Remember, **NO** trash will be picked up on days City Hall will be closed.


<u>For those whose normal trash day is Monday</u> – there will be **CURBSIDE ONLY** pickup on Wednesday, February 23, 2022.

From the Mayor:

I would like to thank our citizens for approving our bond projects that are near completion and let everyone know they are on time and within budget. We will be moving into our new police and fire department headquarters in a few weeks. Our animal control facility was opened last December as well as our New City Hall. We will be having a grand opening very soon for all of our projects. Residential street projects are nearly complete. We are repairing and completing the 3rd phase of residential street repairs. And completed all of the streets we said we would repair. We will have completed nearly all of the streets listed on the bond issue, we hoped we could repair. For those of you on ebill:

This is not the same as auto pay or ACH. Signing up to make payments on the website allows you to make monthly payments online, this does not mean that the payment is auto paid. It emails your bill instead of receiving a paper bill and gives you the option to make online payments. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to call City Hall.

COLD WEATHER SAFETY:

The Centers for Disease Control offers the following tips for extreme cold weather temperatures:

SUPPLIES:

- Stock up on food that needs no cooking or refrigeration, such as bread, crackers, cereal, canned foods (don't
 forget a non-electric can opener!) and dried fruits. Remember baby food and formula if you have young
 children.
- Water stored in clean containers (5 gallons per person)
- Medicines that any family member may need.
- Blankets, matches, first aid kit, battery-powered clock or watch and extra batteries.
- Help seniors prepare by storing food in the event that travel becomes hazardous. Prepare for power outages with working flashlights.
- Keep phone numbers for the electric company, gas company, water company, etc handy for emergency purposes.

INDOOR SAFETY:

- Use fireplace, wood stoves, or other combustion heaters ONLY if they are properly vented to the outside and does not leak flue gas into the indoor air space.
- Ensure adequate ventilation if you must use a kerosene heater.
- Do not place a space heater within 3 feet of anything that may catch on fire.
- Monitor body temperature. Infants less than one year old should <u>NEVER</u> sleep in a cold room because infants lose body heat more easily than adults: and unlike adults, infants can't make enough body heat by shivering.

OUTDOOR SAFETY:

- Dress warmly and stay dry.
- The outer layer of clothing should be tightly woven, preferably wind resistant, to reduce body-heat loss caused by wind.
- Wool, silk, or polypropylene inner layers of clothing will hold more body heat than cotton.
- Do not leave pets outside in the cold, wet, snowy weather. If it's too cold for you: it's too cold for your pet.

INFORMATION FOR PET OWNERS:

Warr Acres requires a city license for all dogs and cats in the City. The cost is \$5.00 for a new license and \$2.50 for a renewal. This license is good for a calendar year, and must be renewed every January. This license may be obtained at the Police Department and requires certification of rabies vaccination by a licensed veterinarian with in the last twelve months.
