WELCOME TO PROFESSIONAL VOLLEYBALL

The Omaha Supernovas are one of seven teams taking the court in the inaugural season of Pro Volleyball Federation. Below are a few facts about Omaha and Pro Volleyball Federation.

- ⇒ Pro Volleyball Federation head coaches have combined for more than 2,500 career victories.
- ⇒ The League boasts 17 players from the United States who have played with the National Team. Overall, there are 35 players who have been part of an Olympic or National Team.
- ⇒ Natalia Valentin-Anderson (Puerto Rico), Bethania de la Cruz (Dominican Republic) and Tori Dixon (U.S.A.) represent the three Olympians for the Supernovas.

SUPERNOVAS-VIBE CONNECTIONS

There are a few connections between the Supernovas and Vibe as they face off for the third time.

- ⇒ Omaha Head Coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn played four seasons of college volleyball at Georgia Tech University (2001-'04) where she was a four-year letterwinner and led the Yellow Jackets to three ACC titles.
- ⇒ Supernovas libero Gabby Thompson hails from the Peach State as she attended high school in Buford, Georgia which is just 13 miles north of Atlanta's home arena.

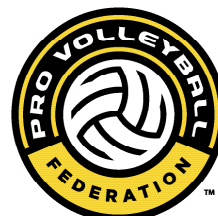

BRINGING HOME THE HARDWARE

The Supernovas are home to three NCAA National Champions with middle blocker Danielle Hart (Wisconsin), Sydney Hilley (Wisconsin) and Gabby (Curry) Thompson (Kentucky). Hart and Hilley were teammates when the Badgers won their first national title in school history in 2021. Thompson was the starting libero for Kentucky's first national title in the 2021 spring NCAA Tournament that took place in Omaha.

IF YOU WANT SOFT SERVE, GO GET ICE CREAM

The Supernovas have had major production from behind the service line posting some of the best serving numbers in the Pro Volleyball Federation.

- ⇒ Omaha outside hitter Bethania de la Cruz leads the League with 20 aces through 10 matches.
- ⇒ De la Cruz has set the Pro Volleyball Federation record for most aces in a single match (6) twice this season. Once against Vegas on February 7 and again on February 12 at Grand Rapids.
- ⇒ The Supernovas rank first in the League in aces per match (5.4) while totaling 54 aces through 10 matches. That total also being the highest among all teams.
- ⇒ The Supernovas also own the League record for most team aces in one match with 10 against Vegas on February 7. No one else has touched double digits.
- ⇒ Atlanta enters Saturday with 39 aces through 10 matches for an average of 3.9 which is third in the league behind only Omaha and Orlando.

OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE

Natalia Valentín-Anderson (Puerto Rico), Bethania de la Cruz (Dominican Republic) and Tori Dixon (U.S.A.) mark the three Olympians on the Supernovas roster. Valentín-Anderson was the setter for Puerto Rico in Rio 2016 as they finished 11th. De la Cruz is a two-time Olympian aiding the Dominican Republic to a fifth-place finish in London 2012 and eighth place in Tokyo 2020. She'll also play for the D.R. in Paris 2024. Dixon was an alternate for the U.S. in 2016 after suffering a torn ACL earlier that year.

BIG TEN TERRITORY

The Big Ten conference has a strong presence on the Supernovas roster with numerous players who attended B1G schools.

- ⇒ Seven of the 16 players on Omaha's roster attended Big Ten schools for their college careers.
- ⇒ Those players include Tori Dixon (Minnesota), Danielle Hart (Wisconsin), Sydney Hilley (Wisconsin), Nia Reed (Penn State), Gina Mancuso-Prososki (Nebraska), Brooke Nuneviller (Oregon) and Kendall White (Penn State).
- ⇒ Omaha's roster has combined for 15 All-Big Ten selections and 11 Big Ten titles.

ACE ME IF YOU CAN

Omaha has been light years ahead of the competition in serve receive this season. The Supernovas have received 780 serves in 10 matches and have only allowed 19 aces on the year. Omaha hasn't allowed more than four aces in any match this season which includes two contests with zero opponent serves hitting the floor. The Supernovas allow an

average of 1.9 aces per match with San Diego coming closest at 3.12 per match. Atlanta enters Thursday allowing 4.2 aces per match which is fourth highest in the League. Grand Rapids is last averaging 5.12 opponent aces per contest.

NUNEVILLER WINS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For the first time in 2024, a player from the Omaha Supernovas captured weekly accolades from the Pro Volleyball Federation. Team captain Brooke Nuneviller was selected as the Pro Volleyball Federation Player of the Week after her standout performance in leading Omaha to a five-set win over the Orlando Valkyries on the road on March 9. The Oregon product recorded a season-high 20 kills on a season-best .313 hitting percentage. She also collected 18 digs to post her seventh straight double-double and eighth overall this year. Nuneviller also registered her fifth ace and fifth block of the inaugural campaign. The outside hitter finished with 22 points on the night to increase her overall total to 139 points in 34 sets in 2024. Nuneviller played her best when it counted most, adding five kills on six swings for a .667 clip in the decisive fifth set as the Supernovas finished the match off with a 15-6 set victory.

