SERIES HISTORY: This is the eighth meeting between Omaha and San Diego, with the Supernovas leading the all-time series 4-3. After dropping the season's first match 3-1, Omaha rebounded with a sweep of the Mojo on Feb. 16 at the CHI Health Center. That win marked the second sweep of the series for the Supernovas. No team has won consecutive wins in the series. Plus, Omaha is aiming for its first road win in San Diego, being 0-2 at Viejas Arena.

SUPERNOVAS-MOJO CONNECTIONS

There are numerous connections between the Supernovas and Mojo as they face off for the for the third of four matches in the 2025 season.

- San Diego middle blocker Leyla Blackwell and assistant coach Noel Carpio both draw connections to Nebraska. Blackwell spent her final season of college volleyball at Nebraska helping the Huskers to the National Semifinals. Carpio spent two seasons (2018-2019) as an assistant on Creighton Volleyball's staff under Kirsten Bernthal Booth.
- ⇒ Libero Shara Venegas has a robust history with Omaha setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson, sharing the court together on the Puerto Rico National Team, including the country's lone appearance at the 2016 Rio Summer Olympics. She also competed against Valentín-Anderson in the Puerto Rico league from 2010-2017 as well as 2021-2023. Venegas has also been teammates with Supernovas rookie Valeria Vazquez Gomez on the national team over the past couple of years.
- ⇒ Kayla Lund was teammates with Vazquez Gomez at Pittsburgh for three seasons (2019-2021) including an NCAA Semifinal Appearance in 2021.
- ⇒ Brooke Nuneviller will reunite with a trio of Mojo players and coaches who spent time together at Oregon. San Diego players Lauren Page (2018) and Ronika Stone (2018-2019) were teammates with Nuneviller while Mojo head coach Tayyiba Haneef-Park was an assistant in Eugene for the 2022 season.
- Mojo middle Rainelle Jones spent the 2024 PVF season with the Columbus Fury alongside current Supernovas Kaitlyn Hord and Reagan Cooper.
- ⇒ Jenaisya Moore and Mac Podraza were part of the same recruiting class at Ohio State, spending four seasons with Buckeyes (2019-2022), reaching two NCAA Regional Semifinals.

2024 PRO VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONS



From preseason favorites to first-ever Champions, the Omaha Supernovas took the pro volleyball world by storm in the Pro Volleyball Federation's inaugural season in 2024. The Supernovas swept the Grand Rapids Rise to claim the PVF Championship at the CHI Health Center in Omaha on May 18. Setter Sydney Hilley was named Postseason MVP after coming off the bench in leading Omaha to a reverse sweep of the San Diego Mojo in the semifinals before the championship sweep.

The championship win capped off a historic year for the Supernovas, who showed the hunger for professional volleyball in the United States, hosting the seven most-attended pro volleyball matches in U.S. history. That includes the U.S. record on March 16, 2024 with 12,090 fans watching Omaha beat the Orlando Valkyries 3-1. The Supernovas drew seven crowds of 10,000 people or more out of its 12 home matches. Omaha finished with the No. 1 average attendance mark in the world among pro volleyball teams with 9,656 fans per match. A total of 134,969 fans attended pro volleyball matches at the CHI Health Center in 2024, which also includes the 19,094 spectators who attended the PVF Semifinals and Championship.

The product on the court was equally as impressive with the Supernovas finishing 18-8 overall and a 9-3 mark at home. Star outside hitters Brooke Nuneviller and Bethania De La Cruz were named to the PVF All-League First Team while De La Cruz took home the PVF Server of the Year award after leading the league with 32 aces during the regular season. Bulgarian middle blocker Hristina Vuchkova missed the first three matches of the season, but arrived in Omaha to lead the league with 70 total blocks by season's end. She was also an All-League selection, being named to the second team.

- Coming off its championship-winning season, the Supernovas were voted third in the PVF Preseason Poll, receiving one of the eight first-place votes. Both the poll and allleague teams were voted by the league head coaches, who weren't allowed to vote for their own team and players.
- · Omaha will have the top outside hitter duo entering the 2025 season with 2024 All-League First Team Selection Brooke Nuneviller and PVF Rookie of the Year Reagan Cooper who were both voted to the Preseason All-League Team.

