#### What do we do?

The four main roles of the Finance Committee relating to municipal finance are to:

- collaborate
- advise
- collect & organize data
- plan



This includes compiling the budget requests of various town committees and boards into the annual operating budget (omnibus budget), which is voted at Town Meeting, and making recommendations on these and other issues which impact the town financially.

#### **FinCom Budget Priorities**

Balancing the Needs of Both Town Departments and Taxpayers

Aiming to keep tax rates as low as feasible while still allowing departments to do their jobs well.

Recently we've recommended increases in salaries and stipends for key employees, elected officers, and part time workers. Replacing and retaining experienced employees has become regionally competitive, and it's critical to keep pace in order to remain a viable employer.

#### STABILIZATION FUND

- Capital Projects Buildings, vehicles
- Flexibility in payment for projects & events with anticipated reimbursement – tornadoes etc.
- Occasional subsidizing of tax rate (tax relief)
- Funding unanticipated expenses or a way to maintain town services in the case of hitting tax ceiling.
- ENDING BALANCE '23: \$763,432
- '24: \$532,432
- '25: \$251,432 (+\$109K Free Cash)

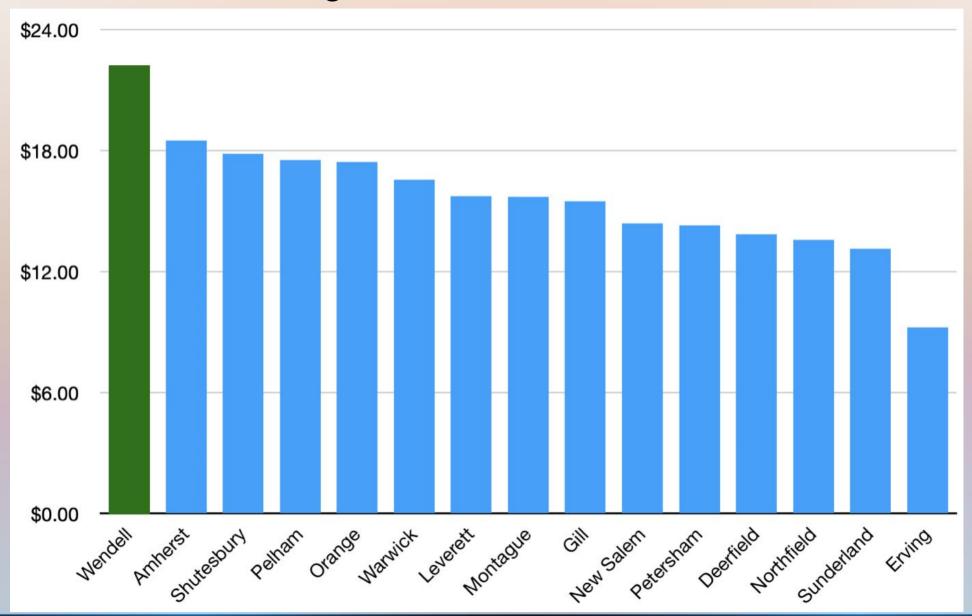
#### **Property Tax**

- Town Meeting decides how much to spend, and what of that should be "raised and appropriated".
- After other income sources are accounted for, the remainder must be collected from **taxes**. This is referred to as the **total levy**.
- The Assessors decide how much each property is worth; its **valuation**. Valuations must be approved by the state before tax bills are issued.
- From these numbers the tax rate is defined, and the tax collector sends tax bills.

