BY THE NUMBERS

1 Outside hitter Grace Loberg was the first player to score a point in Mojo history, collecting a block on the road against Atlanta on February 1, 2024.

2 Outside hitter Shannon Scully has appeared in both league championship matches, advancing to the final with Grand Rapids in 2024 and winning with Orlando in 2025.

3 Opposite hitter Jovana Brakočević has made three Olympic appearances with Serbia (2008, 2012, 2016).

4 Mojo head coach Alisha Childress has won four NCAA Championships, three at Penn State as a player (2007-09) and one as an assistant coach at Stanford (2019).

7 Middle blocker Taylor Sandbothe has won seven professional championships across four continents.

38 Outside hitter Maya Tabron set a Mojo rookie record with 38 block during the 2025 season.

413 Libero Shara Venegas recorded a franchise-record 413 in 2025, the second-most in league single-season history.

998 Setter Marlie Monserez tallied 998 assists during the 2025 season, the third-most dishes in the league.

2,532 Libero Kate Georgiades collected 2,532 digs during her collegiate career, ranking 22nd all-time in NCAA Division I history.

MATCHUP STORYLINES

- The San Diego Mojo and Omaha Supernovas kick off the 2026 season in Omaha at CHI Health Center, with the overall regular-season series tied 4-4. Omaha holds a slight postseason edge, having toppled San Diego in five sets during the 2024 PVF Championship Semifinals.
- The Mojo have faced challenges on the road in Omaha, holding a 1-3 record at CHI Health Center.
- San Diego dominated the last head-to-head at Viejas Arena in four sets, with four players reaching double digits in kills, three collecting double-doubles, and Omaha held to a season-low .111 hitting percentage – a complete team performance that proved the Mojo can rise to the occasion.

SAN DIEGO MOJO OUTLOOK

- A New Era Begins:** 2026 marks the first season under head coach Alisha Childress, a decorated U.S. Olympian (2016 Rio bronze medalist) and league All-Star. Childress brings her championship mindset and elite experience to the helm, guiding a roster loaded with talent through her inaugural head coaching campaign.
- Returning Stars:** Shara Venegas enters her third season with the Mojo, providing consistent leadership and defensive firepower. Maya Tabron looks to build off a strong rookie season, while standouts Morgan Lewis and Grace Loberg return to San Diego after competing with the inaugural team in 2024 to bring continuity and proven performance. Loberg also has a special place in team history, having scored the first point in franchise history.
- All-Star Impact:** All-Stars Venegas and Marin Grote offer elite-level play in key moments.
- Championship Pedigree:** Multiple NCAA champions – Morgan Perkins (Texas A&M, 2025), Grace Loberg (Wisconsin, 2021), Kayla Caffey (Texas, 2022), McKenna Vicini (Stanford, 2019), Shannon Scully (USC Beach, 2022), bring proven winning experience to the court.
- Homegrown & Global Talent:** California is well-represented with Tabron, Scully, Lewis, Grote, and Allison Jacobs, while players from Texas, Illinois, Missouri, Kentucky, South Carolina, Iowa, Florida, Puerto Rico, and Serbia provide a diverse mix of styles and skill sets.
- Versatility Across Positions:** From dynamic setters and middles to powerful outside hitters and liberos, the roster's balance allows the Mojo to adapt to any opponent and maintain high-level play throughout matches.
- Blend of Experience & Youth:** With Olympic medalists, international champions, and rising

collegiate stars, the Mojo combine leadership and fresh energy in a deep, competitive lineup ready to make a statement this season.

OMAHA SUPERNOVAS OUTLOOK

- Omaha has been voted second in the 2026 MLV Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving first-place votes and once again projected as one of the league's top championship contenders.
- The Supernovas feature multiple elite talents on the Preseason All-League Team, including reigning Outside Hitter of the Year Brooke Nuneviller and Libero of the Year Morgan Hentz, a rare duo of positional award winners returning together.
- Nuneviller, a two-time team captain, returns for her third season in Omaha after earning Outside Hitter of the Year and consecutive All-League First Team honors. She ranks among the league leaders in kills, points and digs and holds Supernovas franchise records in career kills, points, digs and sets played.
- Newly added to Omaha's roster, Morgan Hentz is a back-to-back league Libero of the Year, a dominant defender who has led the league in digs per set and holds the single-season dig record. Her international résumé and consistent floor leadership will be a major boost.
- Omaha returns key contributors from its regular-season championship squad, including outside hitter Reagan Cooper, opposite Emily Londot, and libero Allison Whitten, while adding hometown talent Norah Sis, NCAA All-American, and middle blockers Elise Goetzinger, Janice Leao, and Morgan Stout to deepen the front row.
- With Sydney Hilley returning after leading the league in assists per set and earning Setter of the Year honors, Omaha boasts one of the most experienced and efficient offensive engines in the league.

