

**West Mead Township**  
**Supervisors Public Meeting**  
**Minutes – July 9, 2024**

The July 9, 2024, Public Meeting of the West Mead Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Township Building. Present were Supervisors Bovard, Jordan and Shartle. Also present: Paul Martin, Penni Dallas, Chief Brown, Alan Shaddinger and Jill Dunlap.

**Regular Business:**

Jordan moved, Shartle seconded to approve the June 11, 2024 Study Session Minutes and Regular Meeting Minutes, as presented. Vote - All Approved.

Shartle moved, Jordan seconded to accept the Treasurer's Report for June 2024 and approve payment of bills in the amount of \$147,174.66, subject to audit. Vote - All Approved.

**Municipal Reports:**

Chief Brown presented the Police Report.

Shartle gave the Road Report. He noted the Road Department cut brush, began PennDOT Agility mowing, completed park maintenance and worked to get ready for the upcoming paving project during the last month.

Dunlap gave the Zoning Report.

**New Business:**

Shartle moved, Jordan seconded to accept the resignation of Karl Humes-Ashbaugh as a Part Time Police Officer with the West Mead Township Police Department, effective June 11, 2024. Vote – All Approved.

The Chairman noted upcoming West Mead Township 2024 Road Paving Projects will occur on Tamarack Drive, Shore Drive, Phelps Road hill and a portion of Williamson Road. Work is anticipated to begin later in July of 2024 and is weather dependent. We ask that you pay attention to flaggers and equipment operators and slow down while traveling in all construction zones.

The Chairman noted upcoming West Mead Township 2024 Line Painting Projects will occur on various roadways in the Township. Work is anticipated to begin later in July or August of 2024 and is weather dependent. We ask that you pay attention to flaggers and equipment operators and slow down while traveling in all construction zones.
