## Match 29 - PVF Semifinal Omaha Supernovas (21-7) vs. Indy Ignite (13-15)

**SERIES HISTORY:** This is the fifth all-time match between Omaha and Indy and the first meeting in the postseason. The Supernovas took the 2025 season series with a 3-1 record, but it was the Ignite who last tasted victory with a sweep of Omaha at the CHI Health Center on March 22. Prior to that, the Supernovas were 3-0 picking up sweeps on Feb. 6 and March 2 before pulling off the second reverse sweep in franchise history on March 13 at Fishers Event Center.

### SUPERNOVAS-IGNITE CONNECTIONS

There are numerous connections between the Supernovas and Ignite as they face off in the first of two PVF Semifinal matches in Vegas.

- ⇒ A total of six former Jayhawks will be on the floor Friday night in Vegas. The Ignite have a duo who spent time in Lawrence. That includes middle blocker Caroline Crawford and backup setter Anise Havili. Crawford was an All-Big 12 selection in her two seasons (2021, 2020) before transferring to Wisconsin. Havili was teammates with Omaha's Kelsie Payne from 2014-2017 as they were both part of the same recruiting class. Each player developed under Supernovas head coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn, who was the associate head coach at the time. Payne was a two-time AVCA First Team All-American and Havili won back-to-back Big 12 Setter of the Year awards under Bird.
- ⇒ Sydney Hilley faces off against her former franchise after signing with Indy over the offseason. The Wisconsin product was named the 2024 PVF Postseason MVP after leading the Supernovas to the inaugural championship. She came off the bench to help Omaha to a reverse sweep of the San Diego Mojo in the PVF Semifinals before sweeping the Grand Rapids Rise in the championship.
- ⇒ Indy's Member-Meneh Leketor reunites with Pittsburgh teammate Valeria Vazquez Gomez, who's a practice player for the Supernovas. Both were on the same 2021 team that made the NCAA National Semifinal.
- ⇒ Ignite libero Kylie Murr spent her college career at two Big Ten schools in Ohio State and Minnesota. She was teammates with Omaha's Mac Podraza and Emily Londot as part of the Buckeyes from 2020-2022. She spent her last college season with the Golden Gophers where she was with current Supernovas middle blocker Phoebe Awolaye in 2023.

# 2024 PRO VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONS



From preseason favorites to first-ever champions, the Omaha Supernovas took the pro volleyball world by storm in the Pro Volleyball Federation's inaugural season in 2024. The Supernovas swept the Grand Rapids Rise to claim the PVF Championship at the CHI Health Center in Omaha on May 18. Setter Sydney Hilley was named Postseason MVP after coming off the bench in leading Omaha to a reverse sweep of the San Diego Mojo in the semifinals, which was followed by the championship sweep.

The championship win capped off a historic year for the Supernovas, who showed the hunger for professional volleyball in the United States, hosting the seven most-attended pro volleyball matches in U.S. history. That's highlighted by the U.S. record on March 16, 2024 with 12,090 fans watching Omaha beat the Orlando Valkyries 3-1. The Supernovas drew seven crowds of 10,000 people or more out of its 12 home matches and finished with the No. 1 average attendance mark in the world among pro volleyball teams at 9,656 fans per match. A total of 134,969 fans attended pro volleyball matches at the CHI Health Center in 2024, which also includes the 19,094 spectators who attended the PVF Semifinals and Championship.

The product on the court was equally as impressive with the Supernovas finishing 18-8 overall and a 9-3 mark at home. Star outside hitters Brooke Nuneviller and Bethania De La Cruz were named to the PVF All-League First Team while De La Cruz took home the PVF Server of the Year award after leading the league with 32 aces during the regular season. Bulgarian middle blocker Hristina Vuchkova missed the first three matches of the season, but arrived in Omaha to lead the league with 70 total blocks by season's end. She was also an All-League selection, being named to the second team.

