PWD Turman gave his annual report explained that the EPA set this program up in 2005 and the city must abide by the rules and regulation and city must provide information to the residents on how to keep pesticides and other things out of the storm water. He told the council the different things the city does to follow the rules and regulations.

Attorney Love stated that this meets all variance requirements. He then recommended granting the variance with the restrictions that it will only be applicable if it was under common ownership and control that has to advertise for the building that it is contiguous with. There will be no advertising on the sign that does not occur at the property, at the building. The building's owner's representative confirmed that the owner is in agreement.

It is a perfect example of a mixed use. The applicant if approved will be filing TIF paperwork for monies that would be used for additional landscaping. They are proposing two retail units and a restaurant with apartments that are ADA compliant on the first floor. Square footage of the apartments is less than 1000 sq ft.
