MATCHDAY STORYLINES

The Vegas Thrill will be playing their third match of the season after splitting the season-opening weekend with a reverse sweep at home against the Grand Rapids Rise and a straight sets loss to the Atlanta Vibe. The Thrill will match up against the defending PVF champion Omaha Supernovas and will look for their first win against Omaha since last season's season opening five-set win.

- □ Dmaha is coming off 2-D weekend where they defeated the Atlanta Vibe, 3-2, and swept the Grand Rapids Rise, 3-D. road loss against the Omaha Supernovas. 2024 PVF All-League First Team pick Brooke Nuneviller led the charge against Atlanta with 22 kills and 17 digs, while middle blocker Kaitlyn Hord also broke the franchise's single-match blocking record with seven stuffs.
- ⇒ Omaha libero Camila Gómez added another franchise record in her Supernovas debut, tallying a single-match record 31 digs.
- Against Grand Rapids, Natalia Valentín-Anderson, Brooke Nuneviller and Reagan Cooper spearheaded an improved Omaha offense from opening night that hit .253, compared to a .187 hitting percentage against Atlanta.
- ⇒ Valentín-Anderson, Puerto Rico's starting setter in the 2016 Rio Olympics, dished out 42 assists, 11 digs, four kills and an ace.

FIRST-YEAR EXPERIENCE

The Vegas Thrill saw impressive performances from a pair of first-year pros in the opening week of the PVF season.

- ➡ Charitie Luper posted 20 points and tacked on 18 kills, one block and one service ace against Grand Rapids. Furthermore, she added a team-high 12 digs aginst Atlanta.
- ⇒ Lauren Jardine came off the bench against the Rise and notched 15 points with 13 kills, one block and one service ace.



PRO VOLLEYBALL FEDERATION ON TV

Pro Volleyball Federation (PVF) announced its latest television agreement with FS1 and FS2, expanding its television coverage with 12 additional nationally televised matches in 2025.

The deal includes four matches airing on FS1 and eight on FS2, bringing PVF's total national television footprint to over 24 matches across multiple premier linear and over-the-air networks - the most extensive television coverage in professional volleyball.

CBS Sports Network will also brodcast a select number of the Vegas Thrill's home matches.

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

⇒ For the second straight season, the Thrill won its seasonopening match after they defeated the Omaha Supernovas, 3-2, in the season opener last season and the Grand Rapids Rise, 3-2, this season.

DÉJÀ VU

- ⇒ For the second consecutive season, the Thrill have started their season 1-1 and will look to get back in the win column against Omaha.
- ⇒ Vegas started last season 1-2 after their first three matches.

FIVE-SET THRILLERS

- ⇒ Five of Vegas' eight victories last season came by way of a 3-2 triumph. The Thrill pulled off the second reverse sweep in franchise history in the season-opener against Grand Rapids.
- ⇒ Other five-set wins last season came twice on the road against the San Diego Mojo (road win) and Orlando Valkyries.

STATS ON STATS ON STATS

- Omaha's 17.13 points per match sat first in the opening week of play and they also ranked first in points (137), kills (115), digs (157), assists (103) and tied for second in blocks (17).
- Natalia Valentín-Anderson of the Supernovas posted the highest hitting percentage last week (.583), while Vegas' Alisha Childress' 95 assists topped the league charts in a pair of matches. Valentín-Anderson sat third with 90 assists last week.
- ⇒ Omaha's rooke Nuneviller led the PVF with 37 kills while averaging 4.63 kills per set. Furthermore, Kaitlyn Hord's nine blocks were a leaque-best last week.
- ⇒ Vegas' 107 kills were second behind Omaha (115) and the Thrill's 101 assists were also just behind Omaha (101).

