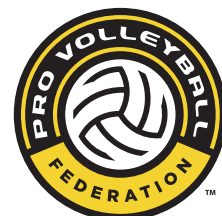

VIBE VS ORLANDO RECAP

The Atlanta Vibe [4-4] lost to the Orlando Valkyries [4-4] in three sets at Gas South Arena on February 6, 2025. Orlando dominated with a .340 hitting percentage as a team. Vibe middle blockers McKenna Vicini and Khorī Louis led the team's hitting efficiency with .300 and .417, respectively. Outside hitter Leah Edmond posted 10 kills and two blocks, while Pia Timmer made her return from injury, contributing an ace and four digs.

OMAHA VS ATLANTA HISTORY

The Atlanta Vibe lost to the Omaha Supernovas in a thrilling five-set match to open the 2025 season, with Omaha clinching the final set 15-13. Atlanta won the first and third sets, while Omaha took the second and fourth. Merritt Beason, making her professional debut, led the Vibe with 17 kills. The match, held at the CHI Health Center in Omaha, set a new attendance record for a women's professional volleyball game in the U.S. with 13,486 fans. Libero Morgan Hentz recorded 31 digs, and the Vibe will continue their road trip against the Vegas Thrill next.

# HEAD COACH KAYLA BANWARTH

As a former Power Five head volleyball coach and a member of the 2016 USA Olympic Team, Banwarth has expansive knowledge of the game. Her impressive career with Team USA spanned six years of international competition, during which she collected eight medals. Notably, she earned a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympics, adding to her legacy in American volleyball history.



Banwarth previously served as head coach at Ole Miss and as an assistant for the powerhouse Nebraska program. After making a shift to coaching in 2017, Banwarth stepped into an assistant role at the University of Nebraska. In her debut season, she helped guide the Huskers to a Big Ten Championship and a NCAA Championship title. In 2020, Banwarth became head coach at Ole Miss turning around the volleyball program from a 1-9 record in the 2020-2021 season to a staggering 21-9 record in 2022. Banwarth heads into her first season as the newly appointed Atlanta Vibe head coach.