PEDIGREE OF GREATNESS

- · Aside from winning their own league title, the 2025 Supernovas field a roster full of championship experience and individual stardom dating back to their college days. This season's roster has combined for the following:
- Nine NCAA Volleyball National Championships, Semifinal and Championship Appearances. Middle blocker Kayla Caffey won the 2022 title with Texas in her final year of college at the CHI Health Center, securing the first of back-to-back Longhorn championships. Outside hitter Valeria Vazquez Gomez leads the team in semfinal appearances, helping Pittsburgh reach fourstraight national semifinals from 2021 to
- 12 conference titles. Vazquez Gomez and setter Kendra Wait are tied for the most on the

Supernovas with four. Vazquez Gomez won four ACC titles while Wait helped Creighton to Big East championships in all four of her college seasons.

• 27 AVCA All-American honors spread across 14 Supernovas. Seven of those earning multiple honors including Wait (4), Nuneviller (4), Kaitlyn Hord (4), Mac Podraza (3), Emily Londot (3) and Kelsie Pavne (3).

WELCOME BACK TO THE GOOD LIFE

- · Six Supernovas on the 2025 roster have college connections within the state. Four having played at Nebraska and two at
- · Lindsay Krause, Ally Batenhorst, Kayla Caffey and Kaitlyn Hord were all Huskers under head coach John Cook, but Krause was the only one to play all four seasons at NU [2021-2024].
- Krause and Batenhorst have the longest teammate history as Huskers from 2021 to 2023. Caffey (2021) and Hord (2022) joined that duo as teammates for one year each.
- Wait and libero Allison Whitten each played for Creighton under head coach Kirsten Bernthal Booth. Wait spent all four seasons in Omaha while Whitten joined the Bluejays for her final year in 2022, where she and Wait shared the floor as starters.

CARRYING THE CHAMPIONSHIP TORCH

- Two Supernovas from the inaugural championship-winning team return to Omaha for the 2025 season. That includes outside hitter Nuneviller and setter Natalia Valentín-
- Nuneviller was a pillar on the 2024 team, making her a priority in the free agency period over the summer. The Oregon alum showcased her two-way play en route to PVF All-League First Team honors. She recorded 3.33 kills (8th in PVF) and 3.32 digs (6th) per set, including the previous franchise record for most digs in a single match with 22.
- · Nuneviller was also the first player in franchise history to be named PVF Player of the Week (March 12). Plus, she's currently the all-time franchise leader in kills, kills per set attacks and dias.
- · Valentín-Anderson shared time as a starter in 2024, but quickly established herself as one of the best defensive setters in the league. The Puerto Rico Olympian averaged 8.60 assists and 2.87 digs per set in 21 matches, highlighted by her PVF Player of the Week honor after averaging over 12 assists and four digs per set in two matches. Her defense was put on national display when her incredible two-dig save against the Vegas Thrill on May 6 was featured No. 2 on SportCenter's Top 10 Plays.

ROCK. CHALK JAYHAWK

- Much like its ties to Nebraska, the 2025 Supernovas draw several connections with Kansas.
- Opposite Kelsie Payne, outside hitter Reagan Cooper and middle blocker Tovosi Onabanjo each finished their college careers at KU. Cooper and Onabanjo spent time together as teammates for the 2023 season while Wait heralds from the Sunflower State.

- All three former Jayhawks received All-American honors in Lawrence with Payne leading the way with two first team honors [2016, 2015] and a third team nod [2017].
 Cooper made the third team [2023] in her lone season with KU while Onabanjo was named an honorable mention in 2024 after averaging 2.58 kills and 1.23 blocks per set.
- Omaha head coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn made her name known in the coaching ranks at Kansas from 2011-2017, winning the 2015 AVCA Assistant Coach of the Year after KU made its first-ever National Semifinal in school history.
- Supernovas Team President Diane Mendenhall earned her bachelor's degree from Kansas while being a four-year starter for the Jayhawks.

