#### 1. Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Williamston City Hall Council Chambers by Chairman Earl Wolf and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

#### 4. Approval of Agenda:

This year's budget will include fixing the men's urinal in the North Putnam restrooms. He will also look at getting more than one shutoff, because if the men's bathroom is down, the women's has to close as well. He will look at getting heat available at the concession restrooms.

There was discussion whether the water fountains could be turned back on.

Commissioner Nelson said the Kiwanis may be able to donate bottle filling stations.

Commissioners stated they receive many positive comments from individuals outside the City about our parks.

#### 8b. Mill Turbine Placement at Old Mill Park:

Chairman Wolf spoke about the turbine which was moved from the old DPW building to the current DPW area and placement at Old Mill Park. Manager Hanifan will speak with Mark Stevens of Stevens Excavating about the best way to move it, and then will discuss with engineering about the location and placement. This will be included in the Parks budget for next year. This is art and history combined.

#### 8c. Friends of the Williamston Parks- Chainsaw Event update:

Manager Hanifan reported the Friends of Williamston Parks is spearheading the Chainsaw Sculpture event, with Lina Chapman as the organizer. She is recruiting artists. This event will be held in October to replace the current carvings in McCormick Park.





Fig. 5. The relatively high speed of the Improved SAMSON Turbine under low heads of water frequently permits the use of a Quarter Turn Belt Drive, as a minimum diameter of driving pulley is required. This type of drive is quiet and efficient.

Improved SAMSON Turbine with Quarter Turn Belt Drive to Mill Line Shaft


