### ATTENTION! READ BEFORE VOTING POLITICAL PARTY BALLOT

In a Political Party Primary Election, you may only vote for the candidates of one political party. This ballot contains two political parties; one in each section. If you vote in more than one political party's section, your Political Party Ballot will be rejected; however, all votes on the No Party and Measures Ballots will still be counted.

To vote for the candidate of your choice, you must darken the oval (●) next to the name of that candidate. To vote for a person whose name is not printed on the ballot, you must darken the oval (●) next to the blank line provided and write that person's name on the blank line.

<input type="radio"/> Trevor Bemis	<input type="radio"/>	This initiated measure would add a new article to the North Dakota Constitution. Under the measure, no person may be elected or appointed to serve any portion of a term representing North Dakota in the U.S. Senate or the U.S. House of Representatives if that person could be 81 years old by December 31 of the year immediately preceding the end of the term, and any such person is prohibited from appearing on the ballot. If a superior law requires age-limited candidates to appear on the ballot in a primary or general election, the candidates' age on December 31 of the year immediately preceding the end of the term they are seeking must be printed next to the names of all candidates for all federal legislative offices in future elections. The article also requires the Attorney General to zealously defend Section 4 of the article in the courts of this state or of the United States. The article would become effective immediately upon approval by the voters. If the measure conflicts with any other provision of the state constitution, the measure states it would prevail over the other constitutional provisions.

**Williams County Measure No. 1**

**Willrose City Measure No. 1**

Shall the Williams County Board of County Commissioners be authorized to extend the current one percent (1.00%) sales and use tax being imposed throughout Williams County for ten (10) years beginning April 1st, 2025 to be dedicated as follows:

According to State Law, once every four (4) years, each City must place on its ballot the question of whether or not the minutes of the Governing Body shall be published in its Official newspaper.

- Public safety (supplemental funding to public safety departments and agencies)
- Sports, recreation, and community facilities
- Behavioral and rural health programs and facilities
- Capital improvements to enhance social and economic vitality in Williams County

If approved, the minutes must be published until disapproved by the voters at a succeeding election.

Such sales and use tax revenues may be pledged to the payments of bonds issued for such purposes in anticipation of the collection and receipt of such sales and use tax, and if so pledged, the sales and use tax may not be repealed so long as any such bonds or bonds refunding the bonds are outstanding.

Shall the City of Williston continue to be authorized to charge four dollars (\$4.00) per month per occupied unit on the water bill for the mosquito control effort, to sunset after June 2028.
