Discussion:

Baker Tilly presented its findings and recommendations for the rate study at a previous meeting. Staff is recommending Council set the work session to further develop what project (s) are necessary in the coming years at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to ensure the integrity and long-term viability of the WWTP system. Council was provided with Tetra Tech's Wastewater assessment study last fall. Staff will be presenting various scenarios for Council to consider.

Staff recommends the session be scheduled as part of the regular City Council meeting on January 23, 2023.


