

The league has announced that each team will have 14 home matches this season, giving local fans even more ability to watch the Vibe. This night will be a celebration of shared values, inviting all to enjoy a memorable night of inclusion and excitement.

RESULTS FROM HOME OPENER MATCH

In a tight five set thriller, the Vibe open their home match with a win over the Columbus Fury. With the night being a backand-forth battle, the Vibe come out on top in a nail-bitting 16-14 fifth set result. Ending with a team hitting efficiency of .235, opposite hitter Merritt Beason reached a season high of 23 kills to lead Atlanta to victory. Outside hitter Leah Edmond led the defensive front with five total blocks, alongside libero Morgan Hentz with 27 digs.

HEAD COACH KAYLA BANWARTH

As a former Power Five head volleyball coach and a member of the 2016 USA Olympic Team, Banwarth has expansive knowledge of the game. Her impressive career with Team USA spanned six years of international competition, during which she collected eight medals. Notably, she earned a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympics, adding to her legacy in American volleyball history.

Banwarth previously served as head coach at Ole Miss and as an assistant for the powerhouse Nebraska program. After making a shift to coaching in 2017, Banwarth stepped into an assistant role at the University of Nebraska. In her debut season, she helped guide



the Huskers to a Big Ten Championship and a NCAA Championship title. In 2020, Banwarth became head coach at Ole Miss turning around the volleyball program from a 1-9 record in the 2020-2021 season to a staggering 21-9 record in 2022. Banwarth heads into her first season as the newly appointed Atlanta Vibe head coach.




