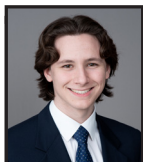
WELCOME TO PROFESSIONAL VOLLEYBALL

The Vegas Thrill are one of seven teams taking the court in the inaugural season of Pro Volleyball Federation. Below are a few facts about Las Vegas and Pro Volleyball Federation.

- Pro Volleyball Federation head coaches have combined for more than 2,500 career victories.
- The League boasts 17 players from the United States who have played with the National Team. Overall, there are 35 players who have been part of an Olympic or National Team.
- The Thrill are the sixth professional sports team to be based out of Las Vegas (Vegas Golden Knights, Las Vegas Raiders, Las Vegas Aces, Las Vegas Aviators, Las Vegas Lights FC).

VEGAS - SAN DIEGO CONNECTIONS

- San Diego Mojo assistant coach Deitre Collins-Parker was the head coach at UNLV for eight seasons. In the 1998 season, Collins-Parker was named Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, leading the Rebels to a 23-8 record and a WAC tournament semifinal appearance.
- Thrill outside hitter Gabby Gonzales and Mojo players Morgan Lewis and Karson Bacon were all teammates at Oregon in 2023. The squad helped the Ducks to a 29-6 record and an NCAA Elite Eight appearance. The trio were all named to the AVCA Pacific North All-Region Team that year.
- Mojo players Nomaris Velez-Agosto, Nootsara Tomkom, Ali Badtianielli and Lindsey Vander Weide played in the Athletes Unlimited Volleyball league along with Thrill players Alisha Glass Childress, Molly McCage and Saskia Hippe.

NEWS

LAST OUTING

The Vegas Thrill fell to the Grand Rapids Rise in four sets on April 20 at the Lee's Family Forum. Outside hitter Khat Bell led the Thrill offense with a match-high 14 kills, while outside hitter Hannah Maddux and outside hitter Gabby Gonzales each collected 11. Setter Alisha Glass Childress collected 42 assists in the four setter. Libero Kylie Murr led the backcourt defense with 15 digs, while Bell and Glass Childress each recorded 14.

VEGAS THRILL SIGN MCKENNA VICINI

The Lexington, Kentucky, native spent five seasons at Stanford. The outside hitter was a national champion in her freshman season with the Cardinals in 2019. During her time with the program, she was a three-time Pac-12 champion and a two-time All-Pac-12 Conference honorable mention. Vicini was coached under current teammate Alisha Glass Childress, who was an assistant coach at the time and Thrill associate head coach Denise Corlett.

VEGAS THRILL SIGN ERIN LIVINGSTON

The Corona, California, native spent five seasons with BYU (2019-23). In her senior year, Livingston led Cougars with 456 kills, which ranked No. 21 nationally. She recorded double-digit kills in 28 of 32 matches, including the final 13 matches. The outside hitter also had 142 digs, 48 total blocks and 28 service aces. During her stint with the program, Livingston was a four-time All-American.

VEGAS THRILL SIGN PAYTON CAFFREY

The four-year pro out of Chuluota, Florida, spent two seasons with West Virginia (2016-17). During her time with the program, she was named All-Big 12 First Team twice and earned AVCA All-Midwest Regional Honorable Mention. The outside hitter then transferred to Florida State in 2018, playing for the Seminoles indoor and beach volleyball team. Caffrey played for the indoor team in 2018 and 2019, she was named the 2018 ACC Player of the Year and an AVCA All-American Honorable Mention in 2018. Caffrey played three seasons for the beach volleyball team (2019-21) leaving the program ranked No. 3 all-time in career winning percentage (.859) and No. 20 all-time in wins (73).

PLAYER NOTES

Khat Bell has recorded a double-double in each of the last three matches. The Texas alum has collected 45 kills, 43 digs and eight blocks during the three-match stretch.

Alisha Glass Childress is currently second in the league in assists with 790. The Leland, Michigan, native has 12 matches with at least 40 assists, which includes a season-high 57 at the San Diego Mojo (Feb. 29).

Kylie Murr currently ranks third in the league in digs with 280. The Yorktown, Indiana, native has five matches with at least 21 digs, including a season-high 28 in season opener against the Omaha Supernovas (Feb. 7).

Hannah Maddux leads the Thrill offense with 182 kills. The outside hitter has recorded 10 matches with at least 10 kills. Her season-high in this category 18 in season opener against the Omaha Supernovas (Feb. 7).

Layne Van Buskirk has accumulating 37 blocks on the season. The middle blocker currently ranks No. 10 in the league in blocks and

has five matches with at least four blocks, including a season-best six at the Grand Rapids Rise (March 17).

