**SERIES NOTES:** This is the fourth and final meeting between the Omaha Supernovas and Grand Rapids Rise. Omaha has yet to lose to the Rise this season, winning all three previous meetings. The Supernovas earned their first road win in franchise history with a 3-1 victory in Grand Rapids on Feb. 12. Omaha followed up with two more wins at home including a four-set win on March 28 and a five-set thriller on April 26.

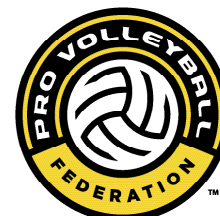
- ⇒ Pro Volleyball Federation head coaches have combined for more than 2,500 career victories.
- ⇒ The League boasts 17 players from the United States who have played with the National Team. Overall, there are 35 players who have been part of an Olympic or National Team.
- ⇒ Natalia Valentin-Anderson (Puerto Rico), Bethania de la Cruz (Dominican Republic) and Tori Dixon (U.S.A.) represent the three Olympians for the Supernovas.

### SUPERNOVAS CLINCH SPOT IN PVF CHAMPIONSHIP

The Supernovas have officially secured a spot in the first Pro Volleyball Federation Championship. With the Columbus Fury losing to the Atlanta Vibe on Thursday, May 2, Omaha is guaranteed to finish inside the top four in the league standings. The landmark championship is scheduled to take place on May 15 and May 18 at the home of the Supernovas, the CHI Health Center in downtown Omaha. The Supernovas have also locked up the No. 2 seed for the inaugural championship. Omaha will face the San Diego Mojo in the second semifinal on May 15 at 8:30 p.m. CDT.

### BRINGING HOME THE HARDWARE

The Supernovas are home to three NCAA National Champions with middle blocker Danielle Hart (Wisconsin), Sydney Hilley (Wisconsin) and Gabby (Curry) Thompson (Kentucky). Hart and Hilley were teammates when the Badgers won their first national title in school history in 2021. Thompson was the starting libero for Kentucky's first national title in the 2021 spring NCAA Tournament that took place in Omaha.

### IF YOU WANT SOFT SERVE, GO GET ICE CREAM

The Supernovas have received major production from behind the service line posting some of the best serving numbers in the Pro Volleyball Federation.

- ⇒ Omaha outside hitter Bethania de la Cruz leads the league with 31 aces through 23 matches.
- ⇒ De la Cruz has set the Pro Volleyball Federation record for most aces in a single match (6) twice this season. Once against Vegas on February 7 and again on February 12 at Grand Rapids.
- ⇒ The Supernovas rank first in the league in aces per match (4.09) while totaling a league-high 94 aces through 23 matches.
- ⇒ The Supernovas are also tied with Orlando for the league record for most team aces in one match with 10 against Grand Rapids on February 12.
- ⇒ Grand Rapids enters Thursday fourth in the Pro Volleyball Federation with 3.17 aces per match. The season total for the Rise stands at 73 aces in 23 contests.
- ⇒ Middle blocker Marin Grote leads the Rise with 16 aces on the season.

### OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE

Natalia Valentin-Anderson (Puerto Rico), Bethania de la Cruz (Dominican Republic) and Tori Dixon (U.S.A.) mark the three Olympians on the Supernovas roster. Valentin-Anderson was the setter for Puerto Rico in Rio 2016 as they finished 11th. De la Cruz is a two-time Olympian aiding the Dominican Republic to a fifth-place finish in London 2012 and eighth place in Tokyo 2020. She'll also play for the D.R. in Paris 2024. Dixon was an alternate for the U.S. in 2016 and 2020.

### BIG TEN TERRITORY

The Big Ten conference has a strong presence on the Supernovas roster with numerous players who attended B1G schools.

- ⇒ Nine of the 19 players on Omaha's roster attended Big Ten schools for their college careers.
- ⇒ Those players include Tori Dixon (Minnesota), Stephanie Samedy, (Minnesota) Danielle Hart (Wisconsin), Sydney Hilley (Wisconsin), Nia Reed (Penn State), Gina Mancuso-Prosofski (Nebraska), Brooke Nuneviller (Oregon), Kendall White (Penn State) and Kyla Swanson (Illinois).
- ⇒ Omaha's roster has combined for 20 All-Big Ten selections and 11 Big Ten titles.

### ACE ME IF YOU CAN

Omaha has been light years ahead of the competition in serve receive this season. The Supernovas have received 1,815 serves in 23 matches and have only allowed 56 aces on the year. Omaha hasn't allowed more than six aces in any match this season which

includes three contests with zero opponent serves hitting the floor. Only four other teams have accomplished that feat. San Diego has done it twice while Atlanta, Orlando and Grand Rapids have achieved that once. The Supernovas allow a league-low average of 2.43 aces per match with Atlanta coming closest at 2.88 per match.

### I LIKE BIG BLOCKS AND I CANNOT LIE

Supernovas Hristina Vuchkova and Tori Dixon have formed into a lethal combo in the middle for Omaha. Both blockers sit inside the top five in total blocks across the league through 23 matches with Vuchkova recording a team-high 66 blocks on the season. In fact, Vuchkova and Dixon co-own the franchise record with six blocks in a single match. She is also the league leader with an average of 3.33 blocks per match. Dixon isn't too far behind her teammate, totaling 62 blocks on the year.

