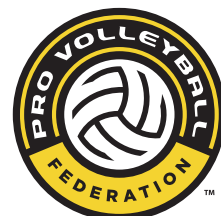

VIBE CONTINUE HOME GAME STRETCH

The Atlanta Vibe is gearing up for their third consecutive home game at Gas South Arena. So far, the team holds a 1-1 record in their home venue, securing a victory over the Columbus Fury but falling short against the Grand Rapids Rise. Now, the Vibe are set to face the Vegas Thrill for the second time this season, competing on their home court.

VEGAS VS ATLANTA HISTORY

Atlanta Vibe faces off against Vegas Thrill for the sixth time in franchise history. Since the start of the league in 2024, the Vibe's record against the Thrill is 5-0, as Atlanta has only lost one set to the Thrill in organization history. On January 12th, 2025, Vegas hosted Atlanta to kick off the first weekend of the 2025 season. The Vibe are hoping to keep that clean slate as they take on the Thrill for the sixth time in league history.

HEAD COACH KAYLA BANWARTH

As a former Power Five head volleyball coach and a member of the 2016 USA Olympic Team, Banwarth has expansive knowledge of the game. Her impressive career with Team USA spanned six years of international competition, during which she collected eight medals. Notably, she earned a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympics, adding to her legacy in American volleyball history.



Banwarth previously served as head coach at Ole Miss and as an assistant for the powerhouse Nebraska program. After making a shift to coaching in 2017, Banwarth stepped into an assistant role at the University of Nebraska. In her debut season, she helped guide the Huskers to a Big Ten Championship and a NCAA Championship title. In 2020, Banwarth became head coach at Ole Miss turning around the volleyball program from a 1-9 record in the 2020-2021 season to a staggering 21-9 record in 2022. Banwarth heads into her first season as the newly appointed Atlanta Vibe head coach.

Pro Volleyball Federation has teamed up with USA Volleyball – the national governing body of the sport in the U.S. – to promote volleyball at its highest level.

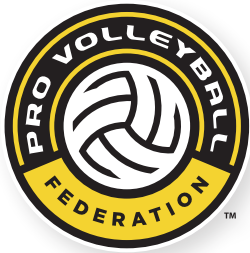
