Where Activities are Endless

OUTDOORS

Hike lakeside trails for panoramic views, cast a line and reel in a walleye, or paddle your way down the river. Visit Little Egypt or Lewis and Clark State Park to camp along the beautiful shores of Lake Sakakawea, or tee off at some of the state's top-rated golf courses – including The Links of North Dakota, one of Golf Digest's "Top 100 Courses You Can Play." Explore the extensive Williston Parks Trail System for a refreshing hike or bike ride, or cool off at the Williston Splash Pad, perfect for family fun on a warm day.

For those who prefer a bit more horsepower, hit the trails on an ATV or take a scenic drive on one of our many backroads. But that's not all – our wildlife is just as exciting as our landscapes. Keep an eye out for pronghorn sheep, elk, and mule deer – especially if venturing into the nearby North Unit of Theodore Roosevelt National Park. Williams County is also a hunter's, fisher's, and birdwatcher's paradise!


YEAR-ROUND RECREATION

From snow-covered hills to ice-glistening lakeshores, there's always something to do in our neck of the woods when the weather gets "a little chilly." While the snow is falling, strap in for some cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, or ice skating, or hop on a snowmobile and drill into some ice fishing. You can also join in on an activity – curling, volleyball, archery, trivia, cornhole, and many more bring people together indoors all winter long.

When the snow melts, trade your snow skis for a jet ski – or maybe some boat keys! You can reel in a keeper at one of our lakes or rivers. Take some horses or ATVs off the beaten path and catch one of our stunning sunsets. As the colors start changing, soak up the beautiful autumn foliage while cruising along our bike and hiking paths.



EDUCATION

For elementary through high school, Williams County is home to five public school districts and two private schools, all with enthusiastic teachers and plenty of activities. Whether you prefer big school action, small school connections, or something in between, the schools here are sure to meet your needs.

We have had many exciting updates in our education community - like the opening of the new Williston Basin Career and Technical Education (CTE) Center, a groundbreaking for a new elementary school in Williston (opening in 2026), and an expansion at Tioga High School to be completed in 2025.

Students can follow pathways programs that lead directly into the workforce or continue their education right here at Williston State College, which offers twoyear higher education in several technical programs; multiple options to complete a Bachelor's degree; and a brand new, state-of-the-art healthcare training facility (to be complete in Fall 2025). Williston State College also offers generous scholarships, some which fully cover tuition and fees. There are also options for adult technical education through TrainND Northwest, so the learning never has to stop!

On average, about three feet of snow falls each year (usually not all at the same time!). But it's not that bad...honest! Our occasional below zero temps make the other seasons even sweeter! In fact, it's not unusual to see the locals in shorts when it hits 40 degrees around here. It's amazing how warm it feels after a couple months of winter.

Spring and fall are typically in the 50s and 60s and the summer averages *perfect* 70- and 80-degree weather. Whether it's the dead of winter or the heat of summer, there are a variety of year-round recreational opportunities to keep you active and engaged.
