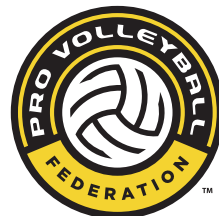

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VIBE VS VALKYRIES RECAP ON 3/1

The Atlanta Vibe (6-8) were defeated by the Orlando Valkyries (10-4) in a thrilling five-set match on March 1, 2025, at Addition Financial Arena. Despite falling behind 0-2 early, the Vibe mounted a strong comeback to level the match at 2-2. Atlanta even held a 4-0 lead in the deciding fifth set but ultimately lost 13-15. The Vibe posted a hitting percentage of .281, just slightly behind Orlando's .282. Merritt Beason, Pia Timmer, and Leah Edmond each contributed significantly offensively with 16, 15, and 15 kills, respectively. Libero Morgan Hentz led the defensive effort with 22 digs, while Atlanta recorded eight blocks, edging Orlando by one.

VEGAS VERSUS ATLANTA STAT COMPARISON

Offensively, the Vibe are ranked third in the league for kill percentage, averaging .367, while the Thrill are fourth in the league with .363. Defensively, the Thrill are eighth in the league for digs, averaging 14.59 digs per set while the Vibe are ranked third with 16.57 digs per set. In aces on the season, the Vibe total 62, ranked second in the league, while the Thrill total 45, ranked sixth in the league. As for assists, Atlanta holds the third highest assists per set with 12.63 and the Thrill are sixth averaging 12.05 assists per set.

ROSTER UPDATES

The Vibe have made some updated roster changes for the upcoming match. Middle blocker Jenna Rosenthal is now placed on the active roster. Setter Whitney Bower has been moved to the practice squad.

COACH'S WITH BIG TEN HISTORY

Kayla Banwarth, Vibe head coach, and Ramón Hernández Cruz, Vegas head coach, are starting their first seasons as head coaches in the Pro Volleyball Federation. Banwarth, leading the Atlanta Vibe, draws on her experience as an Olympic gold medalist and Power 5 collegiate head coach. Hernández Cruz, brings a strong track record from international volleyball. Banwarth competed her collegiate career at the University of Nebraska and became the starting libero in 2007, halfway through her freshman season. Earning All-Big 12 honors and leading the team to NCAA semifinals and three Big 12 titles, she set a school record with 1,706 career digs until 2016. Hernandez competed at Penn State, where he was a three-time All-American and led the team to its first NCAA Championship in 1994. He also earned the tournament's Most Outstanding Player award during the playoffs that season.

HEAD COACH KAYLA BANWARTH

As a former Power Five head volleyball coach and a member of the 2016 USA Olympic Team, Banwarth has expansive knowledge of the game. Her impressive career with Team USA spanned six years of international competition, during which she collected eight medals. Notably, she earned a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympics, adding to her legacy in American volleyball history.



Banwarth previously served as head coach at Ole Miss and as an assistant for the powerhouse Nebraska program. After making a shift to coaching in 2017, Banwarth stepped into an assistant role at the University of Nebraska. In her debut season, she helped guide the Huskers to a Big Ten Championship and a NCAA Championship title. In 2020, Banwarth became head coach at Ole Miss turning around the volleyball program from a 1-9 record in the 2020-2021 season to a staggering 21-9 record in 2022. Banwarth heads into her first season as the newly appointed Atlanta Vibe head coach.