MOJO-SUPERNOVAS CONNECTIONS

- Cross-Team Players: Kayla Caffey, a key part of Omaha's roster in 2025, now brings her talents to San Diego, while Leyla Blackwell, who made her San Diego debut last season, heads to Omaha for 2026. Fans will see these familiar faces on opposite sides, adding an extra layer of intrigue to the matchup.
- Collegiate Connection: Mojo middle blocker McKenna Vicini and Supernovas libero Morgan Hentz were teammates at Stanford, including during the Cardinals' 2019 NCAA Championship season, giving them shared history heading into this matchup. Mojo head coach Alisha Childress was an assistant coach for the Cardinal championship team.

NATIONAL TEAM FLAVOR

- San Diego's roster features players with extensive national team credentials, bringing international experience and high-level competition to the court:
 - Shara Venegas: A longtime member of the Puerto Rico National Team (2009–present), Venegas has earned multiple NORCECA and Pan American Cup medals.
 - Jovana Brakočević: Represented Serbia's National Team from 2006–2016, capturing numerous international medals and championships.
 - Maya Tabron: Competes for Team Sweden, participating in the 2025 FIVB Women's World Championship and Golden League.
 - Alisha Childress: U.S. Olympic bronze medalist (2016 Rio Games) and decorated setter with experience both as a player and as an assistant coach.

OLYMPIC REPRESENTATION

- Three members of the San Diego Mojo organization bring Olympic experience to the franchise, reflecting the team's global pedigree and elite competitive background.
- Libero Shara Venegas represented Puerto Rico at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, becoming part of the first Puerto Rico women's volleyball team to compete in the Olympics.

- Opposite Jovana Brakočević is a three-time Olympian (2008 Beijing, 2012 London, 2016 Rio) with Serbia, earning silver at the 2016 Rio Olympics, while also serving as Serbia's captain during her international career.

- Mojo head coach Alisha Childress competed for the United States at the 2016 Rio Olympics, winning a bronze medal, and remains one of the most accomplished setters in U.S. volleyball history.

ALL-LEAGUE & STANDOUT SELECTIONS

- Shara Venegas: The 2025 Most Inspirational Player honoree and an All-Star. Holds the Mojo franchise record for digs in a season (413) and ranks second all-time in league single-season digs. Recorded double-digit digs in 24 of 27 matches in 2025, including 18 of the final 19. Career-high 26 digs vs. Indy (May 3, 2025), the most ever by a Mojo player in a four-set match.
- Marin Grote: An All-Star in 2025; ranks among league leaders in blocking efficiency and hitting percentage. Anchored Grand Rapids' front court during consecutive postseason appearances.
- Marlie Monserez: A two-time All-League selection with Atlanta. Ranked third in the league in assists during the 2025 season. Brings elite experience running high-efficiency professional offenses, controlling tempo, and building chemistry with hitters.
- Championship Pedigree on the Bench: Head coach Alisha Childress also played in the 2025 All-Star Match during her final season as a setter.

HOME GROWN & GLOBAL TALENT

- San Diego's roster features a mix of local standouts, U.S. talent from across the country, and world-class international players.
- California dominates the lineup with Maya Tabron (Gilroy), Shannon Scully (Huntington Beach), Morgan Lewis (Carlsbad), Marin Grote (Burbank), and Allison Jacobs (Stevenson Ranch) bringing both hometown pride and professional polish.
- The Midwest and beyond contribute elite athletes like Kayla Caffey (Chicago, Ill.), Grace Loberg (Geneva, Ill.), Taylor Sandbothe (Lee's Summit, Mo.), McKenna Vicini (Lexington, Ky.), and Hayden Kubik (West Des Moines, Iowa).
- Southern talent shines with Karis Watson (Rock Hill, S.C.), Kate Georgiades (College Station, Texas), Morgan Perkins (Rossharon, Texas), and Marlie Monserez (Windermere, Fla.).
- International experience anchors the roster through Shara Venegas (Toa Baja, Puerto Rico), a four-time World Championship participant and Olympian, and Jovana Brakočević (Zrenjanin, Serbia), a three-time Olympian and 2016 silver medalist.

