- San Diego returns home after a standout victory over the defending PVF champion Omaha Supernovas on Sunday, while league-newcomer Indy Ignite arrives to town unbeaten in their first three games.
- Series History: The Mojo and Ignite will meet for the first time in series history when they square off at Viejas Arena on Friday night. It will mark the first of four regular-season matchups between the organizations. San Diego will travel to Indianapolis on February 13 and April 27 before the Ignite return to Southern California for the regular season finale on May 3.
- Indy to Host Inaugural All-Star Game: Indianapolis will be the host for the first-ever Pro Volleyball Federation All-Star Game on Saturday, Feb. 22. The event will showcase the league's top talent and give fans a unique opportunity to witness the best in professional volleyball. In a historic first for professional volleyball, CBS Television Network will air the match on its national broadcast outlet. This landmark moment underscores PVF's commitment to elevating the sport and bringing professional women's volleyball to a broader audience.

#### SAN DIEGO MOJO OUTLOOK

- Last time out, the Mojo took down the defending Pro Volleyball Federation champion Omaha Supernovas in four sets (20-25, 25-19, 25-22, 25-22) at CHI Health Center in front of 12,723 fans, the second-largest match attendance in United States Pro Volleyball history.
- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke had another stellar outing for the Mojo, earning her third-straight double-double with a team-high 18 points and 12 digs, while hitting .356.
   Setter DaYeong Lee earned her third double-double with season highs of 46 assists and 14 digs.
- Middle blocker Ronika Stone had her top performance of the season, tallying a season-high 13 points courtesy of seasons bests of nine kills and four blocks, while also chipping in seven digs. Outside hitter Jenaisya Moore added eight kills and middle blockers Leyla Blackwell and Lauren Page had six kills each.
- Dahlke has been one of the top players in the league this season, currently ranking third in digs (4.15/set), fifth in kills (4.00/set) and seventh in points (4.08/set).
- Setter DaYeong Lee ranks third in the PVF averaging 10.53 assists per set, while her 158 total assists also ranks third.
- Opposite Regan Pittman has been a force at the service line, tallying four service aces on the year, tied for fourthmost in the league.
- Stone's huge performance on Sunday improved her season total to nine blocks on the year, tied for the fifth in the PVF.

#### INDY IGNITE OUTLOOK

- In their first road match and first five-set encounter in franchise history, Indy Ignite recorded five-set defeat of the Columbus Fury, 25-18, 32-30, 19-25, 22-25, 15-11. The hard-fought victory kept the Ignite unbeaten on season at 3-0.
- Leketor Member-Meneh had a season-best 29 kills and added 18 digs and a service ace in the win.
- Nina Cajic finished the match with 19 kills, 13 digs and an ace. Middle blocker Caroline Crawford had a sensational night with eight kills and seven blocks. Setter Sydney Hilley dished out 54 assists to go with 15 digs, a block and an ace, and libero Kylie Murr totaled 25 digs and five assists.
- Member-Meneh is the current PVF leader in points per set (6.33) and kills per set (5.92) and ranks second in total points (76) and total kills (71).
- Hilley leads the league in assists per set with a 11.83 average, totaling 142 in 12 sets played.
- Kylie Murr is fourth in the PVF in digs per set (4.08), while standing ninth in total digs (49).

#### DAHLKE DOES IT ALL

- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke has started the season strong, posting three double-doubles in the first four games of the season, besting her total from all of last season.
- The Bonsall, Calif. native is currently third in the PVF averaging 4.15 digs per set.
- Dahlke picked up her first double-double of the season, totaling 17 kills and 17 digs in a win at Columbus, then

notching another one the following match with 14 kills and 18 digs versus Orlando. She added a third at defending PVF champion Omaha with a season-best 18 kills while tallying 12 digs.

- In 2024, she was among the top scorers for the Mojo, highlighted by a 23-point match at Orlando on April 14 that is the fifth-best scoring output in team history.
- Dahlke had 65 attacks in the Mojo's five-set win at Orlando on April 14, the most in a four-set match for the Mojo and the second-most overall.
- She also had 27 points in the victory, tied for the fourth-most in a match in Mojo history.

#### **TABRON TAKES CHARGE**

- Rookie outside hitter Maya Tabron is off to a hot start in her professional career, notching double-figures in kills in each of her first three games, while twice leading the Mojo in scoring.
- The Gilroy, Calif. native tallied 10 kills in her debut against Orlando on January 9 and collected 14 in a road win at Columbus before posting a career-best 15 kills in her home debut against the Valkyries.

#### STUNE GULL

- Middle blocker Ronika Stone has become a force in the middle for the Mojo, racking up nine blocks in the first four games, including four last time out against Omaha.
- Stone was selected by the league's coaches to the PVF Preseason All-League Team.
- She earned 2024 All-Pro Volleyball Federation Second Team honors after leading the league with league in a .336 hitting percentage.
- Last season, Stone equaled the team-record with three services aces in a victory over Omaha on April 2.

#### PITTMAN COMING UP ACES

- Middle blocker Regan Pittman has shown her versatility this season, opening the year as the starting opposite for the Mojo, but her impact has also been felt at the service line.
- Heading into San Diego's fifth match of the season, Pittman is tied for fourth in the league with four service aces.
- She picked up her first of the year in the season-opener at Orlando.
- Pittman tallied two aces in San Diego's win at Columbus, tied for the fourth-most in San Diego history and tied for the top mark in a four-set match.

