AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 51.22(B) SEWER RATE SCHEDULE OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF WEST MILTON, OHIO

WHEREAS, the Municipality's expenses for providing sewer service and maintaining the sewer system is projected to exceed revenues provided by the current rate structure: and

WHEREAS, Council recognizes the importance of maintaining the fiscal stability of the Municipality's Sewer Fund.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is necessary to increase sewer rates for service to residents and nonresidents in order to maintain the fiscal stability of the sewer fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Council for the Village of West Milton, Ohio as follows:

SECTION I:

The language contained in the existing Section of the West Milton Code of Ordinances 51.22(B)(1) and (2) are hereby modified to read as follows:

§ 51.22 SEWER RATE SCHEDULE IN MUNICIPALITY.

- The usage charge shall be based on the quantity of water used as measured by the water meters used, on all billing statements payable after the effective date hereinafter provided, and the sewer rates are fixed as follows, with a two percent (2%) automatic annual increase beginning on January 1, 2023 and each year hereafter.
 - (1) Effective **September 1**, **2022**, the sewer rates shall be composed of two parts:
 - (a) A service charge of \$7.45 for each billing period.
 - (b) A per 1,000 gallon usage charge of \$7.73.
 - (2) The service charge shall be levied, and a usage charge for each 1,000 gallons of water used shall be added to the service charge. Thus, the minimum rate charged for 1,000 gallons in a billing period shall be *\$15.18.*

SECTION III: This Ordinance shall become effective from and after September 1, 2022.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 52 – WATER RULES AND REGULATIONS AND TO SPECIFICALLY AMEND SECTION 52.116 OF THE WEST MILTON MUNICIPAL CODE TITLED WATER RATES AND MUNICIPALITY

WHEREAS, the Municipality's expenses for providing water service and maintaining the water distribution system is projected to exceed revenues provided by the current rate structure; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance CM-13-26, which was amended by CM-17-34, Council established the Water Capital Debt Service Fund, and set a fee schedule to collect fees to service current and future capital projects and any debt created as a result of those projects in the water department; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to incorporate the fee schedule listed in CM-17-34 into the existing West Milton Codified Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, Council recognizes the importance of maintaining the fiscal stability of the Municipality's Water Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Ordained by the Council of the Municipality of West Milton, Ohio, that:

SECTION I: Chapter 52.116 of the West Milton Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read in full as follows:

§ 52.116 WATER RATES AND MUNICIPALITY

- (A) There shall be levied and assessed upon each customer who owns improved real estate and to whom municipal water service is accessible, even if a physical connection with water does not exist, a service charge payable as provided in this section.
- (B) The usage charge shall be based on the quantity of water used as measured by the water meters, on all billing statements payable after the effective date hereinafter provided, and the same are fixed as follows:
 - (1) Effective **September 1, 2022,** the water rates shall be as follows, with a two percent (2%) automatic annual increase beginning on January 1, 2023 and each year hereafter:
 - (a) An Operational Charge of **\$16.14** for each billing period.
 - (b) A per 1,000 gallon usage charge of \$7.14.
 - (2) The Operational Charge shall be levied, then the 1,000 gallon usage charge for each 1,000 gallons of metered water usage shall be added to the Operations Charge. Thus, the minimum rate charged for 1,000 gallons in a billing period shall be \$23.28.
- (C) Effective September 1, 2022, the following fees, in addition to the fees stated in Section B above, shall be paid by each customer to service current and future capital projects associated with the water department and any debt related with said projects, and be placed in the Water Capital Improvement Fund, and paid from said
