RESOLUTION NUMBER 21-22-011

A Resolution of the Willamina City Council Authorizing Appropriations Amending the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget and reallocating funds within Funds for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022.

WHEREAS, a supplemental budget is the appropriate mechanism to reallocate funds from Contingency and/or between line items due to circumstances that were not known at the beginning of the year; and

WHEREAS, a supplemental budget is the appropriate mechanism to declare new income due to unexpected increases in revenues; and

WHEREAS, this supplemental budget makes adjustments to the current year's budget by declaring new income, and a reallocation of funds between line items and from Contingency to line items within all funds due to unforeseen increases in revenues and expenses; and

WHEREAS, the supplemental budget public hearing was advertised at City Hall, at two public notice kiosks within the City of Willamina, at the US Post Office, and on the City website; and

WHEREAS, The City Council held a public hearing on the proposed supplemental budget on January 11, 2022; and WHEREAS, ORS 294.463 allows a governing body to transfer appropriations within a Fund

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

WILLAMINA THAT a first supplemental budget to the 2021-2022 adopted budget and the appropriations and reallocations found within the attached Exhibit A, First Supplemental Budget and Reallocation, attached hereto and made a part hereof; are hereby adopted and that this resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