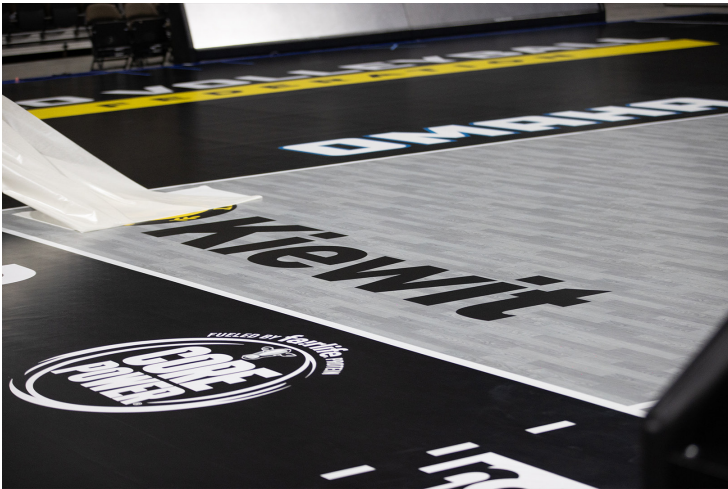

# CHI Health Center Omaha



Built for \$291 million and finished in the fall of 2003, CHI Health Center Omaha is a key element in the continued renovation and development of Omaha’s riverfront. The facility formerly known as Qwest Center Omaha (2003-11) and CenturyLink Center Omaha (2011-18) is located on a 421-acre site of the former Union Pacific Railroad yards, just a few blocks from Creighton’s campus, the historic Old Market and three miles from Eppley Airfield.

In 2018, CHI Health agreed to pay \$23.6 million over 20 years for the naming rights to the arena. Among the amenities at CHI Health Center Omaha are seven locker rooms, five dressing rooms and a media interview room. In the summer of 2023, a lighting upgrade project was completed. A \$6 million Daktronics, Inc., scoreboard hangs from the arena center. The scoreboard is more than 26 feet in height and approximately 32 feet in diameter. The scoreboard was upgraded in the summer of 2013 and is one of the nation’s finest, as CHI Health Center Omaha is one of the nation’s only arenas to have 4 mm and 6 mm pixel configurations to give fans significantly better resolution

Twelve permanent concession stands and 20 free-standing kiosks help feed and quench thirst for crowds of up to 18,300 for volleyball matches.

CHI Health Center Omaha provides more than 194,000 square feet of exhibition space, and the exhibit hall can hold dinners for up to 15,000 people at once. Downtown Omaha’s 40-story First National Bank Tower could be laid down inside the length of the exhibit space.

Funding for CHI Health Center Omaha came from private donations, taxes and projected revenue from the facility. The facility has hosted some of America’s top sporting events, including the NCAA Men’s Basketball Championships (2008, 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2024), NCAA Volleyball Championships (2006, 2008, 2015, 2020 and 2022), U.S. Olympic Team Trials for Swimming (2008, 2012, 2016 and 2021), NCAA Wrestling Finals (2010), the U.S. Figure Skating Championships (2013) as well as four title fights for boxing champion Terence Crawford.

The facility has also hosted concerts by artists such as *The Eagles*, *Justin Timberlake*, *Lady Gaga*, *Katy Perry*, *Taylor Swift*, *ZZ Top*, *Prince*, *Bruce Springsteen*, *Dave Matthews Band*, *Billy Joel*, *The Rolling Stones*, *Paul McCartney*, *Aerosmith*, *Luke Bryan*, *Travis Scott*, *Britney Spears*, *Justin Bieber*, *Alan Jackson*, *U2*, *KISS*, *Jimmy Buffett* and *Garth Brooks*.

More than 1,700 new seats were added to the upper deck on the north side of the building during the summer of 2006, expanding capacity. Located one block northwest of CHI Health Center Omaha is Charles Schwab Field Omaha, which opened in 2011 as the home of Creighton baseball and the NCAA Men’s College World Series.

## PEDIGREE OF GREATNESS

- Aside from winning their own league title, the 2025 Supernovas field a roster full of championship experience and individual stardom dating back to their college days. This season's roster has combined for the following:
  - Nine NCAA Volleyball National Championships, Semifinal and Championship Appearances. Middle blocker Kayla Caffey won the 2022 title with Texas in her final year of college at the CHI Health Center, securing the first of back-to-back Longhorn championships. Outside hitter Valeria Vazquez Gomez leads the team in semifinal appearances, helping Pittsburgh reach four-straight national semifinals from 2021 to 2024.
  - 12 conference titles. Vazquez Gomez and setter Kendra Wait are tied for the most on the

Supernovas with four. Vazquez Gomez won four ACC titles while Wait helped Creighton to Big East championships in all four of her college seasons.

- 27 AVCA All-American honors spread across 14 Supernovas. Seven of those earning multiple honors including Wait [4], Nuneviller [4], Kaitlyn Hord [4], Mac Podraza [3], Emily Londot [3] and Kelsie Payne [3].

## WELCOME BACK TO THE GOOD LIFE

- Six Supernovas on the 2025 roster have college connections within the state. Four having played at Nebraska and two at Creighton.
- Lindsay Krause, Ally Batenhorst, Kayla Caffey and Kaitlyn Hord were all Huskers under head coach John Cook, but Krause was the only one to play all four seasons at NU [2021-2024].
- Krause and Batenhorst have the longest teammate history as Huskers from 2021 to 2023. Caffey [2021] and Hord [2022] joined that duo as teammates for one year each.
- Wait and libero Allison Whitten each played for Creighton under head coach Kirsten Bernthal Booth. Wait spent all four seasons in Omaha while Whitten joined the Bluejays for her final year in 2022, where she and Wait shared the floor as starters.