TEAMMATE REUNIONS

Between the Supernovas and Vibe, there will be plenty of teammate reunions when they hit the court Thursday night inside the CHI Health Center.

- ⇒ Kendall White and Nia Reed were teammates during their time at Penn State, which includes a Big Ten title in 2017, and reunite in Omaha.
- ⇒ Sydney Hilley and Danielle Hart enjoyed historic success during their careers at Wisconsin, leading the Badgers to their first national title in 2021 as well as four straight Big Ten titles from 2019-2022.
- ⇒ Gabby (Curry) Thompson and the Vibe's Alli Linnehan were college teammates at Kentucky University which correlated with the Wildcat's national title during the 2021 spring season.
- ⇒ Vibe outside hitter Leah Edmond was also teammates with Thompson and Linnehan at Kentucky, but she graduated one year earlier in 2019.

PRESEASON FAVORITES

The Omaha Supernovas were voted the preseason favorites of the Pro Volleyball Federation for its inaugural season. Omaha received the most first-place votes with four resulting in 33 points. The Atlanta Vibe were right behind recording three first-place votes and 32 points. The Columbus Fury received the other first-place vote, but only had 23 points. The Grand Rapids Rise received 23 points, San Diego Mojo 15, Orlando Valkyries 12 and Vegas Thrill 9.

Supernovas outside hitter Bethania de la Cruz was named to the Pro Volleyball Federation preseason All-League team. Atlanta outside hitter Leah Edmond and libero Morgan Hentz were both voted to the All-League team as well with Edmond being a unanimous selection.

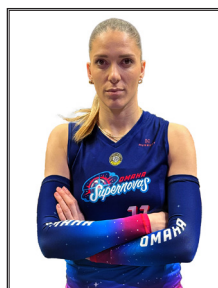

INTERIM HEAD COACH LAURA "BIRD" KUHN

Interim Head Coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn comes to Omaha with valuable coaching and playing experiences that span across multiple levels. A four-year standout at Georgia Tech University from 2001 through 2004, Kuhn led the Yellow Jackets to their first Elite Eight appearance in school history as well as three ACC titles. That also included making the NCAA Tournament in every season that Kuhn was on campus. Kuhn soon went into coaching, becoming a first-time assistant coach in 2007 at Appalachian State. Kuhn helped the Mountaineers to a 19-14 record, including a 14-4 conference mark. Kuhn left for an assistant coach job at Miami University one year later. While in Coral Gables, Bird aided the Hurricanes to a 67-28 record in three seasons including NCAA Tournament berths in two of her three years. Next came seven seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Kansas University, lifting the Jayhawks to unprecedented heights. In 2015, Kuhn was named the AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year after Kansas reached its first-ever Final Four that took place in Omaha. Following the 2017 season, Kuhn was hired as the sixth head coach in the history of the Texas A&M Volleyball program. Bird spent five seasons in College Station, finishing with a 76-60 overall record which included a Sweet 16 appearance in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. She was also named the SEC Coach of the Year that same season. Kuhn was hired as a Supernovas assistant in August 2023.

Built for \$291 million and finished in the fall of 2003, CHI Health Center Omaha is a key element in the continued renovation and development of Omaha's riverfront. In addition to the Omaha Supernovas, it is also home to the Creighton Men's basketball team.

The facility formerly known as Qwest Center Omaha (2003-11) and CenturyLink Center Omaha (2011-18) has a capacity that holds over 17,000. CHI has seven locker rooms, five dressing rooms and a media interview room. A \$6 million Daktronics, Inc. scoreboard hangs from the arena. The CHI Health Center has hosted some of America's top sporting events including the NCAA Men's Basketball Championships, NCAA Volleyball Championships and U.S. Olympic Team Trials for Swimming.

SUPERNOVAS BREAK PROFESSIONAL VOLLEYBALL U.S. ATTENDANCE RECORD FOR SECOND TIME

The Omaha Supernovas have broken the attendance record for an indoor women's professional volleyball match in the United States for the second time this season as 11,918 fans filled the CHI Health Center on Sunday, February 18 to see Omaha beat the Orlando Valkyries 3-1.

The previous U.S. record was set on January 24, 2024, as 11,624 fans watched the Atlanta Vibe upend the Supernovas in a five-set thriller in the first Pro Volleyball Federation match also at the CHI Health Center.

"From the sellout Vegas Thrill home opener against the Omaha Supernovas last week to tonight's third U.S. record-setting match, the athletes and fans of the Omaha Supernovas are leading the way to show that the dream of the highest level of professional volleyball is now a reality in the United States," co-owner Danny White said. "Beyond the work of the athletes, it takes a tremendous lift from staff behind-the-scenes to reach fans in dozens of states and set these records. And we will continue to grow and expand with the support of our fans."

Fellow Supernovas co-owner Chris Erickson said, "We are thankful to help continue to grow the sport and create opportunities for these athletes, which allows them to experience the tremendous support for the Supernovas throughout our entire state. The quality and level of play on the court is truly world-class and it's great for us to have this in Nebraska."