THE FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

- Omaha will see the pro debut of eight rookies in 2025: MB Phoebe Awoleye, OH Ally Batenhorst, OH Lindsay Krause, OPP Emily Londot, MB Toyosi Onabanjo, OH Valeria Vazquez Gomez, S Kendra Wait and L Allison Whitten
- Kayla Caffey, Reagan Cooper, Kaitlyn Hord, Brooke Nuneviller and Mac Podraza are either entering their second or third season as pros.
- In total, 13 of the 16 players on the Supernovas have three years or fewer of professional seasons under their belt.
- Natalia Valentín-Anderson is the clubhouse leader with 16 years of professional experience followed by Kelsie Payne (6 years) and Camila Gómez (4 years).

HORDING THE NET

- Hord has been one of the best blockers in the league through the first month of the 2025 season.
- The former Husker and Nittany Lion leads the league in both total blocks with 33 and blocks per set with a 0.94 mark.
- Hord's seven blocks in the five-set win over the Atlanta Vibe on opening night set a Supernovas single-match record. She is also one of four players in the PVF to record seven or more blocks in a match this season.
- The Kentucky native also sits fifth in hitting percentage with a .337 clip through 104 attacks with 40 kills and only five errors.

A'NUNE"THER LEVEL

- After averaging over 12 kills and digs per match last season, Supernovas outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller has raised her game for the 2025 season.
- Nuneviller enters Thursday fourth in kills per set (3.78), fifth in the PVF in kills (136), and seventh in total points (148).
- The Chandler, Arizona native is one of only three players in the league this season to record 20+ kills and 15+ digs in a match. That was on opening night against Atlanta when she poured in 22 kills and 17 digs while hitting .340.
- The Oregon product has been averaging 13.6 kills and 13.0 digs per match through 10 contests this season.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK

· Supernovas head coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn

- achieved her 100th career win as a head coach in last Sunday's 3-0 sweep over the San Dieo Moio.
- Kuhn amassed 76 wins as head coach at Texas A6M and has earned 24 with the Supernovas.
- Bird is already the winningest coach in league history with 24 wins and a PVF title.

SUPERNOVAS ALL-STARS

- Three Supernovas were named to the inaugural PVF All-Star Match, which is slated for Saturday, February 22 in Indy. It will be the first-ever volleyball match broadcasted live on CBS. First serve is set for 12:30 p.m. CST.
- Outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller, middle blocker Kaitlyn Hord and libero Camila Gómez were named All-Stars.
- Every team in the PVF is represented on the two 12-person rosters. The two squads will be led by Dave Shondell of Purdue and Georgia Tech's Michelle Collier.
- Hord will be on Team Collier while Nuneviller and Gómez will teamup as part of Team Shondell.

THE DIG PATROL

- The Supernovas have been one of the best defensive teams in the league as they lead the PVF in digs per set [17.08] and sixth in total digs [615].
- That effort is spearheaded by three of the best ball control defenders in the league with libero Camila Gómez, setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson and Nuneviller. All three sit inside the top ten in both total digs and digs per set.
- Gómez leads the trio with a team-high 140 digs (3rd in PVF) and 3.89 per set (2nd). Her 31 digs against Atlanta in the season opener broke a single-match franchise record. That number is also tied for second in most digs during a single match in PVF history.
- Valentín-Anderson is tied for fourth in the league and leads all PVF setters with 130 total digs while being fifth with 3.71 digs per set. She's recorded at least 11 digs in seven of the 10 contests this season including a seasonhigh 21 against San Diego on Jan. 19th.
- Nuneviller, who is a former libero, is tied with Valentín-Anderson with 130 total digs and is seventh in digs per set (3.61). She leads all PVF attackers in total digs while being second in digs per set.

