**HEAD COACH FRAN FLORY**



Former head coach in the SEC, Fran Flory becomes the first head coach in franchise history of the Vegas Thrill. Flory comes to the Thrill after spending 24 seasons at LSU and 32 total years of coaching experience. Flory is the longest-tenured head coach at LSU and the Tigers winningest coach in program history with 405 victories, including nine NCAA Tournament appearances, seven 20-win seasons, seven SEC West divisional titles, and the 2009 SEC Championship. During her time with the Tigers, Flory coached 49 All-SEC recipients and 16 AVCA All-South Region selections, including AVCA All-Americans Brittnee Cooper (2007-2009) and Taylor Bannister (2017, 2019). Cooper was also named SEC Player of the Year in 2009, while Elena Martinez won back-to-back SEC Defensive Player of the Year awards in 2007 and 2008. Flory started her coaching career as the head coach at Wittenberg (1986), then was an assistant coach at Texas A&M (1987). Flory also served as an assistant coach for LSU from 1988-91, then held head coaching stints at Southeastern Louisiana (1992) and Kentucky (1993-1997). Before returning to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, becoming the head coach at LSU in 1998. At the time, Flory was the fifth head coach in program history for the Tigers. In her 32 years of coaching, Flory has collected 515 wins. In 2022, she was inducted into the American Volleyball Coaches Association's Hall of Fame. Flory also had a lot of success as a player the University of Texas (1980-83). The outside hitter was a member of Texas' AIAW National Championship squad. She received All-Southwest Conference and All-South Region honors during all three seasons with the Longhorns.

**ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH DENISE CORLETT**



Former assistant coach with Stanford, Denise Corlett spent 31-years as a member of the women's volleyball staff. During her time with the Cardinals, Corlett was a two-time AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year, leading the Cardinal to a record of 875-146 (.857) during her association with the program. She was on staff for an unprecedented nine NCAA championships and 18 Pac-12 championships. During her tenure, the Cardinals twice won three NCAA titles in a four-year span (1994, 1996-97 and 2016, 2018-19). The conference titles included six in a row between 1994-99, and more recently 10 of her last 14 seasons with the program. At Stanford, Corlett coached in 14 national championship matches, helped the team to 17 final fours and mentored 38 players to 93 AVCA All-America awards. She was also a part of Stanford's first beach volleyball staff, serving as an associate head coach from 2013-15 and the head coach of the program in 2016. Corlett was inducted into the Southern California Indoor Volleyball Hall of Fame in 2019. Prior to Stanford, Corlett served as an assistant at San Jose State (1987-88) and spent five years assisting at UCLA (1982-86), her alma mater. She held a graduate assistant position for the Bruins for two years and was a volunteer assistant for three. Corlett received a bachelor's degree in mathematics from UCLA in 1981. During her time at UCLA, Corlett played three varsity sports and was named the All-University Athlete of the Year in 1979. She was the national badminton champion in 1977 and won the Broderick Award in that sport. She was a three-time All-American in volleyball and played on the Bruins' national champion women's basketball team. In 1999, she was inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame.

## VEGAS - SAN DIEGO CONNECTIONS

- Vegas Thrill libero Kylie Murr and San Diego Mojo middle blocker Hannah Tapp played at Minnesota. During their respective careers, Murr was named to AVCA ALL-District/Region Team in 2023, while Tapp earned the same honors in 2015.
- San Diego Mojo assistant coach Deitre Collins-Parker was the head coach at UNLV for eight seasons. In the 1998 season, Collins-Parker was named Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, leading the Rebels to a 23-8 record and a WAC tournament semifinal appearance.
- Thrill players Gabby Gonzales, Hannah Pukis and Mojo players Morgan Lewis and Karson Bacon were all teammates at Oregon in 2023. The squad helped the Ducks to a 29-6 record and an NCAA Elite Eight appearance. The group were all named to the AVCA Pacific North All-Region Team that year.
- The Mojo's Genesis Collazo, Nomaris Velez-Agosto, Lindsay Stalzer, Nootsara Tomkom, Ali Bادتianelli, and Lindsey Vander Weide played in the Athletes Unlimited Volleyball league along with the Thrill's Alisha Glass Childress, Molly McCage and Saskia Hippe.

## REAL PRO VOLLEYBALL

- Vegas Thrill is the seventh franchise of Pro Volleyball Federation, North America's Premier Women's Professional Indoor League.
- Pro Volleyball Federation head coaches have combined for more than 2,500 career victories. The League boasts 17 players from the United States who have played with the National Team. Overall, there are 35 players who have been part of an Olympic or National Team.
- Vegas Thrill's Alisha Glass Childress and Molly MCCage represent two of U.S. National Team members from the league.
- Vegas Thrill is Las Vegas' fourth major professional team behind the Las Vegas Raiders, Las Vegas Aces and Vegas Golden Knights.

