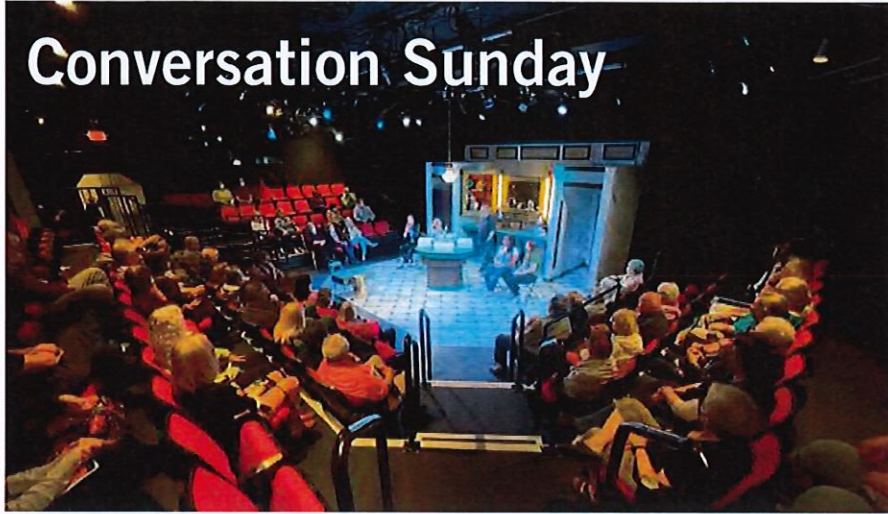


Preview Performances
