MATCHDAY STORYLINES

- San Diego opens the home slate of the 2025 season looking to avenge a season-opening loss suffered in Orlando on January 11.
- Series History:** The Mojo and Valkyries meet for the sixth time in series history and the second time in 2025. San Diego leads the all-time series 3-2, with a 1-1 mark in San Diego. The first four matches took the full five sets to determine a winner, while the Valkyries topped the three sets when the squads met in the season-opener.
- Home Openers:** San Diego was victorious in the inaugural season opener in 2024, topping the Grand Rapids Rise in four sets, including a thrilling first set won by the Mojo, 36-34.
- Welcome Back:** Former Mojo outside hitter and current Valkyrie Lindsey Vander Weide returns to Viejas Arena for the first time as an opponent. Vander Weide ranked second on the team in scoring last season with 3.4 points per set and earned PVF Player of the Week honors after establishing league records with 32 points and 30 kills in the last match between the Mojo and Valkyries on May 9.

SAN DIEGO MOJO OUTLOOK

- Last time out, San Diego Mojo earned the first win of the season with a 3-1 (25-18, 21-25, 25-19, 25-22) victory over the Columbus Fury at Nationwide Arena. Rookie outside hitter Maya Tabron led all scorers with 19 points, courtesy of 14 kills, a match-high four blocks and one ace, while also adding a team-high 17 digs for her first career double-double.
- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke also posted a double-double, registering a match-high 17 kills with a career-best 16 digs, while opposite Regan Pittman established career highs with 11 kills, eight digs and two service aces. Setter DaYeong Lee paced San Diego with 41 assists and libero Kamaile Hiapo tallied 16 digs.
- Through the first week of the season, Tabron has scored 29 points, the fourth-most in the league, and averaging 4.14 points per set, while she and Ronika Stone are tied for seventh in the PVF with four blocks on the season. Dahlke is third in the PVF with 24 digs and 4.8 digs per set.

ORLANDO VALKYRIES OUTLOOK

- Orlando arrives in San Diego with a 1-1 record, falling in their last match at home to the Indy Ignite. Brittany Abercrombie led the Valkyries with 18 total points, registering 17 kills, one block and nine digs in the contest. On the year, Abercrombie ranks fifth in the league with 28 points scored and is eighth averaging 4.00 points per set, while her 25 kills are fourth-most in the league.

- She had season highs of 23 digs against Omaha on April 2 and April 23.
- Her 23 digs against Omaha on April 2 occurred in a four-set match.

DAHLKE DOES IT ALL

- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke was among the top scorers for the Mojo in 2024 highlighted by a 23-point match at Orlando on April 14 that is the fifth-best scoring output in team history.
- Dahlke had 65 attacks in the Mojo's five-set win at Orlando on April 14, the most in a four-set match for the Mojo and the second-most overall.
- She also had 27 points in the victory, tied for the fourth-most in a match in Mojo history.

LUND MAKES AN IMPACT

- Outside hitter Kayla Lund made her presence felt immediately for the Mojo, scoring the first point of the PVF season in the opener against Orlando.
- Lund went on to tie for a team-leading 10 kills, while also posting the most swings with 31. She tallied her first double-double of the season by adding 10 digs.

TEAMMATES ONCE AGAIN

- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke and middle blocker Lauren Page were previously teammates during their club days, competing with Coast Volleyball Club prior to their collegiate careers.
- During their senior year of club in 2015, the duo helped Coast Volleyball Club win bronze at the Junior Olympics in New Orleans.
- Page was also a college teammate of middle blocker Ronika Stone for three seasons at Oregon from 2016-18.
- While at Oregon, Page and Stone helped the Ducks go a combined 62-33 (.653) with three appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including an Elite Eight run in 2018.
- Rainelle Jones and Jenaisya Moore were teammates at Metro Volleyball Club in Washington, D.C., helping lead the team two national appearances.

MOJO DRAFTES MAKE NOISE IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- All four San Diego Mojo selections in the 2024 PVF Draft had their collegiate teams compete in the NCAA Championship Tournament.
- Middle blocker Leyla Blackwell, drafted in the fourth round, advanced to the Final Four with the Nebraska Cornhuskers.
- First-round selection Devyn Robinson and the Wisconsin Badgers advanced to the regional final, falling to the Huskers in Lincoln.
- Third round selection Maya Tabron (SMU) and fifth round pick Elise McGhee (Baylor) both helped lead their teams to first-round victories in the tournament.