PLAYER SPOTLIGHTS

- ⇒ Setter Alisha Childress, an eight-year pro, played in all 24 matches last season. A Penn State alum, Childress was named the Professional Volleyball Federation inaugural season's Most Inspirational Player of the Year. Her other professional experience includes Italy, Turkey, Poland, Puerto Rico and Brazil.
- ⇒ Allison Mayfield has parlayed her college success at Kansas (2008-11) into a diverse overseas resume which includes stops in France, Switzerland, Finland. Peru, Greece and Hungary. She was named MVP of the 2017-18 Peruvian League campaign.
- ➡ Willow Johnson, who comes after a shortend season with the San Diego Mojo, competed with Athletes Unlimited from 2021-23, registering 242 kills, 130 digs, three assists and five service aces in 63 sets played.

WORLDWIDE EXPERTISE

⇒ Vegas' roster comprises of players with extensive professional experience on the international stage. These athletes have played in various countries, inlcuding Austria, Germany, South Korea, Turkey, France, Switzerland, Greece, Finland and Taiwan.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS, MY FRIENDS!

⇒ The Thrill boasts a trio of players that are NCAA National Champions. Camryn Hannah (Penn State, 2024) and teammates Grace Loberg and Lauren Jardine (Wisconsin, 2021) have all claimed national titles.

HOME MEANS NEVADA

➡ Middle blocker Berkeley Oblad is the lone Nevada native on the Thrill's roster. A Henderson, Nev., native, Oblad returns for her second season in teal where she played in 23 matches last season, accumulating 195 points. She averaged 6.35 kills per match in the PVF and opened her season on Friday with nine kills.

RECORDS ARE MEANT TO BE BROKEN

⇒ Vegas' Alisha Childress opened the season in record fashion, handing out 72 assists in the Thrill's season opener against Grand Rapids to set a new PVF standard for assists in a match. The previous record was 64 set in 2024. Childress' 31 assists in the fourth set against the Rise also tied the PVF single-set record for assists.

THRILL-SUPERNOVAS CONNECTION

⇒ A trio of players, Allison Mayfield, Sophie Davis and Kendall White, were on the 2024 Omaha Supernovas PVF championship squad.

OMAHA OUTLOOK

- Omaha will have the top outside hitter duo entering the 2025 season with 2024 All-League First Team Selection Brooke Nuneviller and PVF Rookie of the Year Reagan Cooper both voted to the Preseason All-League Team.
- ⇒ The Supernovas' 55 kills in a three-set match against the Rise is a league-record this season, while their 146 attacks against Grand Rapids is tied for a league record.
- ⇒ Brooke Nuneviller's 22 kills and 57 attacks in against the Atlanta Vibe leads the league this season for five sets.

HEAD COACH RAMON HERNANDEZ CRUZ

Hernandez Cruz brings extensive volleyball experience - at multiple levels - to his first season in Vegas.

A native of Bayamón, Puerto Rico, Hernández was most recently named "Coach of the Year" in the Men's Superior Volleyball League (LVSM), marking the fourth time he has received the honor. He was a three-time All-American at Penn State, where he led the team to its first NCAA Championship in 1994 and earned the tournament's Most Outstanding Player award.



He also has extensive experience coaching in the System. His achievements extend beyond indoor volleyball, as he earned a bronze medal in men's beach volleyball at the 2003 Pan American Games and represented Puerto Rico at the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens. He was also the head coach of the Puerto Rico men's volleyball team in 2017.

The Lee's Family Forum (formerly Dollar Loan Center) is the home of the Vegas Thrill. The Foley Entertainment Group announced April 2 that the multi-purpose sports and entertainment arena was being renamed the Lee's Family Forum. The new name was made possible through a partnership agreement between Foley Entertainment Group and the Lee Family, which owns local-based business Lee's Discount Liquors. The state-of-the-art arena located in Henderson. Nevada. was opened in March 2022. The \$84 million project took only a span of 18 months to build. The arena has a capacity of 5,567 seats, while holding 28 suites. Lee's Family Forum is not only the home of the Thrill, but also hosts the Henderson Silver Knights (AHL affiliate of the Vegas Golden Knights) and the Vegas Knight Hawks of the Indoor Football League




