

ROSTER UPDATES

Alli Linnehan was demoted to the Injury Reserve list after sustaining an injury to her right ankle in the first set of the Vibe's home opener vs. San Diego on Feb. 1. She must be medically cleared before she is added back to the official Vibe roster.

Chiamaka Nwokolo was waived by the Vibe this week.

Magdalena Jehlářová joined the Vibe this week after she was acquired by the team in a Draft day trade (12/11/23).

FRIDAY NIGHT RED OUT BENEFITTING THE AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION

The Atlanta Vibe will host their first ever "Red-Out" on Friday evening in partnership with the American Heart Association Georgia.

The Vibe will be recognizing Heart Health Awareness Month throughout the match with activations that certify young Vibe fans as "Healthy Kids," and tips and facts about heart health and overall wellbeing built into the matchday programming. Proceeds from all red merchandise sold at the match will be donated to the American Heart Association as well.

LEAH EDMOND CLAIMS WEEK 2 PVF PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Linnehan's college teammate Edmond helped the Vibe clean up the first two weeks of the Pro Volleyball Federation's Player of the Week awards, after Edmond led the Vibe to a 3-0 sweep over San Diego in the team's home opener on Thursday, February 1.

She tallied 16 kills in only three sets (5.3 per set), hitting at a .407 clip. A native of Lexington, Ky., she was dominant in the match, recording 20 points (aces + kills + blocks) while adding season-highs with two aces and two blocks.

VIBE HOME OPENER

The Atlanta Vibe stayed perfect on Thursday, Feb. 1 to sweep the San Diego Mojo in front of a crowd of 6,100 at Gas South Arena.

Outside hitter Leah Edmond led the Vibe with 16 kills on a .407 hitting percentage, while middle blocker Shelly Fanning led the team with 6 blocks. Setter Tori Stringer put up 37 assists in the three-set match, while libero Morgan Hentz and outside hitter Leketor Member-Meneh teamed up on defense for 13 and 10 digs, respectively.

ALLI LINNEHAN IS FIRST EVER PRO VOLLEYBALL FEDERATION PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After scoring the first two points in Pro Volleyball Federation history, Vibe outside hitter Alli Linnehan claimed the league's first weekly award as she was named the Player of the Week on Tuesday, January 30.

Linnehan helped Atlanta to a league-leading two wins in opening week, starting in every set of both five-set matches. She led the team with 23 digs in the team's win over Orlando (1/26), bringing her to an average of 3.9 digs per set on the week. She also averaged 2.0 kills per set in both wins and tallied five total blocks.

VIBE WIN INAUGURAL PRO VOLLEYBALL FEDERATION MATCH

Wednesday night's matchup between the Atlanta Vibe and the Omaha Supernovas marked the first ever match in Pro Volleyball Federation history. Both teams were tabbed to finish second and first in the league's preseason poll, respectively.

After the Vibe went up 2-0 in the match, Omaha rallied back to tie it up and send it to a deciding fifth set. Leah Edmond's 27th kill of the night finished off the game to give the Vibe the first win in Pro Volleyball history.

Alli Linnehan had the first kill of the match, giving her the first point in PVF history. The last time Linnehan played at the CHI Health Center was in the 2020 NCAA Championship, when she knocked down the final kill in the match to give Kentucky their first and only National Championship.

PRO VOLLEYBALL FEDERATION PRESEASON POLL


The Vibe were tabbed to finish second in the inaugural season of the league, receiving two first-place votes to finish just one point behind the Omaha Supernovas.

Two Atlanta players were selected for the Preseason All-League team – outside hitter Leah Edmond was a unanimous selection, and the addition of libero Morgan Hentz makes Atlanta the only team in the league to place more than one player on the Preseason team.

SOUTHERN ROOTS

Six members of the Vibe's full roster are originally from Southern US states, and eight attended colleges in the South.

Outside hitter **KACIE EVANS** played for the University of Georgia, located just 50 miles from the Vibe's home court at Gas South Arena. Middle blocker **KARIS WATSON** attended Clemson, located just 93 miles from the arena, and grew up in Rock Hill, South Carolina, which is 210 miles from Duluth.

Lexington, Kentucky, is 390 miles from the arena and is home to **LEAH EDMOND'S** and **ALLI LINNEHAN'S** alma mater, the University of Kentucky. Edmond also calls Lexington home.

Libero MORGAN HENTZ grew up in Lakeside Park, Kentucky, where she often faced off against Leah Edmond on the court. SHELLY FANNING and YOSSIANA PRESSLEY were teammates at Baylor but also grew up together in Cypress, Texas, meeting across the net from each other all throughout high school.

Setter **MARLIE MONSEREZ** is from Florida and played for the Gators in undergrad.

VIBE ON THE SENATE FLOOR

On Monday, January 22, Georgia State Senator Jason Esteves (D-Atlanta) moved into motion Senate Resolution (NUMBER) that recognizes the Atlanta Vibe as the official professional women's indoor volleyball team of Atlanta.

Team owner Colleen Craig spoke to the Senate floor alongside team president Theresa Wenzel, and the team was later recognized by Georgia House Representative Dr. Jasmine Clark (District 108).

BALLY SPORTS AND STADIUM ANNOUNCED AS LEAGUE MEDIA RIGHTS PARTNERS

In a multi-year agreement with both partners, the Pro Volleyball Federation determined Bally Live will broadcast a majority of the live matches free on the Bally Live App during the 2024 inaugural season – with a minimum of 40 matches slated for the platform. Stadium will broadcast a "Match of the Week" live across its app, website, and OTT partners – with 20 matches slated for this coming year. These matches will also be simulcast on Bally Live.