**MATCH PREVIEW**

**THRILL VS. MOJO**

The Vegas Thrill (5-7) will return home to the Dollar Loan Center for a matchup against the San Diego Mojo (2-6) on Sunday evening. This will be the third all-time meeting between the Thrill and the Mojo, with Vegas owning the all-time series 2-0.

Vegas comes into the match with a record of 5-7. The Thrill are coming off back-to-back wins against the Grand Rapids Rise (March 17) and the Columbus Fury (March 11). With a win in tonight's match, Vegas can extend its win streak to three straight for the first time this season. Vegas holds a record of 1-4 when playing at home.

San Diego comes into the match with a record of 2-6. The Mojo are coming off a 3-2 loss against the Orlando Valkyries on March 11. San Diego has yet to win a road match this season, standing at 0-3.

**PLAYERS TO WATCH: THRILL**



**Molly McCage** – The 2012 National Champion and former Germany's Best Blocker has three matches with at least 11 kills, including a season-high 14 in the season opener against the Omaha Supernovas (Feb. 7). The middle blocker has at least three blocks on five different occasions with a season-high eight against Omaha (Feb. 7).



**Gabby Gonzales** - The Oregon alum has four matches with at least 10 kills, which includes a season-high 15 against the Atlanta Vibe (March 4). Gonzales has also collected at least 10 digs on five different occasions, including a season-best 23 against the San Diego Mojo (Feb. 29).



**Alisha Glass Childress** - The Penn State alum currently leads the league in assists with 520. The setter has also gathered at least 30 assists in every match played this season, including a season-high 57 at the San Diego Mojo (Feb. 29). The setter has collected at least 10 digs in four different matches with a season-high 19 vs. Omaha Supernovas (Feb. 15). In her most recent outing against the Rise (March 17) she had 56 assists, 10 digs and four kills.

**Nootsara Tomkom** – The 16-year pro out of Ratchaburi, Thailand, has collected at least 28 assists in five matches, which includes a season-best 59 against the Grand Rapids Rise (Feb. 23). The setter also has four matches with at least 11 digs, including a season-best 20 against Grand Rapids (March 4).



**Lindsey Vander Weide** – The University of Oregon alum has four matches with at least 13 kills, including a season-high 21 against the Vegas Thrill (Feb. 29). The outside hitter also has five matches with at least 12 digs with a season-best 17 against the Grand Rapids Rise (Feb. 23).



**Temi Thomas-Ailara** – The Wisconsin alum has five matches with at least 10 kills, including a season-best 25 against the Grand Rapids Rise (Feb. 23). The outside hitter has four matches with at least 10 digs, which includes a season-best 13 against Grand Rapids (March 4).

**ABOUT THE DLC**

The Dollar Loan Center is the home of the Vegas Thrill. The state-of-the-art arena located in Henderson, Nevada, was opened in March 2022. The \$84 million project took only a span of 18 months to build. The arena has a capacity of 5,567 seats, while holding 28 suites. The Dollar Loan Center is not only the home of the Thrill, but also hosts the Henderson Silver Knights (AHL affiliate of the Vegas Golden Knights), the Vegas Knight Hawks of the Indoor Football League and the NBA G League Ignite. The arena is also home to the Southern Nevada Sports Hall of Fame, the Craggy Range Sports Bar and Grill and a team store. The arena also includes a sensory room, as the DLC is proud to partner with KultureCity to feature a space and tools for guests with sensory processing impairments.

**COLLEGE:** Played for Charlotte from 2019-22 ... Named to the All-Conference USA First Team in 2022 after earned All-Conference USA Second Team Honors in 2021 and 2020 ... Three-time Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week ... In her four seasons at Charlotte hit .361 with 532 kills and recorded a total of 332 blocks (90 solo) averaging 1.10 blocks per set and 1.79 kills per set ... Set a career-best of 15 kills against UAB on April 1, 2021 and a career-high 11 total blocks against North Dakota State on September 3, 2021 ... Career-best 5 solo blocks came against Florida Atlantic on March 7, 2021 ... Transferred to Michigan State in 2023 ... In her lone season as a Spartan, McArthur was named Second Team All-B1G and led Michigan State in solo blocks (28), block assists (88), total blocks (116) and blocks per set (1.09). Her 28 solo blocks led the conference. McArthur's .346 hitting percentage led the Spartans among qualified players and ranks No. 10 all-time for single-season hitting at MSU. On September 18, 2023, McArthur was named B1G Defensive Player of the Week after earning MVP honors at the Dog Pound Challenge.
