SERIES HISTORY: This is the sixth all-time meeting between Omaha and Columbus. The Supernovas lead the series 4-1, including a sweep against the Fury last week on Jan. 24, 2025. The only win by Columbus came in the franchise's first-ever home match on Feb. 21, 2024 in a four-set victory. Omaha is 2-0 at home against the Fury, winning in four sets on April 4, 2024 before sweeping Columbus in the 2024 regular season finale on May 9, 2024.

SERIES HISTORY: This is the fifth all-time meeting between Omaha and Orlando. The Supernovas are unbeaten against the Valkyries, winning the 2024 season series 4-0 with three four-set wins and one five setter. The highlight of the series being Omaha's victory on March 16, 2024 with a then U.S. Pro Volleyball attendance record of 12,090 packing into CHI. The Supernovas are 2-0 in Orlando, surviving in five sets the last time in Florida on March 9, 2024.

2024 PRO VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONS



From preseason favorites to first-ever Champions, the Omaha Supernovas took the pro volleyball world by storm in the Pro Volleyball Federation's inaugural season in 2024. The Supernovas swept the Grand Rapids Rise to claim the PVF Championship at the CHI Health Center in Omaha on May 18. Setter Sydney Hilley was named Postseason MVP after coming off the bench in leading Omaha to a reverse sweep of San Diego in the semifinals before the championship sweep.

The championship win capped off a historic year for the Supernovas, who showed the hunger for professional volleyball in the United States, hosting the seven most-attended pro volleyball matches in U.S. history. That includes the U.S. record on March 16, 2024 with 12,090 fans watching Omaha beat the Orlando Valkyries 3-1. The Supernovas drew seven crowds of 10,000 people or more out of its 12 home matches finishing with the No. 1 average attendance mark in the world among pro volleyball teams with 9,656 fans per match. A total of 134,969 fans attended pro volleyball matches at the CHI Health Center in 2024, which also includes the 19,094 spectators who attended the PVF Semifinals and Championship.

The product on the court was equally as impressive with the Supernovas finishing 18-8 overall and a 9-3 mark at home. Star outside hitters Brooke Nuneviller and Bethania De La Cruz were named to the PVF All-League First Team while De La Cruz took home the PVF Server of the Year award after leading the league with 32 aces during the regular season. Bulgarian middle blocker Hristina Vuchkova missed the first three games of the season, but arrived in Omaha to lead the Supernovas and PVF with 70 total blocks by season's end. She was also an All-League selection, being named to the second team.

FRANCHISE FIRSTS

PRESEASON HONORS

- Coming off its championship-winning season, the Supernovas were voted to finish third in the PVF Preseason Poll, receiving one of the eight first-place votes. Both the poll and all-league teams were voted by the head coaches who weren't allowed to vote for their own team and players.
- · Omaha will have the top outside hitter duo entering the 2025 season with 2024 All-League First Team Selection Brooke Nuneviller and PVF Rookie of the Year Reagan Cooper both being voted to the Preseason All-League Team.

PEDIGREE OF GREATNESS

- · Aside from winning their own league title, the 2025 Supernovas field a roster full of championship experience and individual stardom dating back to their college days. This season's roster has combined for the following:
- NCAA Nine Volleyball National Championships, Semifinal and Championship Appearances. MB Kayla Caffey won the 2022 title with Texas in her final year of college at the CHI Health Center, securing the first of back-to-back Longhorn championships. OH Valeria Vazquez Gomez leads the team in semfinals appearances, helping Pittsburgh reach four-straight National Semifinals from 2021 to 2024.
- 12 conference titles. Vazquez Gomez and setter Kendra Wait are tied for the most on the Supernovas with four, Vazquez Gomez won

four ACC titles while Wait helped Creighton to Big East championships in all four of her college seasons.

• 27 AVCA All-American honors spread across 14 Supernovas. Seven of those earning multiple honors including Wait (4), Brooke Nuneviller (4), Kaitlyn Hord (4), Mac Podraza (3), Emily Londot (3) and Kelsie Payne (3).

WELCOME BACK TO THE GOOD LIFE

- Six Supernovas on the 2025 roster have college connections within the state. Four having played at Nebraska and two at Creiahton.
- · Lindsay Krause, Ally Batenhorst, Kayla Caffey and Kaitlyn Hord were all Huskers under head coach John Cook, but Krause is the only one of the four to play all four seasons at NU (2021-2024).
- · Krause and Batenhorst have the longest teammate history as Huskers from 2021 to 2023. Caffey (2021) and Hord (2022) joined that duo as teammates for one year each.
- Setter Kendra Wait and libero Allison Whitten each played for Creighton under head coach Kirsten Bernthal Booth, Wait spent all four seasons in Omaha while Whitten joined the Bluejays for her final year in 2022, where she and Wait shared the floor as starters.