CBS SPORTS BECOMES PRO VOLLEYBALL FEDERATION'S FIRST MEDIA RIGHTS PARTNER

CBS Sports is the first partner to be announced as part of Pro Volleyball Federation's media rights package, which is expected to include both domestic and international rights. The multi-year CBS Sports agreement includes a minimum of 10 matches to be aired in 2024, plus the semifinals and championship match of Pro Volleyball Federation's championship weekend.

The CBS Sports matches will be aired primarily on CBS Sports Network in 2024, with opportunities for matches to also be aired on CBS throughout the term of the partnership. The League's complete national broadcast schedule, along with additional media rights partners, will be announced at a later date.


PRO VOLLEYBALL FEDERATION, USA VOLLEYBALL ANNOUNCE NEW ALLIANCE

Pro Volleyball Federation has teamed up with USA Volleyball – the national governing body of the sport in the U.S. – to promote volleyball at its highest level.

USA Volleyball will support Pro Volleyball Federation's professional league in America, which launches in January. The partnership reinforces the League's commitment to work with USA Volleyball clubs, athletes and regions while USAV supports Pro Volleyball Federation's commitment to providing top professional opportunities to America's greatest female volleyball players.

Pro Volleyball Federation currently boasts 17 players from the United States who have spent time in the U.S. National Team gym. Overall, there are 35 domestic and international players in the League who have been part of their respective country's Olympic or national team system.

More than 135 athletes have signed contracts to play in the inaugural season of Pro Volleyball Federation. They will be led by a group of accomplished coaches who have combined for more than 2,500 career victories.

PVF'S LANDMARK AGREEMENT WITH VOLLEYSTATION

Pro Volleyball Federation – the premier women's volleyball league in North America – continues to establish itself as a sports technology leader with the announcement of its agreement with VolleyStation as the official data management partner for the League.

VolleyStation will provide a centralized data management system to help the League create a database of teams, players and matches. This information will be shared via Pro Volleyball Federation digital platforms seconds after the conclusion of a point. Data will be pushed in real time to both teams, websites and the media and can seamlessly integrate with television broadcast outlets to allow for in-depth analysis during a match.

VolleyStation is not limited to match statistics, as coaches can use data to scout opponents as well as evaluate players on their own rosters. In addition, the system will provide video as well as live webinars to train officials to work comprehensively with the system.

VIBE ADD SIX PLAYERS THROUGH INAUGURAL PRO VOLLEYBALL FEDERATION DRAFT

The Atlanta Vibe added six players through the 2023 Pro Volleyball Draft on Monday, headlined by two first round picks in **CHIAMAKA NWOKOLO** and **MAGDA JEHLÁŘOVÁ**. The inaugural draft was held in Atlanta as all six of the Vibe's opponents traveled to the Peach State to dole out 35 of the top collegiate talent entering the pro ranks.

Head coach Todd Dagenais first chose Chiamaka Nwokolo with the No. 6 overall pick in the first round of the Draft out of Pitt. Later in the day, he made a trade to acquire No. 2 overall selection Magda Jehlářová, sending Ali Bastianelli and Kendra Dahlke to the San Diego Mojo.

The Vibe then picked up BYU teammates setter WHITNEY BOWER and libero KAMAILE HIAPO in the second and third rounds, respectively, followed by Oregon middle blocker KARA MCGHEE in the fourth round and Washington opposite MAY PERTOFSKY in the fifth round.

ATLANTA ROSTER HIGHLIGHTS

Libero **MORGAN HENTZ** brings Olympic gym experience to the Vibe, having spent two years competing with Team USA. The 2023 Athletes Unlimited Defensive Player of the Year has three years of pro experience after the three-time First Team AVCA All-American led the Stanford Cardinal to three NCAA Championships.

Setter TORI DILFER-STRINGER looks to lead the Vibe

to the first ever Pro Volleyball Federation Championship after working alongside the league to help it to develop into a league that works for its players. Dilfer-Stringer and her teammate Morgan Hentz both serve as Player Relations Associates with the Pro Volleyball Federation.

MAGDA JEHLÁŘOVÁ, CHIAMAKA NWOKOLO, WHITNEY BOWER, and KAMAILE HIAPO all make their pro careers this season after being selected by the Vibe in the 2023 Pro Volleyball Federation Draft. Jehlářová and Nwokolo were both selected in the first round, with Nwokolo being selected by the Vibe with the No. 6 overall pick and the Vibe acquiring Jehlářová (No. 2 overall pick) via trade.

Georgia standout **KACIE EVANS** starts her pro career after signing with the Vibe as a free agent following the Draft. Evans, a three-time All-SEC Team honoree, leaves UGA as the Dawgs' all-time sets played record holder (517).

REGAN PITTMAN came out of retirement to play in the Pro Volleyball Federation this season, having spent the last two years post-grad starting and running her business, Stand Tall Volleyball Academy. At the University of Minnesota, Pittman was a three-time AVCA All-American honoree and a three-time All-Big Ten First Team selection.

KARIS WATSON brings the most pro experience to the Vibe's roster, having played professionally for seven seasons since graduating from Clemson in 2014. Watson's pro career has taken her through France, Switzerland, Germany, Portugal, Sweden, and the United Kingdom.

Our players are our product, and one of the most important missions of Pro Volleyball Federation is our commitment to treating our players the right way and with the respect, care, and admiration they deserve as major league professional athletes.

'REAL pro volleyball' means exactly what it says – this is world class players and coaches playing and coaching on REAL teams within a REAL league format playing matches at REAL pro arenas. Pro Volleyball Federation teams are owned by REAL pro owners and team operators and the league is operated with REAL league management expertise within a REAL financial model that is viable at the league and the team levels.