### HERE COMES BETTY

Supernovas outside hitter and Olympian Bethania de la Cruz has stepped up her game in the closing stages of the inaugural Pro Volleyball Federation regular season. The Dominican Republic native struggled from Feb. 21 through March 30, averaging 5.6 kills on a .113 hitting percentage in eight matches. Since the calendar has turned over to April, the Omaha attacker has taken her game to new heights averaging 16.89 kills on a .314 clip in nine contests including a franchise-record 26 kills twice in back-to-back matches.

### SUPERNOVAS-RISE CONNECTIONS

There are a few connections between the Supernovas and Rise as they face off for the fourth and final time this season.

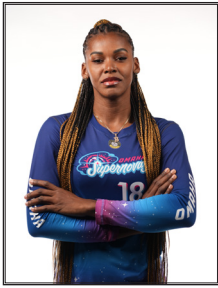
- ⇒ Grand Rapids libero Camila Gómez competed at Texas A&M University for her senior season in 2019 under Supernovas Coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn. Gómez posted 470 digs and 3.92 digs per set. Her digs mark was the fifth-highest total in a single-season in school history.
- ⇒ Rise Assistant Coach Denis Dimitrov has coached Supernovas middle blocker Hristina Vuchkova on the Bulgarian National Team since 2019.
- ⇒ Supernovas practice player Maggie King played for Western Michigan for five seasons, becoming a four-time First Team All-MAC performer.

### TEAMMATE REUNIONS

Between the Supernovas and Rise, there will be a few teammate reunions when they hit the court Sunday night.

- ⇒ Kendall White and Nia Reed were teammates during their time at Penn State, which includes a B1G title in 2017, and reunite in Omaha.
- ⇒ Omaha middle blocker Hristina Vuchkova will reunite with fellow Bulgarian National Team member Emiliya Dimitrova who's a 17-year pro for the Rise.
- ⇒ Rise middle blocker Molly Lohman was a teammate of current Supernova Stephanie Samedy. Samedy was a freshman while Lohman was a senior at Minnesota for the 2017 season.
- ⇒ Sydney Hilley and Danielle Hart enjoyed historic success during their careers at Wisconsin, leading the Badgers to their first national title in 2021 as well as four-straight B1G Titles Ten titles from 2019-2022.

# INTERIM HEAD COACH LAURA "BIRD" KUHN

Interim Head Coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn comes to Omaha with valuable coaching and playing experiences that span across multiple levels. A four-year standout at Georgia Tech University from 2001 through 2004, Kuhn led the Yellow Jackets to their first Elite Eight appearance in school history as well as three ACC titles. That also included making the NCAA Tournament in every season that Kuhn was on campus. Kuhn soon went into coaching, becoming a first-time assistant coach in 2007 at Appalachian State. Kuhn helped the Mountaineers to a 19-14 record, including a 14-4 conference mark. Kuhn left for an assistant coach job at Miami University one year later. While in Coral Gables, Bird aided the Hurricanes to a 67-28 record in three seasons including NCAA Tournament berths in two of her three years. Next came seven seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Kansas University, lifting the Jayhawks to unprecedented heights. In 2015, Kuhn was named the AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year after Kansas reached its first-ever Final Four that took place in Omaha. Following the 2017 season, Kuhn was hired as the sixth head coach in the history of the Texas A&M Volleyball program. Bird spent five seasons in College Station, finishing with a 76-60 overall record which included a Sweet 16 appearance in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. She was also named the SEC Coach of the Year that same season. Kuhn was hired as a Supernovas assistant in August 2023.

Built for \$291 million and finished in the fall of 2003, CHI Health Center Omaha is a key element in the continued renovation and development of Omaha's riverfront. In addition to the Omaha Supernovas, it is also home to the Creighton Men's basketball team.

The facility formerly known as Qwest Center Omaha (2003-11) and CenturyLink Center Omaha (2011-18) has a capacity that holds over 17,000. CHI has seven locker rooms, five dressing rooms and a media interview room. A \$6 million Daktronics, Inc. scoreboard hangs from the arena. The CHI Health Center has hosted some of America's top sporting events including the NCAA Men's Basketball Championships, NCAA Volleyball Championships and U.S. Olympic Team Trails for Swimming.

**SUPERNOVAS BREAK PROFESSIONAL VOLLEYBALL U.S. ATTENDANCE RECORD FOR THIRD TIME**

The Omaha Supernovas, Nebraska's major professional volleyball team, as part of Pro Volleyball Federation, have reset the attendance record for an indoor women's professional volleyball match in the United States for the third time this season as **12,090 fans** filled the CHI Health Center on Saturday, March 16.

The Supernovas now hold four of the top five U.S. attendance records, to include the top three. The Supernovas have now hosted at least 11,000 fans in four of their six home matches this season, which includes the two previous records. Omaha broke its last attendance mark of 11,918 fans when the Supernovas defeated the Orlando Valkyries 3-1 on February 18, 2024.

"The athletes and fans of the Omaha Supernovas are continuing to lead the way to show that the dream of the highest level of professional volleyball is now a reality in the United States," co-owner Danny White said. "Beyond the relentless dedication of the athletes, it takes a tremendous lift from staff behind-the-scenes to reach fans in dozens of states and set these national records. We will continue to grow and expand with the support of our fans."

Fellow Supernovas co-owner Chris Erickson said, "We are thankful to help continue to grow the sport and create opportunities for these athletes, which allows them to experience the tremendous support for the Supernovas throughout Nebraska and nationally. The quality and level of play on the court is truly world-class and it's great for us to have this in Nebraska. You can only fully appreciate it by seeing these athletes live, in person and in action."
