person.
4. **NIGHT DROP** – There is a night drop box on the west wall located to the right of the main entrance doors. Please make sure your account number **AND** service address is on the check or money order so that the payment may be correctly applied to your account. If there aren't **two** identifying factors along with the payment, it will be sent back to you.
5. **E-Bill** – The City website has a sign-up button which will link you to a 3rd party vendor through which payment may be made. There is a small fee for this service and you must have your bill available as there is a PIN # printed on it which is required to set up your account.

WARR ACRES BOND UPDATE

- The new Warr Acres City Hall is progressing on schedule. While many things have been happening that are not necessarily seen the visual portion is rapidly taking shape. Walls will be sheet-rocked and painting completed very soon. Finally, things are happening that show. This is the exciting portion of construction!
- The new Animal Control facility has started and walls will be up in the very near future. This is also on schedule.
- The City Council approved the plans for Fire and Police to go out to bid. Approval of bids will be on the August agenda.
- Our residential street bond program is progressing nicely and on schedule. Hopefully the inconvenience will pay off for you in the very near future with much nicer residential streets.
- Our South MacArthur project from 47th to 34th is on schedule with right of ways procured. Utility construction will be finished soon and road construction will start right afterwards. This project is also on schedule.



ENVIRONMENTAL TIPS

• Mowing – Follow the “Don’t Bag It” plan. Leave grass clippings and sweep stray grass back into your lawn after mowing.

-Saves the following:

• Environment – Grass clippings that are swept off the street are kept out of storm drains. This helps prevent pollutants from reaching our rivers and lakes.

• Money– Uses less garbage bags, serves as a natural fertilizer and reduces bulky trash.

• Time – “Don’t Bag It” reduces your annual mowing time by one-third.

• Non-toxic products are better for your plants. They also reduce potential toxic run-off that ends up in local creeks and rivers.

• Sweep excess fertilizer on sidewalks and streets back into lawn.

• Manually water your lawn after applying fertilizer and never apply fertilizer before rainstorms.

• Take leftover fertilizer and pesticide products to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility for free disposal.

• Pet waste contains phosphorus, nitrogen, and harmful bacteria to humans, animals and environment.

• Picking up pet waste prevents these pollutants from getting carried to local waterways during rainstorms

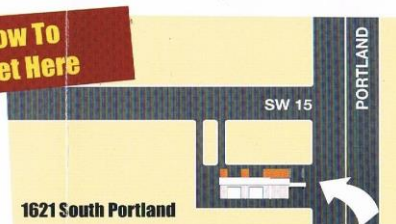
