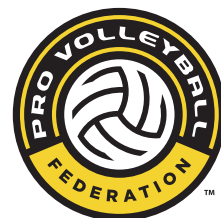

The Atlanta Vibe are excited to host their First Serve match, playing in front of their home crowd for the first time in 2025. The league has announced that each team will have 14 home matches this season, giving local fans even more ability to watch the Vibe. After ending in Gas South Arena with a win 3-0 sweep against Columbus, the Vibe gear up to take on their opponent on for the first time this season.

VIBE RESULTS FROM TRAVEL WEEKEND

After the season opening weekend, the Vibe come home with a 1-1 record, losing to Omaha in a tight five set match, having the Omaha Supernovas best the Vibe 15-13 in the final set. The Vibe responded with a dominant sweep against the Vegas Thrill. Ending with a team hitting efficiency of .262, Middle Blocker Khorī Louis led the team with a .727 hitting efficiency, earning 9 kills on 11 attempts. The Vibe bring momentum into the gym, coming off the weekend with a resounding win.

# HEAD COACH KAYLA BANWARTH

As a former Power Five head volleyball coach and a member of the 2016 USA Olympic Team, Banwarth has expansive knowledge of the game. Her impressive career with Team USA spanned six years of international competition, during which she collected eight medals. Notably, she earned a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympics, adding to her legacy in American volleyball history.



Banwarth previously served as head coach at Ole Miss and as an assistant for the powerhouse Nebraska program. After making a shift to coaching in 2017, Banwarth stepped into an assistant role at the University of Nebraska. In her debut season, she helped guide the Huskers to a Big Ten Championship and a NCAA Championship title. In 2020, Banwarth became head coach at Ole Miss turning around the volleyball program from a 1-9 record in the 2020-2021 season to a staggering 21-9 record in 2022. Banwarth heads into her first season as the newly appointed Atlanta Vibe head coach.