THE COOPER CURVE

- 2024 PVF Rookie of the Year Reagan Cooper has transformed into the best server for the Supernovas. She's recorded a team-leading nine aces (5th in PVF) and 0.28 per set (4th). The second-year pro has already surpassed her rookie year total when she had eight aces in 82 sets last year in Columbus.
- Cooper became the first Supernovas player to put down an ace in three or more consecutive matches since Bethania De La Cruz. De La Cruz accomplished that feat in seven-straight contests en route to the 2024 PVF Server of the Year. Cooper recorded an ace in the first six matches of the 2025 season.
- Cooper is still one of the most dangerous attackers in the PVF, posting 3.69 kills per set, which is fifth in the league, while her 118

total kills is 10th. Her 134 points on the season is also 10th among all players in the league.

- The Kansas graduate has been her best as of late, having hit above .345 in five of the last six matches including a season-best 18 kills on the road vs. Atlanta [2/8] and a season-high .444 clip last time out against San Diego at home on Feb. 16.
- In the last six matches alone, Cooper has averaged 3.79 kills per set on a .335 hitting percentage with four aces across 19 sets.

DIG, KILL, REPEAT

- Supernovas outside hitter Nuneviller is one of the top two-way players in professional volleyball and that's shown in her kill and dig totals.
- Nuneviller's 22-kill, 17-dig performance was her fourth PVF match with at least 20 kills and 15 digs, which is the most in PVF history.
 Teammate Reagan Cooper has achieved those marks three times making her tied for second in achieving that stat line.
- There have been 26 performances where a player in the PVF has reached at least 20 kills and 15 digs in a match. Supernovas players have tallied for eight of those 26. Aside from Nuneviller and Cooper, former opposite Stephanie Samedy produced those numbers with a 21-kill, 18-dig match against Grand Rapids on April 26, 2024.
- Orlando's Adora Anae, and Indy's Member-Meneh Leketor are tied with Cooper for second with three such matches.

CLUTCH KILLER

- Nuneviller produces offense when the Supernovas need it most late in sets. On Feb. 6 at Indy, the Oregon alum recorded seven of her team-high 14 kills when Omaha was at five or fewer points away from winning the set, otherwise known as the red zone.
- In the scenario that either the Supernovas or opposing team has reached the red zone, Nuneviller has scored 50 of her 148 season points. That equals out to 34% of her total point production.

OFFENSIVE BLASTOFF

- The Omaha Supernovas offense has recorded team hitting percentages of .250 or higher in six of the last seven matches after clips of .187 and .131 within the first three matches of the season.
- In fact, Omaha has posted hitting percentages of .250 or above in seven of the 10 matches this season. The Supernovas offense reached that mark only nine times during the entire 2024 season.
- The .309 team hitting percentage in Omaha's sweep over Indy on Feb. 6 marked only the fourth time in franchise history that the Supernovas have topped the .300 mark and the first time in 2025.

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

- The Supernovas have one of the best defenses in the PVF, leading the league in opponent efficiency with a .189 clip 23 points higher than second-place Atlanta [.212].
- Part of that clip comes from the two matches against Columbus when the Fury hit .015 & .036 in back-to-back matches vs. Omaha.

The Omaha Supernovas continue to show the growing interest and passion of pro volleyball, resetting the U.S. Pro Volleyball Attendance Record with 13,486 cheering on the Supernovas for the 2025 season opener at the CHI Health Center.

Omaha broke its own attendance record from a season ago when 12,090 packed into CHI on March 16, 2024, to see the Supernovas beat the Orlando Valkyries 3-1. The franchise has now hosted the top eight most attended Pro Volleyball matches in U.S. history with nine of the top ten taking place in Nebraska. "Resetting the U.S. Pro Volleyball record is another testament to the incredible energy of NovasNation and their unmatched passion for the sport. It's not just about the numbers — it's about the community we've built together and the milestones we will continue to achieve. As we look ahead, we remain committed to raising the bar and delivering a major league volleyball experience that inspires the next generation athletes and fans."

"NovasNation has shown the world that professional volleyball has a bright future," Supernovas Partner Kirk Thompson shared. "Breaking another U.S. Pro Volleyball record underscores the growing hunger for this sport and the impact it's making on a major-league level. We're proud to be at the forefront of this growth, showing what's possible when passion meets opportunity, and we're excited to keep elevating the game for our fans and the sport as a whole."
