SERIES HISTORY: This is the fifth meeting between Omaha and Atlanta. The Vibe won the 2024 season series 3-1, including a 2-0 record inside the CHI Health Center, highlighted by a five-set victory in the first-ever PVF match on January 24, 2024. The Supernovas lone win against Atlanta came in a dominant sweep on the road on Feb. 29, 2024. Three of the four matches have gone at least four sets. The Vibe is the only opponent in the history of the PVF that Omaha doesn't have a winning record against.

2024 PRO VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONS



From preseason favorites to first-ever Champions, the Omaha Supernovas took the pro volleyball world by storm in the Pro Volleyball Federation's inaugural season in 2024. The Supernovas swept the Grand Rapids Rise to claim the PVF Championship at the CHI Health Center in Omaha on May 18. Setter Sydney Hiley was named Postseason MVP after coming off the bench in leading Omaha to a reverse sweep of San Diego in the semifinals before the championship sweep.

The championship win capped off a historic year for the Supernovas, who showed the hunger for professional volleyball in the United States, hosting the seven most-attended pro volleyball matches in U.S. history. That includes the U.S. record on March 16, 2024 with 12,090 fans watching Omaha beat the Orlando Valkyries 3-1. The Supernovas drew seven crowds of 10,000 people or more out of its 12 home matches finishing with the No. 1 average attendance mark in the world among pro volleyball teams with 9,656 fans per match. A total of 134,969 fans attended pro volleyball matches at the CHI Health Center in 2024, which also includes the 19,094 spectators who attended the PVF Semifinals and Championship.

The product on the court was equally as impressive with the Supernovas finishing 18-8 overall and a 9-3 mark at home. Star outside hitters Brooke Nuneviller and Bethania De La Cruz were named to the PVF All-League First Team while De La Cruz took home the PVF Server of the Year award after leading the league with 32 aces during the regular season. Bulgarian middle blocker Hristina Vuchkova missed the first three games of the season, but arrived in Omaha to lead the Supernovas and PVF with 70 total blocks by season's end. She was also an All-League selection, being named to the second team.

PRESEASON HONORS

- Coming off its championship-winning season, the Supernovas were voted to finish third in the PVF Preseason Poll, receiving one of the eight first-place votes. Both the poll and all-league teams were voted by the head coaches who weren't allowed to vote for their own team and players.
- Omaha will have the top outside hitter duo entering the 2025 season with 2024 All-League First Team Selection Brooke Nuneviller and PVF Rookie of the Year Reagan Cooper both voted to the Preseason All-League Team.

PEDIIGREE OF GREATNESS

- Aside from winning their own league title, the 2025 Supernovas field a roster full of championship experience and individual stardom dating back to their college days. This season's roster has combined for the following:
 - Nine NCAA Volleyball National Championships, Semifinal and Championship Appearances. MB Kayla Caffey won the 2022 title with Texas in her final year of college at the CHI Health Center, securing the first of back-to-back Longhorn championships. OH Valeria Vazquez Gomez leads the team in semifinals appearances, helping Pittsburgh reach four-straight National Semifinals from 2021 to 2024.
 - 12 conference titles. Vazquez Gomez and setter Kendra Wait are tied for the most on the Supernovas with four. Vazquez Gomez won

four ACC titles while Wait helped Creighton to Big East championships in all four of her college seasons.

- 27 AVCA All-American honors spread across 14 Supernovas. Seven of those earning multiple honors including Wait [4], Brooke Nuneviller [4], Kaitlyn Hord [4], Mac Podraza [3], Emily Londot [3] and Kelsie Payne [3].

WELCOME BACK TO THE GOOD LIFE

- Six Supernovas on the 2025 roster have college connections within the state. Four having played at Nebraska and two at Creighton.

Lindsay Krause, Ally Batenhorst, Kayla Caffey and Kaitlyn Hord were all Huskers under head coach John Cook, but Krause is the only one of the four to play all four seasons at NU [2021-2024].

- Krause and Batenhorst have the longest teammate history as Huskers from 2021 to 2023. Caffey [2021] and Hord [2022] joined that duo as teammates for one year each.

Setter Kendra Wait and libero Allison Whitten each played for Creighton under head coach Kirsten Berthal Booth. Wait spent all four seasons in Omaha while Whitten joined the Bluejays for her final season in 2022, where she and Wait shared the floor as starters.

CARRYING THE CHAMPIONSHIP TORCH

- Two Supernovas from the inaugural championship-winning team return to Omaha for the 2025 season. That includes outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller and setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson.