## CARRYING THE CHAMPIONSHIP TORCH

- Two Supernovas from the inaugural championship-winning team return to Omaha for the 2025 season. That includes outside hitter Nuneviller and setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson.
- Nuneviller was a pillar on the 2024 team, making her a priority in the free agency period over the summer. The Oregon alum showcased her two-way play en route to PVF All-League First Team honors. She recorded 3.33 kills (8th in PVF) and 3.32 digs (6th) per set, including the previous franchise record for most digs in a single match with 22.
- Nuneviller was also the first player in franchise history to be named PVF Player of the Week [March 12]. Plus, she's currently the all-time franchise leader in kills, kills per set attacks and digs.
- Valentín-Anderson shared time as a starter in 2024, but quickly established herself as one of the best defensive setters in the league. The Puerto Rico Olympian averaged 8.60 assists and 2.87 digs per set in 21 matches, highlighted by her PVF Player of the Week honor after averaging over 12 assists and four digs per set in two matches. Her defense was put on national display when her incredible two-dig save against the Vegas Thrill on May 6 was featured No. 2 on SportCenter's Top 10 Plays.

## ROCK, CHALK JAYHAWK

- Much like its ties to Nebraska, the 2025 Supernovas draw several connections with Kansas.
- Opposite Kelsie Payne, outside hitter Reagan Cooper and middle blocker Toyosi Onabanjo each finished their college careers at KU. Cooper and Onabanjo spent time together as teammates for the 2023 season while Wait heralds from the Sunflower State.

- All three former Jayhawks received All-American honors in Lawrence with Payne leading the way with two first team honors [2016, 2015] and a third team nod [2017]. Cooper made the third team [2023] in her lone season with KU while Onabanjo was named an honorable mention in 2024 after averaging 2.58 kills and 1.23 blocks per set.
- Omaha head coach Laura "Bird" Kuhn made her name known in the coaching ranks at Kansas from 2011-2017, winning the 2015 AVCA Assistant Coach of the Year after KU made its first-ever national semifinal in school history.
- Supernovas Team President Diane Mendenhall earned her bachelor's degree from Kansas while being a four-year starter for the Jayhawks.

#### THE FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

- Omaha will see the pro debut of eight rookies in 2025: MB Phoebe Awolaye, OH Ally Batenhorst, OH Lindsay Krause, OPP Emily Londot, MB Toyosi Onabanjo, OH Valeria Vazquez Gomez, S Kendra Wait and L Allison Whitten.
- Kayla Caffey, Reagan Cooper, Kaitlyn Hord, Brooke Nuneviller and Mac Podraza are either entering their second or third season as pros.
- In total, 13 of the 16 players on the Supernovas have three years or fewer of professional seasons under their belt.
- Natalia Valentín-Anderson is the clubhouse leader with 16 years of professional experience followed by Kelsie Payne (6 years) and Camila Gómez (4 years).

#### HORDING THE NET

- Hord has been one of the best middle blockers during the 2025 PVF season.
- The former Husker and Nittany Lion finished second in the league in total blocks [82] and third in blocks per set with a 0.88 mark.
- Hord's seven blocks in the five-set win over the Atlanta Vibe on opening night set a Supernovas single-match record. She is also one of five players in the PVF to record seven or more blocks in a match this season.
- The Kentucky native was also fourth in hitting percentage with a .332 clip through 256 attacks with 102 kills and only 17 errors, which was fewest among middle blockers.

#### A'NUNE"THHER LEVEL

- After averaging over 12 kills and digs per match last season, Nuneviller has raised her game for the 2025 season.
- Nuneviller ended the regular season third in the PVF in kills per set [3.77], fourth in kills [381], and fifth in total points [413].
- The Chandler, Arizona native is one of only five players in the league this season to record 20+ kills and 15+ digs in a match. That was on opening night when she poured in 22 kills and 17 digs while hitting .340.
- The Oregon product produced 17 double-doubles during the season with Omaha going 13-4 in those matches. She also tallied double-digit kills in 23 of the 28 matches including a streak of 15-straight matches.
- Despite the season featuring four additional matches, Nuneviller improved her per-match production across the board by posting better

averages in kills, digs, hitting percentage, assists, blocks, and points compared to her 2024 campaign.

- A cornerstone of the Supernovas franchise, Nuneviller is the team's active career leader in points, kills, digs, and sets played. She now also holds the Supernovas' single season records for kills, kills per set, and total attacks.
- Nuneviller eclipsed the 500-kill mark in her Supernovas career on 3/13 at Indy and now sits with a total of 674 kills in her two seasons with Omaha. With 18 digs on 3/15 versus the Valkyries, she became the first player in PVF history to achieve 500 kills and 500 digs.