CARRYING THE CHAMPIONSHIP TORCH

- Two Supernovas from the inaugural championship-winning team return to Omaha for the 2025 season. That includes outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller and setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson
- · Nuneviller was a pillar on the 2024 team, making her a priority in the free agency period over the summer. The Oregon product showcased her two-way play en route to PVF All-League First Team honors. She recorded 3.33 kills (8th in PVF) and 3.32 digs (6th) per set, including the previous franchise record for most digs in a single match with 22.
- Nuneviller was also the first player in franchise history to be named PVF Player of the Week (March 12). Plus, she's currently the all-time franchise leader in kills, attacks, kills ner set and digs.
- · Valentín-Anderson shared time as a starter in 2024, but quickly established herself as one of the best defensive setters in the league. The Puerto Rico Olympian averaged 8.60 assists and 2.87 digs per set in 21 matches, highlighted by her PVF Player of the Week honor following a week where she averaged 12 assists and four digs per match. Also, her defense was put on national display when her incredible two-dig save against the Vegas Thrill on May 6 was featured No. 2 on SportCenter's Top 10 Plays.

ROCK, CHALK JAYHAWK

- Much like its ties to Nebraska, the 2025 Supernovas draw several connections with Kansas.
- Opposite Kelsie Payne, outside hitter Reagan Cooper and middle blocker Toyosi Onabanjo each finished their college careers at KU as Cooper and Onabanjo spent time together as teammates for the 2023 season. Plus, setter Kendra Wait heralds from the Sunflower State, growing up in Gardner, Kansas.

- All three received All-American honors in Lawrence with Payne leading the way with two first team honors (2016, 2015) and a third team nod (2017). Cooper made the third team (2023) in her lone season with KU while Onabanjo was named an honorable mention in 2024 after averaging 2.58 kills and 1.23 blocks per set.
- Omaha head coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn made her name known in the coaching ranks at Kansas from 2011-2017, winning the 2015 AVCA Assistant Coach of the Year after the Jayhawks made its first-ever National Semifinal in school history.
- Supernovas Team President Diane Mendenhall earned her bachelor's degree from Kansas while being a four-year starter for the Jayhawks.

CONSISTENCY BREEDS SUCCESS

 The Supernovas remain the only team in PVF history to not have been swept, winning at least one set in all 31 matches in franchise history. Plus, it took until match 29 and 30 for Omaha to have its first multi-match losing streak.

THE FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

- Omaha will see the pro debut of eight rookies in 2025: MB Phoebe Awoleye, OH Ally Batenhorst, OH Lindsay Krause, OPP Emily Londot, MB Toyosi Onabanjo, OH Valeria Vazquez Gomez, S Kendra Wait and L Allison Whitten.
- Kayla Caffey, Reagan Cooper, Kaitlyn Hord, Brooke Nuneviller and Mac Podraza are either entering their second or third season as pros, further showing the youth movement in Omaha.
- In total, 13 of the 16 players on the Supernovas have three years or fewer of professional seasons under their belt.
- Natalia Valentín-Anderson is the clubhouse leader with 16 years of professional experience followed by Kelsie Payne (6 years) and Camila Gómez (4 years).

HORDING THE NET

- Hord has been one of the premier blockers in the league through the first three weeks of the 2025 season.
- The former Husker and Nittany Lion leads the PVF in both total blocks with 19 and blocks per set with a 0.95 mark.
- Hord's seven blocks in the five-set win over the Vibe on opening night set a Supernovas single-match record. Also, she is only one of three players in the PVF to record seven or more blocks in a match this season.
- The Kentucky native also sits fifth in hitting percentage with a .365 clip through 63 attacks with 26 kills and only three errors.

A'NUNE"THER LEVEL

- After averaging over 12 kills and digs per match last season, Supernovas outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller has raised her game so far in the 2025 season.
- Nuneviller enters the weekend third in points (92), kills (84) and kills per set (4.20).
- The Chandler, Arizona native is one of only two players in the league this season to record 20+ kills and 15+ digs in match. That

- was on opening night against Atlanta when she poured in 22 kills and 17 digs while hitting .340.
- The Oregon product has been averaging 16.8 kills and 14.8 digs per match through five contests.

THE DIG PATROL

- The Supernovas have been one of the better defensive teams in the PVF highlighted by being third in digs per set (17.20) and fourth in total digs (344).
- That effort is spearheaded by three of the best ball control defenders in the league with libero Camila Gómez, setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson and outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller as all three sit inside the top ten in both total digs and digs per set.
- Valentín-Anderson leads the trio with a team-leading 4.05 digs per set with 81 total digs. Both those numbers are third in the PVF and the highest among all league setters. She's recorded at least 11 digs in each of the five matches this season including a seasonhigh 21 against the Mojo on Jan. 19th.
- Gómez sits fourth in the league in total digs [79] and fifth in digs per set [3.95]. Her 31 digs against Atlanta during the season opener broke a single-match franchise record.
- Nuneviller, who is a former libero, has the fifth-most digs in the league with 74 while owning a 3.70 digs per set mark. Each number is tops among all outside hitters in the PVF.