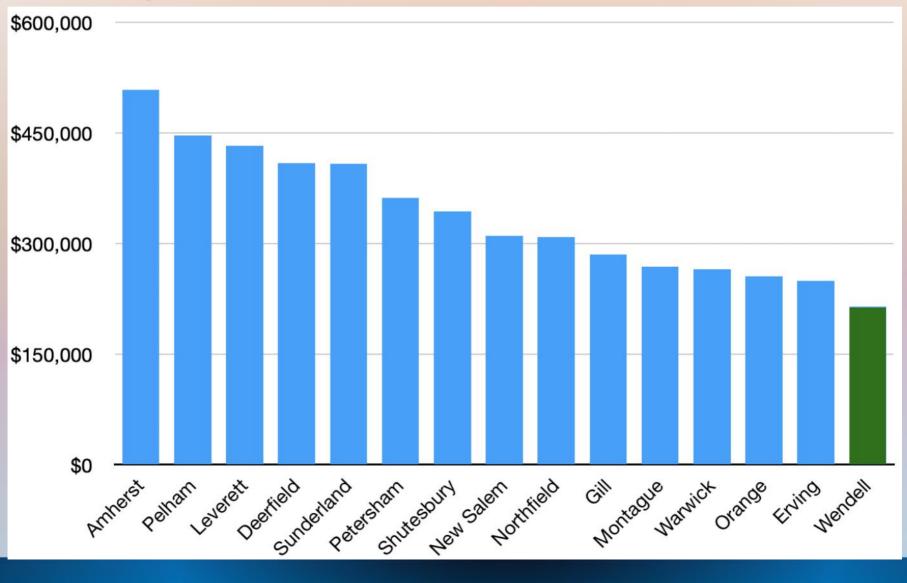
#### Are Wendell taxes high?

- Wendell has a higher tax rate than any of our neighbors. But hang on . . .
- We pay tax bills, not the tax rates
- (tax rate) X (assessed value) = tax bill
- . Are our tax bills high? Let's see . . .

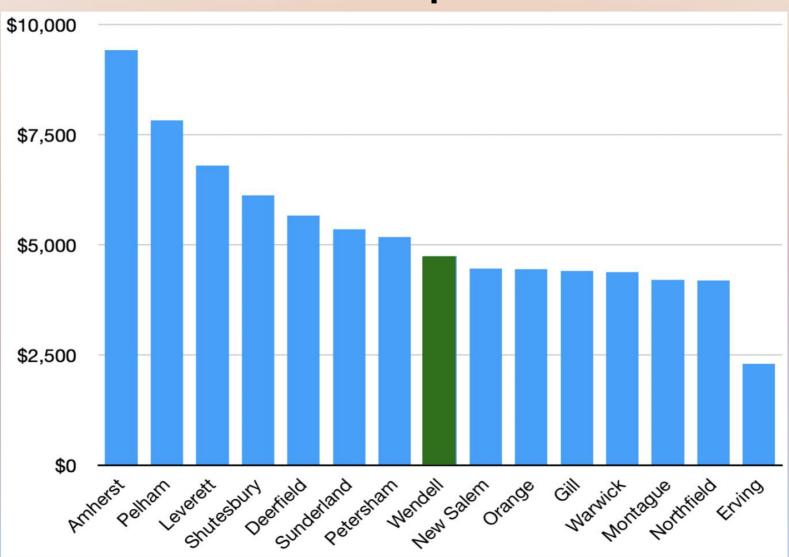
- (tax rate) X (assessed value) = tax bill
- We have the highest tax rate



- (tax rate) X (assessed value) = tax bill
- ... But we have the lowest average single family house assessment



- (tax rate) X (assessed value) = tax bill
- High tax rate and low assessments put our tax bills in the middle of the pack



#### Are Wendell taxes high?

- It's common to focus on our high tax rate, but that's just one piece of the equation.
- Our low assessed property values make our tax bills pretty typical for our region.
- Our average tax bills are in the bottom 25% of Massachusetts towns
- Our average income is lower than 96% of MA towns, so we strive to keep tax bills as low as we can while providing good services to our people.

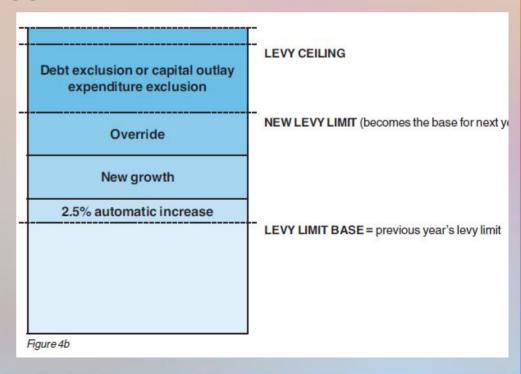

## **Future Budget Planning**

- Wendell's FY2025 levy (the amount the town raises through real and person property taxes) is nearly at the Levy Limit constrained by proposition 2 ½.
- Prop 2/12 Constrains the Levy Limit increase each year based on the previous year's levy, and
  - An automatic 2.5% increase
  - New growth
  - Overrides
- Override?