#### VENEGAS WITH THE COURT COVERAGE

- Libero Shara Venegas led the Mojo last season and was fourth in the league with 345 total digs and ranked second on the team with 3.63 digs per set.
- $\bullet$  She had season highs of 23 digs against Omaha on April 2 and April 23.
- Her 23 digs against Omaha on April 2 occurred in a four-set match.

#### **LUND MAKES AN IMPACT**

- Outside hitter Kayla Lund made her presence felt immediately for the Mojo, scoring the first point of the PVF season in the opener against Orlando.
- Lund went on to tie for a team-leading 10 kills, while also posting the most swings with 31. She tallied her first double-double of the season by adding 10 digs.

#### TEAMMATES ONCE AGAIN

- Outside hitter Kendra Dahlke and middle blocker Lauren Page were previously teammates during their club days, competing with Coast Volleyball Club prior to their collegiate careers.
- During their senior year of club in 2015, the duo helped Coast Volleyball Club win bronze at the Junior Olympics in New Orleans.
- Page was also a college teammate of middle blocker Ronika Stone for three season at Oregon from 2016-18.
- •While at Oregon, Page and Stone helped the Ducks go a combined 62-33 (.653) with three appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including an Elite Eight run in 2018.
- Rainelle Jones and Jenaisya Moore were teammates at Metro Volleyball Club in Washington, D.C., helping lead the team two nationals appearances.

#### MOJO DRAFTEES MAKE NOISE IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- All four San Diego Mojo selections in the 2024 PVF Draft had their collegiate teams compete in the NCAA Championship Tournament.
- Middle blocker Leyla Blackwell, drafted in the fourth round, advanced to the Final Four with the Nebraska Cornhuskers.

- First-round selection Devyn Robinson and the Wisconsin Badgers advanced to the regional final, falling to the Huskers in Lincoln.
- Third round selection Maya Tabron (SMU) and fifth round pick Elise McGhee (Baylor) both helped lead their teams to first-round victories in the tournament.

#### **ROOKIES MAKING THEIR MARK**

- Three Mojo rookies made their professional debuts in the season opener against Orlando.
- Outside hitter Maya Tabron started tied for the team lead with 10 kills while also adding eight digs.
- Middle blocker Leyla Blackwell also started, collecting seven kills and hitting a teamhigh .417.
- Elise McGhee entered in the second set and played two frames in her first professional appearance.

#### BLACKWELL BACK HOME

- Prior to playing at Nebraska, rookie Leyla Blackwell helped guide the San Diego Toreros to the 2022 NCAA Semifinals.
- A native San Diegan, Blackwell was a three-time first-team All-WCC selection for the Toreros.

#### OLYMPIC REPRESENTATION

- A pair of Mojo players have represented their nation in the Olympic Games.
- Libero Shara Venegas competed with Puerto Rico at the 2016 Olympic Games Rio, the first team in the history of Puerto Rico volleyball to play in the Olympic games.
- Libero/Setter Sara Sponcil represented the USA in beach volleyball at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, taking ninth place with partner Kelly Claes.
- Additionally, head coach Tayyiba Haneef-Park represented the United States at three Olympic Games, winning silver with Team USA at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and 2012 London Olympics.
- Mojo assistant coach Deitre Collins-Parker also played for Team USA in the Olympics, competing at the 1988 Seoul Olympics.

#### COACH 'EM UP

- Outside hitters Kendra Dahlke and Kayla Lund double as players and coaches in their professional careers, competing at the highest level of volleyball in the United States with the Mojo, while also serving in the collegiate coaching ranks.
- Dahlke has served as an assistant coach at UC Davis for the last three seasons, helping the Aggies to a 19-10 record in 2024, the most for the program since 2011.
- Lund began kicked off her coaching career as an assistant at Brown University, helping second-year coach Taylor Virtue guide the team to a fourth-place finish in the lvy League.

#### **FIVE-SET THRILLERS**

- The Mojo played in a league-high 10 five-set matches in 2024 with a record of 6-4 in such matches.



# TAYYIBA **HANEEF-PARK**

#### HEAD COACH

The 2024 Pro Volleyball Federation Coach of the Year, Tayyiba Haneef-Park is a three-time Olympian with the United States. Haneef-Park won silver with Team USA at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and 2012 London Olympics.

Last season, Haneef-Park led the Mojo to a 13-11 regular-season record and No. 3 seed in the PVF playoffs in their first season. The club started 2-6 before winning 11 of its next 16 games to qualify for the postseason, falling one set short of reaching the championship match.

Prior to joining the Mojo, she spent 2022 as an assistant coach with Oregon Volleyball, during which the Ducks sported a 26-6 record, including a 17-3 mark in Pac-12 play. The 17 conference wins were a program record. Haneef-Park also spent two seasons (2015-16) as an assistant coach with Arizona Beach Volleyball, helping the Wildcats to a 38-10 record.

Haneef-Park played professionally for 11 years from 2001-12 with stops in Italy, Japan, Russia, Turkey and Azerbaijan. She began coaching in 2014, serving as an assistant on collegiate staffs with Arizona from 2014-16 and Oregon from 2022-23. She has also served as an assistant with various USA Volleyball teams during that time, but recently helping the United States win silver at the Pan American Cup in August and NORCECA Final Six in June.

Collegiately, Haneef-Park was a 2001 All-American at Long Beach State and helped The Beach to a national championship in 1998 and a runner-up finish in 2001. She also competed in track & field for Long Beach State and was a three-time All-American in the high jump.