Nuneviller was a pillar on the 2024 team, making her a priority in the free agency period over the summer. The Oregon product showcased her two-way play en route to PVF All-League First Team honors. She recorded 3.33 kills [8th in PVF] and 3.32 digs [6th] per set, including the franchise record for most digs in a single match with 22.

Nuneviller was also the first player in franchise history to be named PVF Player of the Week [March 12]. Plus, she's currently the all-time franchise leader in kills, attacks, kills per set and digs.

Valentín-Anderson shared time as the starting setter in 2024, but quickly established herself as one of the best defensive setters in the league. The Puerto Rico Olympian averaged 8.60 assists and 2.87 digs per set in 21 matches, highlighted by her PVF Player of the Week honor following a week where she averaged 12 assists and four digs per match. Also, her defense was put on national display when her incredible two-dig save against the Vegas Thrill on May 6 was featured No. 2 on SportCenter's Top 10 Plays.

ROCK, CHALK JAYHAWK

- Much like its ties to Nebraska, the 2025 Supernovas draw several connections with Kansas.

Opposite Kelsie Payne, outside hitter Reagan Cooper and middle blocker Toyosi Onabanjo each finished their college careers at KU as Cooper and Onabanjo spent time together as teammates for the 2023 season. Plus, setter Kendra Wait heralds from the Sunflower State, growing up in Gardner, Kansas.

- All three received All-American honors in Lawrence with Payne leading the way with two first team honors [2016, 2015] and a third team nod [2017]. Cooper made the third team [2023] in her lone season with KU while Onabano was named an honorable mention in 2024 after averaging 2.58 kills and 1.23 blocks per set.
- Omaha head coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn made her name known in the coaching ranks at Kansas from 2011-2017, winning the 2015 AVCA Assistant of the Year after the Jayhawks made its first-ever National Semifinal in school history.
- Supernovas Team President Diane Mendenhall earned her bachelor's degree from Kansas while being a four-year starter for the Jayhawks.

CONSISTENCY BREEDS SUCCESS

- The Supernovas took that title literal in its 2024 championship run, becoming one of the most consistent teams in the PVF.
- Omaha was the lone team in the league last season to not have been swept, winning at least one set in every match played.
- The Supernovas were also the only team in the PVF to not lose multiple matches in a row. Omaha peaked at the right time, ripping off its longest winning streak of the season [4] down the stretch. In fact, the Supernovas won six of its last seven matches to win the title, including that winning streak.

HARD SERVE, NO CONE REQUIRED

- A major reason for the Supernovas championship run in the inaugural season was due in part to its stellar serving, leading the PVF with 105 aces in 106 sets for a league-leading 0.99 aces per set mark.
- That effort was led by 2024 PVF Server of the Year winner and Dominican Republic Olympian Bethania De La Cruz, who hammered a league-leading 35 aces in 92 sets [0.38], which led the second-highest total by more than 10.
- It was a balanced serving attack behind De La Cruz as seven other Supernovas recorded at least seven aces including Brooke Nuneviller [12], Paige Briggs-Romine [10], Jess Schaben-Lansman [9], Tori Dixon [9], Stephanie Samedy [8], Sydney Hilley [8], and Natalia Valentín-Anderson [7].

WORLDLY TIES

- The Supernovas will field three players with ties outside the United States, including Puerto Ricans Natalia Valentín-Anderson and Valeria Vazquez Gomez as well as Colombian libero Camila Gómez.
- A 16-year pro, Valentín-Anderson is one of the greatest and most respected setters of her generation, leading the Puerto Rico National Team to its only Olympic appearance in its country's history. As the starting setter, the team finished 11th in 2016 at the Rio Summer Olympics.
- Valentín-Anderson brings an illustrious professional career to Omaha having spent time in Italy, Poland, France, Azerbaijan and Puerto Rico. She's a legend in the Puerto Rico league winning the "Best Setter" award four times and the league's MVP in 2012-2013.

• Gómez played in 21 of the 26 matches for the PVF Runner-Up Grand Rapids Rise during the inaugural 2024 season, posting 187 digs [2.63 D/S] and 38 assists. She's also a veteran of the Columbian National Team, winning 11 medals for her home country including 20 individual accolades.

• Vazquez Gomez hails from Manati, Puerto Rico and has played in a few tournaments for the national team which includes winning a bronze medal at the 2022 Challenger Cup. She also participated in the 2023 and 2024 NORCECA Challenger Cup Qualification, finishing third and first respectively.

GOT PASS? WE DO.

