IMPORTANT MESSAGE

The City of Warr Acres is working on a comprehensive program to improve our sanitary sewer system throughout the city. Starting this month our engineering firm SRB along with their sub-contractors (Woolpert & HydroMax) will be accessing the sanitary sewer manholes for inspections. The crews will also be using closed circuit cameras to video the lines and will be using vacuum trucks to clean the sanitary sewer lines as well. Public Works staff and our crews will be notifying residents by door hangers prior to accessing the yards.

JANUARY IS RESIDENTIAL BIG TRASH PICKUP MONTH

Ward 1 Wednesday January 3, 2024 Ward 2 Wednesday January 10, 2024 Ward 3 Wednesday January 17, 2024 Ward 4 Wednesday January 24, 2024

Big Trash <u>INCLUDES</u>, but is not limited to: household appliances, furniture, carpet, mattresses, box springs, water tanks, fencing and similar non-contracted items, bagged grass, and brush produced as refuse from single-family dwellings. Compressors must be removed from all appliances **BEFORE** collection may be completed. Doors on refrigerators and other bulky items **MUST** be removed before placement on curb.

Items **EXCLUDED** under the definition of big trash include hospital and medical waste, poisons, acids and caustics, explosives, dirt and rocks, sewage and liquid waste, nuclear materials, gasoline, kerosene, propane tanks, degreasers, lubricants, tires and rims, antifreeze, paint, and commercial construction debris, bricks or concrete. Call sanitation at 491-6474 if you have any questions.

<u>SIZE OF MATERIAL</u>: Big trash shall be a length not exceeding 10 feet or a weight exceeding 250 pounds. Tree trimmings and branches must be placed together in piles with individual branches not longer than 8 feet and dead trees (not more than 6 inches in diameter).

The TOTAL amount allowed at the curb is 8 cubic yards (equal to what you can place in the back of 2 full size pickup beds level with the top of the cab). There will be an additional fee of \$15.00 for each cubic yard of bulky waste collected in excess of eight (8) cubic yards

Items cannot be placed out for pick-up earlier than **four** days preceding the regularly scheduled bulk waste collection day **FOR YOUR WARD**.

PLACEMENT AND LOCATION of big trash: Items shall be placed at least five feet (5') from mailboxes, cars, shrubs, or anything else that could interfere with hand loading or mechanical equipment. Items shall be placed at least ten feet (10') away from utility poles, guywires, signs, fire hydrants and gas meters to allow mechanized pick up.

*RESIDENTIAL is defined as a SINGLE-FAMILY home OR a duplex

Storm Water News

In 2021, the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality has added Lake Hefner as an impaired waters with mercury. Citizens are encouraged to properly dispose of any items containing mercury at the City of Oklahoma City Household Hazardous Waste Facility located at 901 South Portland, OKC and not in their regular household trash in which the truck could crush the container and disperse onto the sanitation equipment and the surrounding roadways. Common items that could contain mercury are antique barometers, old thermometers measuring air temperature, old light switches, old wall thermostats for air conditioning systems. These would be found during demolition of a structure, replacement of existing electrical systems and cleaning out a shed, garage or even an entire house. The mercury contained in these items are usually sealed inside of a clear glass tube in which you can see the mercury inside. If found, carefully handle and place into a zip-lock bag and dispose of at the hazardous waste facility free of charge.
