#### MATCHDAY STORYLINES

- The Mojo kick off season two on the road for the second straight year.
- Series History: The Mojo and Valkyries meet for the fifth time in series history and the first time since May 9, 2024. San Diego leads the all-time series 3-1, including a 2-0 mark in Orlando. All four of the previous matches have taken the full five sets to determine a winner. San Diego has a three-match winning streak in the series.
- Season Openers and Road Openers: San Diego Mojo Professional Women's Volleyball begins with Friday's opener against Orlando. San Diego is 0-1 all-time in season openers and road openers.
- · Old Friends: San Diego will face former Mojo outside hitter Lindsey Vander Weide for the first time as opponents. Vander Weide ranked second on the team in scoring last season with 3.4 points per set and earned PVF Player of the Week honors after establishing league records with 32 points and 30 kills in the last match between the Mojo and Valkyries on May 9. Vander Weide was also previously a teammate of Ronika Stone in college at Oregon.

#### SAN DIEGO MOJO OUTLOOK

- The Mojo look to build off of the momentum established at the end of the 2024 season, in which the team bounced back from a 2-6 start to win 11 of the final 15 regular-season games to earn a spot in the PVF Championship Semifinals. The squad came one set short of the championship match, falling to eventual champion Omaha in five sets after taking an early 2-0 lead.
- San Diego head coach Tayyiba Haneef-Park's roster features a pair of players who started every game for the Mojo last season in middle blocker Ronika Stone and libero Shara Venegas, as well as San Diego local Kendra Dahlke. Stone, a 2025 PVF Preseason All-League Team honor, led the league in hitting percentage last season with a mark of .336. Venegas was fourth in the league with 345 total digs (3.63), while Dahlke was among the top scorers for the Mojo in 2024 highlighted by a 23-point match at Orlando on April 14 that is the fifth-best scoring output in team history.

#### ORLANDO VALKYRIES OUTLOOK

- Orlando is led by second-year head coach Amy Pauly, who guided the Valkyries to an 8-16 record during the inaugural PVF season.
- The roster is highlighted by a pair of Preseason All-League Team selections in middle blocker Kaz Brown and opposite hitter Brittany Abercrombie. Brown ranked second behind Stone in hitting percentage last season with a mark of .333, while posting the secondmost blocks in the league with 68 (0.67/set) and ranking third in kill percentage (.433). Abercrombie is a 7-year professional who joins the league after winning the 2024 Athletes Unlimited title as the topranked player in the league.

- Her 23 digs against Omaha on April 2 occured in a four-set match.

#### DAHLKE DOES IT ALL

- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke was among the top scorers for the Mojo in 2024 highlighted by a 23-point match at Orlando on April 14 that is the fifth-best scoring output in team history.
- Dahlke had 65 attacks in the Mojo's five-set win at Orlando on April 14, the most in a four-set match for the Mojo and the second-most overall.
- She also had 27 points in the victory, tied for the fourth-most in a match in Mojo history.

#### TEAMMATES ONCE AGAIN

- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke and middle blocker Lauren Page were previously teammates during their club days, competing with Coast Volleyball Club prior to their collegiate careers.
- Page was also a college teammate of middle blocker Ronika Stone afor three season at Oregon from 2016-18.

#### MOJO DRAFTEES MAKE NOISE IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

• All four San Diego Mojo selections in the 2024 PVF

Draft had their collegiate teams compete in the NCAA Championship Tournament.

- Middle blocker Leyla Blackwell, drafted in the fourth round, advanced to the Final Four with the Nebraska Cornhuskers.
- First-round selection Devyn Robinson and the Wisconsin Badgers advanced to the regional final, falling to the Huskers in Lincoln.
- Third round selection Maya Tabron (SMU) and fifth round pick Elise McGhee (Baylor) both helped lead their teams to first-round victories in the tournament.

#### **BLACKWELL BACK HOME**

- Prior to playing at Nebraska, rookie Leyla Blackwell helped guide the San Diego Toreros to the 2022 NCAA Semifinals.
- A native San Diegan, Blackwell was a three-time all first-team All-WCC selection for the Toreros.

#### DOWN BUT NOT OUT

- After starting last season with three-straight road losses and dropping five of six contests overall to start the year, the Mojo finished the season 12-6 for a .667 winning percentage.
- Six of San Diego's 13 wins last season took a full five sets, while another six took four.
- The Mojo were swept three times in the first three

matches of the season

#### **FIVE-SET THRILLERS**

- The Mojo played in a league-high 10 five-set matches in 2024 with a record of 6-4 in such matches.
- San Diego's six five-seet victories were the most in the Pro Volleyball Federation.
- The Mojo appeared in a league-record six consecutive five-set matches during in April 2024, going 4-2 in those matches.



# TAYYIBA **HANEEF-PARK**

#### HEAD COACH

The 2024 Pro Volleyball Federation Coach of the Year, Tayyiba Haneef-Park is a three-time Olympian with the United States, Haneef-Park won silver with Team USA at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and 2012 London Olympics.

Last season, Haneef-Park led the Mojo to a 13-11 regular-season record and No. 3 seed in the PVF playoffs in their first season. The club started 2-6 before winning 11 of its next 16 games to qualify for the postseason, falling one set short of reaching the championship match.

Prior to joining the Mojo, she spent 2022 as an assistant coach with Oregon Volleyball, during which the Ducks sported a 26-6 record, including a 17-3 mark in Pac-12 play. The 17 conference wins were a program record. Haneef-Park also spent two seasons (2015-16) as an assistant coach with Arizona Beach Volleyball, helping the Wildcats to a 38-10 record.

In addition to her Olympic performances, Haneef-Park contributed to notable achievements such as a gold medal at the 2012 FIVB World Grand Prix and bronze finishes at the 2003 and 2004 Grand Prix.

Haneef-Park played professionally for 11 years from 2001-12 with stops in Italy, Japan, Russia, Turkey and Azerbaijan. She began coaching in 2014, serving as an assistant on collegiate staffs with Arizona from 2014-16 and Oregon from 2022-23. She has also served as an assistant with various USA Volleyball teams during that time, but recently helping the United States win silver at the Pan American Cup in August and NORCECA Final Six in June.

Collegiately, Haneef-Park was a 2001 All-American at Long Beach State and helped The Beach to a national championship in 1998 and a runner-up finish in 2001. She also competed in track & field for Long Beach State and was a three-time All-American in the high jump.