THE COOPER CURVE

- Supernovas hitter and 2024 PVF Rookie of the Year Reagan Cooper has become the best server for the Supernovas recording a teamleading seven aces and 0.44 per set, which are both third in the league. The secondyear pro is on pace to smash her rookie year serving totals when she only had eight aces in 82 sets last year in Columbus.
- Cooper became the first Supernovas player to put down an ace in three or more consecutive matches since Bethania De La Cruz did so last season. De La Cruz accomplished that feat in seven-straight contests en route to being named the 2024 PVF Server of the Year. Cooper has done that in the first five matches of the 2025 season.
- Cooper is still one of the most dangerous attackers in the PVF, posting 3.75 kills per set [60 total] with that number sixth in the league. She had her best performance of the season last time out in Columbus, hammering her former team with 14 kills on a season-high .393 clip with nine digs and two more aces.

SUPERNOVAS-FURY CONNECTIONS

- Supernovas Reagan Cooper and Kaitlyn Hord face Columbus after playing for the Fury in the inaugural PVF season. Cooper was the PVF Rookie of the Year while Hord finished fourth in hitting percentage.
- A batch of Puerto Ricans come together on the court on Friday night, which also extends to the coaching staffs. Omaha's Natalia Valentín-Anderson and Valeria Vazquez Gomez have played with Columbus' Paula Cerame and Wilma Rivera on the Puerto Rico National Team. Fury middle blocker Janice Leao also heralds from Puerto

Rico, but hasn't competed on the national team

- Plus, Columbus head coach Ángel Pérez coached against most of the Puerto Rican natives in the Puerto Rico League when he was with Changas de Naranjito (2016-2017) and Pinkin de Corozal (2019-2023).
- Valentín-Anderson and Rivera were teammates for the 2021-2022 Puerto Rico League season as part of Valencianas de Juncos where they finished fourth.
- The Supernovas setter also spent a brief time as teammates with Fury outside hitter Megan Courtney-Lush when they were with Leonas de Ponce for the 2015-2016 season.
 The team placed third in the league standings.
- Columbus opposite Morgan Lewis spent four seasons (2019-2022) with Supernovas outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller at Oregon.
- Fury hitter Jill Gillen was originally drafted by the Supernovas at No. 8 overall in the 2023 PVF Draft, but was immediately traded to Orlando where she spent the 2024 season before signing with Columbus.

DIG. KILL. REPEAT

- Supernovas outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller is one of the top two-way players in professional volleyball and that's shown in her kill and dig totals.
- Nuneviller's 22-kill, 17-dig performance was her fourth match with at least 20 kills and 15 digs in a match, which is the most in PVF history. Teammate Reagan Cooper has achieved those marks three times making her tied for second in league history.
- In total, there have been 25 times that a player in the PVF has reached at least 20 kills and 15 digs in a match. Supernovas players have tallied eight of those 25. Aside from Nuneviller and Cooper, former opposite Stephanie Samedy achieved those numbers with a 21-kill, 18-dig match against Grand Rapids on April 26.
- Orlando's Adora Anae, and Indy's Member-Meneh Leketor are tied with Cooper for second with three such performances. Impressively, Leketor has put in those matche statlines in three of the first four matches of the 2025 season.

COOPER'S CHART-TOPPER

- Reagan Cooper stuffed the stat sheet in her last outing against the Columbus Fury, her former team. The second-year pro put up 14 kills on a .393 hitting percentage with nine digs and two aces.
- Cooper is the first player in Omaha franchise history to achieve that statline. The big differentiator being the clip of .393 and two service aces.
- •There have been 26 performances in Supernovas history where a player recorded at least 14 kills and nine digs. Of those, only six featured a hitting percentage of .300 or better, with four also including a single ace. However, just two of those surpassed Reagan Cooper's .393 hitting percentage—but neither included two aces. This unique combination cements Cooper's performance as one of the most special in franchise history.

SUPERNOVAS WELCOME OVER 134,000 FANS IN CHAMPIONSHIP-WINNING INAUGURAL SEASON

The Omaha Supernovas finished out its first professional volleyball season in storybook fashion, becoming the first-ever Pro Volleyball Federation Champions after sweeping the Grand Rapids Rise on Saturday, May 18 at the CHI Health Center in downtown Omaha.

During its championship run in the inaugural PVF season, Omaha and the Supernovas became the league's shining star, hosting 134,969 fans across the 15 matches held at the CHI Health Center. That includes a whopping 9,656 average mark for the 12 Supernovas' home matches, plus the 19,094 spectators who attended the PVF Semifinals and Championship.

The Supernovas erased any doubt that professional volleyball could happen in the United States with their 9,656 match average the No. 1 mark amongst professional volleyball teams in the world.

Omaha broke many of its own attendance records across its historic season, starting with 11,824 fans attending the first-ever PVF match on Jan. 24 between Omaha and the Atlanta Vibe. That mark was broken a few weeks later on Sunday, Feb. 18 as 11,918 fans showed up to watch the Supernovas take on the Orlando Valkyries. The newest and most current attendance record was set on Saturday, March 16 with 12,090 spectators packing into the CHI Health Center to see the Supernovas beat the Valkyries in four sets.

In total, Omaha hosted crowds of 10,000 people or more in seven of the 15 matches hosted at CHI this past season, including five-digit crowds in six of the 12 regular season contests.

The Supernovas took advantage of the partisan crowd, going 9-3 at home during the regular season before winning two-straight at CHI to become the inaugural champions.