ROOKIES MAKING THEIR MARK

- Three Mojo rookies made their professional debuts in the season opener against Orlando.
- Outside hitter Maya Tabron started tied for the team lead with 10 kills while also adding eight digs.
- Middle blocker Leyla Blackwell also started, collecting seven kills and hitting a team-high .417.
- Elise McGhee entered in the second set and played two frames in her first professional appearance.

BLACKWELL BACK HOME

- Prior to playing at Nebraska, rookie Leyla Blackwell helped guide the San Diego Toreros to the 2022 NCAA Semifinals.
- A native San Diegan, Blackwell was a three-time first-team All-WCC selection for the Toreros.

OLYMPIC REPRESENTATION

- A trio of Mojo players have represented their nation in the Olympic Games.
- Libero Shara Venegas competed with Puerto Rico at the 2016 Olympic Games Rio, the first team in the history of Puerto Rico volleyball to play in the Olympic games.
- Libero/Setter Sara Sponcil represented the USA in beach volleyball at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, taking ninth place with partner Kelly Claes.
- Outside Hitter Rosir Calderón twice played for Cuba in the Olympics, winning bronze at the 2004 Athens Olympic Games.
- At the 2008 Beijing Olympics, Calderón was selected Best Spiker after helping Cuba to a fourth-place finish, scoring 11 points in the bronze medal match.
- Additionally, head coach Tayyiba Haneef-Park represented the United States at three Olympic Games, winning silver with Team USA at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and 2012 London Olympics.
- Mojo assistant coach Deitre Collins-Parker also played for Team USA in the Olympics, competing at the 1988 Seoul Olympics.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

- After starting last season with three-straight road losses and dropping five of six contests overall to start the year, the Mojo finished the season 12-6 for a .667 winning percentage.
- Six of San Diego's 13 wins last season took a full five sets, while another six took four.
- The Mojo were swept three times in the first three matches of the season

FIVE-SET THRILLERS

- The Mojo played in a league-high 10 five-set matches in 2024 with a record of 6-4 in such matches.
- San Diego's six five-set victories were the most in the Pro Volleyball Federation.
- The Mojo appeared in a league-record six consecutive five-set matches during in April 2024, going 4-2 in those matches.

The 2024 Pro Volleyball Federation Coach of the Year, Tayyiba Haneef-Park is a three-time Olympian with the United States. Haneef-Park won silver with Team USA at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and 2012 London Olympics.

Last season, Haneef-Park led the Mojo to a 13-11 regular-season record and No. 3 seed in the PVF playoffs in their first season. The club started 2-6 before winning 11 of its next 16 games to qualify for the postseason, falling one set short of reaching the championship match.

Prior to joining the Mojo, she spent 2022 as an assistant coach with Oregon Volleyball, during which the Ducks sported a 26-6 record, including a 17-3 mark in Pac-12 play. The 17 conference wins were a program record. Haneef-Park also spent two seasons (2015-16) as an assistant coach with Arizona Beach Volleyball, helping the Wildcats to a 38-10 record.

She has also served as an assistant with various USA Volleyball teams during that time, but recently helping the United States win silver at the Pan American Cup in August and NORCECA Final Six in June.

Collegiately, Haneef-Park was a 2001 All-American at Long Beach State and helped The Beach to a national championship in 1998 and a runner-up finish in 2001. She also competed in track & field for Long Beach State and was a three-time All-American in the high jump.

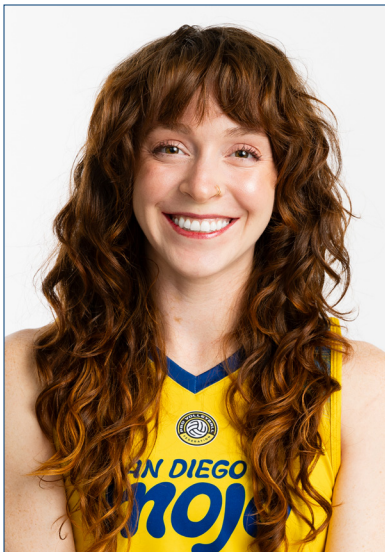