#### HARD EARNED HARDWARE

- Brooke Nuneviller and setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson were honored with some league accolades at the end of the regular season.
- Nuneviller was named Best Outside Hitter of the Year, joining Betty De La Cruz as the only other Supernova to win a league positional award. She also made the All-League First Team for the second-straight season.
- Valentín-Anderson was voted to the All-League Second Team making it her first end-of-year PVF honor. The Puerto Rico Olympian finished fourth in the league in assists per set [9.57] and led all setters with 3.11 digs per set.

#### DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

- Combining solid backrow play and a fearsome net presence up front, the Supernovas finished second in the league in opponent efficiency [.208].
- They held opponents to a hitting percentage below .200 in 13 of the 28 matches during the regular season.
- The Supernovas are also one of the best blocking teams in the PVF with a 2.62 blocks per set mark, which is third in the league. Omaha has recorded double-digit blocks in 15 of the 28 contests this season.

#### HOW SWEEP IT IS

- The Supernovas have been the dominant team of the 2025 PVF season, racking up a league-leading 10 sweeps. That number is tied with the 2024 Atlanta Vibe for the most sweeps in a single season.

#### OFFENSIVE BLASTOFF

- The Supernovas offense has taken off to become one of the best units in the PVF, ranking second with a .245 team hitting percentage.
- Omaha has posted hitting percentages of .250 or above in 16 of the 28 matches this season. The 2024 Supernovas offense reached that mark only nine times.
- The Supernovas offense is peaking as the team enters the postseason, hitting .304 in Omaha's four-match winning streak. That's highlighted by clips of .321 and .319 in the last two wins over Grand Rapids and Atlanta.

#### NUNEVILLER MAKES PVF HISTORY

- Nuneviller eclipsed the 500-kill mark in her Supernovas career on 3/13 at Indy and now sits with a total of 687 kills in her two seasons with Omaha. With 18 digs on 3/15 versus the Valkyries, she became the first player in PVF

history to achieve 500 kills and 500 digs.

- Setter Natalia Valentín-Anderson also reached a milestone by recording her 1,000th career assist with the franchise. Her Omaha career total stands at 1,355.

- Hord became the third player in PVF history to reach 100 career blocks with four stuffs against Indy on 3/22. Plus, with three blocks in the win over Columbus on 4/25, Hord surpassed former Supernova Hristina Vuchkova for the most blocks in franchise history with 77.

#### TGI FRIDAY

- The Supernovas have had great success in the past on Fridays, posting a 7-1 all-time record on that day.
- After only playing on Friday once in 2024, Omaha played seven matches on Friday in 2025 amassing a 6-1 record.

#### RECORD BOOK MANIA

- The 2025 Supernovas established plenty of new high marks in the franchise record book. The following franchise bests were achieved during the 2025 regular season.
- Most points in a three-set match by both an individual [Emily Londot, 19] and team [64]. Plus, the most team points during a four-set match [83]. Nuneviller set the franchise record for most points [413] and points per set [4.09] during a single season. That also includes the most team points in a four-set match [83].
- Nuneviller and Reagan Cooper tied for the most kills in a three-set match [16] while team kill records were set in a three-set [55] and five-set [70] match. Nuneviller also achieved the highest number of kills [381] and kills per set mark [3.77] across a single-season.
- Cooper recorded the most attacks during a three-set match [44] on Jan. 12 at Grand Rapids. Plus, Nuneviller put in the most swings in a single season with 1,052.
- Four of the top five individual single-match hitting percentages were set in 2025. The franchise record is held by Cooper [.700] with Batenhorst [.667] and Hord [.600] rounding out the top three.
- Valentín-Anderson dished out 42 assists in the sweep at Grand Rapids on Jan. 12, setting a new franchise record. Omaha's 48 team assists in the sweep at Columbus on Jan. 24 is also a record. She also broke Sydney Hilley's previous single-season mark with 871 assists for a new franchise best.
- Individual dig records were set in three-set [Nuneviller, 19], four-set [Camila Gómez, 24] and five-set [Gómez, 31] matches this season. That also includes the team record in a sweep with 68.
- Nearly all block records were set as well with Hord leading the way. The Kentucky native is now the franchise's all-time career leader in blocks [82] and blocks per set with a 0.88 mark. She set a new single-season record and posted the most blocks in a three-set [8], four-set [6] and five-set [7] match. As a team, the Supernovas achieved the most blocks in a three-set [13] and four-set [14] match as well as the highest number of blocks [267] and blocks per set mark [2.62].