- The Supernovas finished as the best passing team in the PVF during the 2024 season, recording a 54% positive rate with a 28% perfect rate.
- Outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller passed at a team-leading 60% positive, which ranked fourth in the league and second amongst attackers.
- Camila Gómez brings impressive passing numbers over from Grand Rapids. After taking over as the primary libero in the final 12 matches of the season, Gómez recorded a positive rate of 67% which led the entire PVF.
- As a result of its passing, Omaha allowed the fewest aces among all seven teams in the league with 65. Atlanta was nearest with 69 aces allowed, but Orlando was a distant third with 80 allowed in 24 matches.
- The Supernovas peaked with a positive pass percentage of 66 in their five-set win over the San Diego Mojo on April 20 at the CHI Health Center. Omaha posted 60% or more in five separate matches which tied Orlando for second-most in the league behind Atlanta [8].
- As far as perfect passing, Omaha recorded a season-high 39% in the franchise opener against Atlanta making it more impressive with that number coming in a five-set match.
- Unsurprisingly, the Supernovas led the PVF in opponent positive pass percentage with 47% while allowing a 23% perfect rate. The season low came in the PVF Semifinal on May 15 when San Diego passed at 34% positive.

THE FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

- One season after consisting of one of the most experienced rosters in the PVF, the Supernovas enter 2025 with an emphasis on youth.
- Omaha will see the pro debut of eight rookies in 2025: MB Phoebe Awoleye, OH Ally Batenhorst, OH Lindsay Krause, OPP Emily Londot, MB Toyosi Onabano, OH Valeria Vazquez Gomez, S Kendra Wait and L Allison Whitten.
- Kayla Caffey, Reagan Cooper, Kaitlyn Hord, Brooke Nuneviller and Mac Podraza are either entering their second or third season as pros, further showing the youth movement in Omaha.
- In total, 13 of the 16 players on the Supernovas have three years or fewer of professional seasons under their belt.
- Natalia Valentín-Anderson is the clubhouse leader with 16 years of professional experience followed by Kelsie Payne [6 years] and Camila Gómez [4 years].

SUPERNOVAS-VIBE CONNECTIONS

- PVF Draft No. 1 overall pick Merritt Beason makes a quick return to Nebraska for her pro debut Friday against the Supernovas. The opposite spent her last two college seasons in Lincoln for Nebraska Volleyball leading the Huskers to a National Championship appearance and one National Semifinal. She was teammates with current Supernovas Lindsay Krause [2023-2024] and Ally Batenhorst [2023].
- Atlanta head coach Kayla Banworth is one of the best players in Nebraska Volleyball history. A former walk-on, Banworth transformed into one of the best players in program history under John Cook from 2007-2010. She developed into an Olympian, winning eight medals during an illustrious international career including a bronze medal at the 2016 Rio Olympics. She later returned to Lincoln to be an assistant coach from 2017-2019, helping NU win its fifth national title in school history [2017]. She returns to the head coaching ranks after spending three seasons at Ole Miss, pulling off one of the best turnarounds in Division I volleyball from year one [1-19] to year two [21-9].
- Vibe middle blocker Taya Beller was a two-time O2CCA All-America First Team selection at Wayne State in Nebraska. Heralding from Lindsay, Nebraska, Beller attended Humphrey/Lindsay Holy Family High School.
- Batenhorst will reunite with former USC setter Mia Tuaniga when the two face off on Friday. The two were teammates in L.A. for the 2024 college season.

The Omaha Supernovas finished out its first professional volleyball season in storybook fashion, becoming the first-ever Pro Volleyball Federation Champions after sweeping the Grand Rapids Rise on Saturday, May 18 at the CHI Health Center in downtown Omaha.

During its championship run in the inaugural PVF season, Omaha and the Supernovas became the league's shining star, hosting 134,969 fans across the 15 matches held at the CHI Health Center. That includes a whopping 9,656 average mark for the 12 Supernovas' home matches, plus the 19,094 spectators who attended the PVF Semifinals and Championship.

The Supernovas erased any doubt that professional volleyball could happen in the United States with their 9,656 match average the No. 1 mark amongst professional volleyball teams in the world.

Omaha broke many of its own attendance records across its historic season, starting with 11,624 fans attending the first-ever PVF match on Jan. 24 between Omaha and the Atlanta Vibe. That mark was broken a few weeks later on Sunday, Feb. 18 as 11,918 fans showed up to watch the Supernovas take on the Orlando Valkyries. The newest and most current attendance record was set on Saturday, March 16 with 12,090 spectators packing into the CHI Health Center to see the Supernovas beat the Valkyries in four sets.

In total, Omaha hosted crowds of 10,000 people or more in seven of the 15 matches hosted at CHI this past season, including five-digit crowds in six of the 12 regular season contests.

The Supernovas took advantage of the partisan crowd, going 9-3 at home during the regular season before winning two-straight at CHI to become the inaugural champions.


