7. Receive reports from Staff: Police Chief, Fire Chief, City Clerk, City Attorney, Public Works Director, City Engineer, City Planner. ****

Craig- James Capps & 63rd 65% plans on NEPA are complete. Working on utility coordination. Had a meeting with facilities, doing some digging to work through that so they are clear to move forward with final plans. Sanitary/sewer project Prebid didn't draw any bidders, timing issue. Marc is working on looking at plans that need to be refined and the industry to see when it would be a good time to go back out to bid. The sidewalk to connect West side of MacArthur to connect 63rd with NW Expressway submitted through ACOG TAP and ODOT TAP Funding. We didn't receive funds from ACOG but did receive funding from ODOT for the sidewalk, we were awarded 80% of the funds.

Lights on MacArthur- spoke with OGE and their supplier is PELCO out of Tulsa, they are the main supplier regionally, they haven't received the materials, they expected it to be delivered in November, then pushed to April 10, still didn't come in. They were told to be in 1st week of May. He will check back with OGE. The construction crews have it on their schedule but waiting on material.

Turman- Parks project the contractor has finished 99% of work. There is a roof panel missing and Grandma's Park. Bunch of kids playing at all the parks, good to see. Will be addressing the delinquent lighting at the parks.

City Clerk- Nothing

Roger- Nothing

Stephen- attended the Metro Chiefs Meeting and there were discussions of a couple of Chief's wanting to build new Fire Stations. New Fire Stations are going for 460sq ft-500sq ft. We paid 300sq ft so the timing of the Bond Election and the building of the project was impeccable. Edmond is purchasing a new fire truck identical to the one we purchased. We paid \$703,000, which we haven't received it, yet but they are paying \$989,000 and won't receive it until 2027. He is grateful for when they ordered and for how much.

We have received the zoll monitor and have had in service training and it is in service now.

On the report it states we had a Forest, woods, wildland fire, it was not in Warr Acres it was part of the Wild Lands Task Force. Sent 2 in the brush pumper to Charter Oak and sent 4 individuals to Simmons and Post and Waterloo and Post area.

Mayor- thanked FD for helping and including Warr Acres to go and help on the Wildland Task Force Fires. Also, we had structural fire a lot of the neighbors thanking the FD for protecting them and knocking on the doors making sure everyone was safe.

Dakota/Marc- continued working on the City fee review. They haven't been updated since the 1990's. Coordinated and researched the ordinances and bringing the old fees upto-date. Received items and research for PC Schools upcoming PUD application, for a Centennial Center. Also, reviewed parking analysis for all upcoming special use permit applications. Working with Chief Coy on updating the GIS system to provide better location and new location for fire hydrants that have not been in the system.

8. Final Public Hearing, Discussion and possible action on a Use Subject to Review concerning eating or drinking establishments. Review uses: Beer tavern, nightclub or bar. NIGHTCLUB OR BAR: A place of business on whose premises the dispensing of beverages occurs, which are composed, in whole or in part, of alcoholic beverages containing more than 3.2 percent alcohol, for consumption on site, is the primary activity; where the serving and selling of food items is the secondary or limited activity accounting for less than fifty percent (50%) of the annual combined total of food and beverage sales; and where live and /or prerecorded music and other entertainment media and facilities, such as dancing, are provided for customers. Business Name: OKCULTURE LOUNGE & PATIO BAR LLC. Location: 5708 N.W. Expressway, Warr Acres, OK 73132. Applicant Name: Jenni Richardson. (Planning Commission recommended denial, due to them failing to meet the parking requirements, by a 5-2 vote.) ****

Applicant withdrew the application.

Schmidt- asked if they will get ticketed for operating as a business, they do not have a license to operate.

Marc- when the applicant determined there was a large hurdle to overcome with the Title 19 and parking. They were given the option, at the Planning Commission, to go ahead with a vote and continue with the special use or to withdraw the application. They went ahead with the vote. The vote of the Planning Commission was the applicant was not going to be able to meet the requirements of the parking, they are significantly under the ability to do that without a cross use or other parking arrangements. Their attorney got the vote he wanted; we needed a decision by today. He could continue to bring it to the City Council to review it or to pull the application. It was explained to him the City Council does not have the ability to waive City Ordinance. He was asking for a waiver to the parking requirements of Title 19. Neither the Planning Commission as a recommending body nor the City Council have the ability to waive an ordinance. The Council can review and amend an Ordinance but we cannot waive that. Therefore, the decision was made around 3:00 P.M. this afternoon to withdraw the application.