Payton Caffrey made her season debut in the most recent match against the Grand Rapids Rise on April 20. The Chuluota, Florida, native played in one set and recorded one kill.

GLASS CHILDRESS NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Thrill setter Alisha Glass Childress was the first setter in league history to be named to the Pro Volleyball Federation Player of the Week. Glass Childress averaged 11.2 assists in the tight five-set victory over Grand Rapids (Mar. 19). Glass Childress racked up 10 digs, four kills and three blocks in the match.

TEXAS NATIONAL CHAMPIONS (2012)

Thrill players Khat Bell and Molly McCage were teammates at Texas during the 2012 National Championship run. The duo led the Longhorns to a combined 31-4 record that season. During the championship match, McCage recorded a season-high eight total blocks, four kills and one dig, while Bell collected six total blocks, four kills and three digs.

U.S. NATIONAL TEAM MEMBERS

Thrill players Alisha Glass Childress and Molly McCage each represented the U.S. National Team. Glass Childress represented the U.S. team as a player and as an assistant coach. As a player, Glass Childress led Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio, where she earned Best Setter honors. She was also selected Best Setter of the 2016 NORCECA Olympic Qualification Tournament, guiding the U.S. to gold and an automatic spot in the Rio Games. The Leland, Michigan, native also served as an assistant coach with the U.S. National Team at the 2018 Pan American Cup, where the U.S. rallied to win gold over the host Dominican Republic team. McCage also represented team USA, winning gold at the Pan American Cup in 2018.

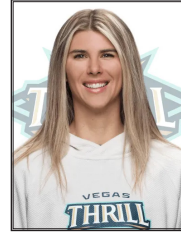

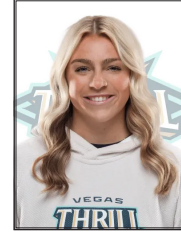

HEAD COACH FRAN FLORY

Former head coach in the SEC, Fran Flory becomes the first head coach in franchise history of the Vegas Thrill. Flory comes to the Thrill after spending 24 seasons at LSU, along with 32 total years of coaching experience. Flory is the longest-tenured head coach at LSU and the Tigers winningest coach in program history with 405 victories, including nine NCAA Tournament appearances, seven 20-win seasons, seven SEC West divisional titles, and the 2009 SEC Championship. During her time with the Tigers, Flory coached 49 All-SEC recipients and 16 AVCA All-South Region selections, including AVCA All-Americans Brittnee Cooper (2007-2009) and Taylor Bannister (2017, 2019). Cooper was also named SEC Player of the Year in 2009, while Elena Martinez won back-to-back SEC Defensive Player of the Year awards in 2007 and 2008. Flory started her coaching career as the head coach at Wittenberg (1986), then was an assistant coach at Texas A&M (1987). Flory also served as an assistant coach for LSU from 1988-91, then held head coaching stints at Southeastern Louisiana (1992) and Kentucky (1993-1997). Before returning to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, becoming the head coach at LSU in 1998. At the time, Flory was the fifth head coach in program history for the Tigers. In her 32 years of coaching, Flory has collected 515 wins. In 2022, she was inducted into the American Volleyball Coaches Association's Hall of Fame. Flory also had a lot of success as a player the University of Texas (1980-83). The outside hitter was a member of Texas' AIAW National Championship squad. She received All-Southwest Conference and All-South Region honors during all three seasons with the Longhorns.

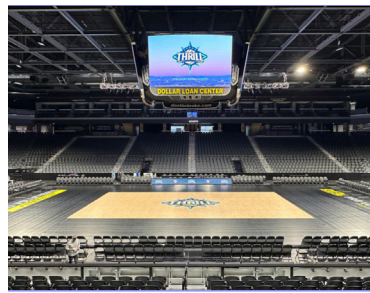

Lee's Family Forum

The Lee's Family Forum (formerly Dollar Loan Center) is the home of the Vegas Thrill. The Foley Entertainment Group announced April 2 that the multi-purpose sports and entertainment arena was being renamed the Lee's Family Forum. The new name was made possible through a partnership agreement between Foley Entertainment Group and the Lee Family, which owns local-based business Lee's Discount Liquors.

The state-of-the-art arena located in Henderson, Nevada, was opened in March 2022. The \$84 million project took only a span of 18 months to build. The arena has a capacity of 5,567 seats, while holding 28 suites. Lee's Family Forum is not only the home of the Thrill, but also hosts the Henderson Silver Knights (AHL affiliate of the Vegas Golden Knights), the Vegas Knight Hawks of the Indoor Football League and the NBA G League Ignite.
