After the oath of office, Mayor Sanner stated Officer Hoskins' showed great enthusiasm the very first day he met him in Mayor's Court. The Mayor hoped he could keep that enthusiasm his entire career. All of Council congratulated Officer Hoskins.

5.5 Mil School Levy Discussion - Dr. Rusty Clifford, West Carrollton Schools

West Carrollton School Superintendent, Dr. Rusty Clifford, reminded that there will be a 5.5 mill school levy on the ballot March 15, 2016. This is a revenue loss issue as opposed to an expenditure issue. Dr. Clifford noted that when the State phased out the tangible personal property reimbursement, the West Carrollton School District lost 8.1 mills of revenue. The State has also "capped" the West Carrollton Schools which mean the School will only receive 81% of the calculated funding. That is the equivalent of another 10.5 mill loss. Dr. Clifford stated that the additional funding would not have been needed if the State had not made these revenue cuts. The General Fund balance is projected to decline to under one month of operation by June, 2017. He added that the School continues to use its funds wisely and be fiscally conservative. The District continues to spend more funding on instruction than administration compared to the State average. Additionally the cost of operation and expenditure per equivalent student is also less than the State average. The additional cost to a taxpayer owning a \$100,000 home would be \$16.04 per month. He added that the school's last levy was back in 2007. Dr. Clifford urged people to vote. He noted even though this is a primary election, it may be a challenge to get voters to go to the polls because 78% of the registered voters are listed as undecided.

Mr. Merris asked if this May Dr. Clifford expected any additional problems since the Sinclair College issue passed creating another financial hit to residents.

Dr. Clifford responded that he thought the \$16.04 per month was a great investment in our students. But he conceded that it is always a challenge to ask for new money.

Mayor Sanner wished Dr. Clifford good luck with the campaign.

Deputy Police Chief Rob Hensley reported that Mike Landis, owner of Landis Defense Solutions & Tac-House Training, approached the City about the possibility of building a munition firearms training facility in West Carrollton. Instead of live rounds, this facility would use "marking rounds" similar to paintball. However our current ordinance only allows discharging firearms under extremely narrow parameters. This minor ordinance amendment would allow discharging of these types of weapons in the City limits at a shooting range.

Co-Owners Mike Landis and Seth Plantz noted that the business would have a warehouse that can be configured many different ways for various training scenarios. They also have adapter kits so the customer can use their own weapon.