To answer Councilman Schmidt's question, the applicant has a license for an approved dispensary that is within the city ordinance. They have an outside restaurant/bar but they do not have, without this application and SUP being granted, the right to be operating a mixed-use operation with a restaurant or a bar in the retail area.

Von Thaer- when he drove by, the parking lot was full, along with Shipleys parking lot and old Golden Coral.

It would be poor practice for the City to allow continuation of the operation when you are saying you can't meet parking requirements and you have not been approved as a special use, as the city you are not condoning them to use every other adjacent parking lot. It is a private property matter and the other property owners do have the right to tow people that are not using the parking lot for their establishment.

Marc reiterated the applicant only has a license for a dispensary. They have a mixed use that they started as a restaurant and then became a bar and that has not been approved.

Knipp asked if they are operating illegally who will shut them down. Marc answered Code Enforcement but, you have noise complaints that can be filed and parking on private property, the owner can have them towed. The City has done everything they can do, but there also has to be participation by the neighboring business owners.

Mike Turman- asked the Mayor if there is going to be a letter sent to the owner of the business stating they are operating illegally because Cheryl and Mike Woodward won't be able to contain 100's of people to convince them to leave. He suggested that he, the Mayor, Chief Patty, Mike Woodard and Matt Love construct a letter and reach out to the owners and explain what will happen. The Mayor was in agreeance.

(Planning Commission recommended approval with a stipulation they must prepare and file a 10' sewer private utility easement approved by the city engineer; by a unanimous vote.) ****

The applicant, Sooner Holdings LLC, is present.

Dakota- The application does meet the lot size and zoning requirements. The concern is utility easement. There is only one utility easement on the norther part of the north lot. Sewer, the applicant needed to file a 10ft easement on the east side of the property.

Marc explained to the property owner that he will need to go to Oklahoma County and file a legal description along with the proposed easements to get the utility easement before he can get his building permit. Sewer line is at the north end of the property and

they need it for the south end of the property. The water service is at 49th and the other will be on Hammond. They will have to relocate the existing house and that service to the new proposed easement.

Marc stated approve this subject to review before the permits are issued, he will have to prove that this has been filed at Oklahoma County.

Morris- grateful for the Planning Commission for doing the research and background work. Thanked the City Planners for making the councils job easy.

Schmidt- April 4, 2023, had the first animal control center meeting, He, Councilwoman Myers, Councilwoman Morris and Councilwoman Morris's daughter- in- law who works at Neil Vet, the animal control officers and Police Chief Patty and Asst. Police Chief, Anderson and Marc Ebby CEO Oklahoma Animal Humane Society. Toured the shelter. Had everyone look around the shelter to see what, if any, improvements or recommendations that need to be addressed. Next meeting is May 9, 2023, with their list improvements and/or needs. The June meeting, they will decide what items on the list are going to be presented to the council for the July meeting for the next year's budget. Asked to take a moment of silence for the Murrah Building victims, survivors and first responders, for the 28-year anniversary tomorrow, April 19, 2023.

Knipp- Thanked the PD, FD, PW, City Hall girls.

Mayor- Thanked everyone who shows up and participates and contributes to the City. Thanked Schmidt for the moment of silence. We have a great connection with the State and NYC with first responders etc. Route 66 coming up June 10, 2023 9-12:00, Tri City Event. Coming to Warr Acres, Bethany and Yukon. We will have Native American Youth Dancers and Tribal VFW doing the colors. Multicultural Festival June 3, 2023, at the Event Center on 36th and MacArthur. Thanked the 15-person committee. They are working hard on getting vendors and sponsors. Thanked Morelos- Supermercados for being the key sponsoring for the event and helping. Today is Earth Day, OG&E came out and planted 10 trees at the park by the Fire Station. A few of the Public Works guys helped with the planting of the trees. Thanked Jason, Roberto, Jesse, Antonio and Mike. Councilman Von Thaer came and helped as well. Thanked OG&E and Arbor for the trees. Anyone in Ward 4 who wants to serve, we have an open seat.