VERSATILITY ACROSS THE COURT

- From middle blockers to outside hitters and defensive specialists, San Diego's roster is packed with multi-dimensional athletes.
- Shannon Scully and Morgan Lewis provide six-rotation adaptability, Morgan Perkins and Allison Jacobs deliver attacking firepower with defensive reliability, and McKenna Vicini, Karis Watson, and Taylor Sandbothe anchor the net with elite blocking and front-row presence.

MOJO HIGH DRAFT IMPACT

- The Mojo roster features four players drafted by San Diego during the first three years of the league: Morgan Lewis, Maya Tabron, Hayden Kubik, Allison Jacobs.
 - Morgan Lewis | Opposite: Pac-12 standout at Oregon and AVCA All-American who was selected in the third round of the 2023 Draft, Lewis appeared in 20 matches during San Diego's inaugural season, recording 127 kills.
 - Maya Tabron | Outside Hitter: A 2024 Draft pick, Tabron set multiple Mojo rookie records in 2025 (blocks, blocks per set, aces per set). Seven double-doubles and international experience with Team Sweden highlight her all-around game.

• Hayden Kubik | Outside Hitter: Selected third overall in the 2025 MLV Draft, Kubik led Tennessee in kills, points, and points per set during her final season. Brings explosive scoring, SEC-tested physicality, and emotional fire to the Mojo lineup.

• Allison Jacobs | Outside Hitter: Drafted 17th overall after standout careers at Michigan and UCLA, Jacobs posted double-digit kills in 25 matches in 2025. Her six-rotation versatility and high volleyball IQ add scoring depth and strategic flexibility.

NCAA CHAMPIONS ON THE ROSTER

- Morgan Perkins played a starring role in Texas A&M's first-ever NCAA women's volleyball title in 2025, leading a veteran Aggie squad to a championship sweep.
- Kayla Caffey was instrumental in Texas' 2022 NCAA national championship, providing pivotal contributions throughout the Longhorns' title campaign.
- Grace Loberg helped Wisconsin capture its inaugural NCAA national championship in 2021, contributing as a key piece of the Badgers' historic run.
- McKenna Vicini was part of Stanford's 2019 NCAA championship team, helping the Cardinal secure one of the program's most celebrated seasons.
- Shannon Scully translated her collegiate success to the sand, playing a key role in USC's 2022 NCAA Beach Volleyball National Championship and adding versatility to the Mojo roster.
- Coach Alisha Childress won an NCAA title as a player at Penn State (2007–09) and has continued her championship impact as a coach, including her role at Stanford in 2019.



- The league is aligned with USA Volleyball and committed to Olympic development, serving as a premier pathway from professional play to the international stage.

EXPANSION AND GROWTH IN MAJOR LEAGUE VOLLEYBALL

- Major League Volleyball's footprint continues to expand, highlighted by Dallas taking the court for the first time this season and the addition of teams in Minnesota, Northern California and Washington, D.C., confirmed for the 2027 campaign.
- With continued strategic growth, the league is slated to feature 11 teams during the 2027 season, further strengthening its national presence.

- Continues the tradition of being one of San Diego's most historic and unique event spaces, blending athletic excellence with cultural and entertainment programming.
- Concessions and catering are provided by Aztec Shops, offering both classic sports fare

and specialty options. The Mezzanine Level includes a VIP Room for banquets, pre- and post-game functions, and interviews, totaling 2,200 square feet of flexible space.

HISTORY & NAMING RIGHTS

- Constructed on the site of the historic Aztec Bowl (1936–1967), which hosted SDSU football and cultural events.



ALISHA CHILDRESS

HEAD COACH

The San Diego Mojo tabbed U.S. Olympic bronze medalist and four-time NCAA champion Alisha Glass Childress as the second head coach in franchise history on August 10, 2025. Childress previously served as an assistant coach at Stanford University and with the U.S. Women's National Team. She also served as a coach during the 2025 season with Athletes Unlimited.

Childress joined the Stanford coaching staff in 2019, spending two seasons on the Cardinal sideline and playing a pivotal role in helping guide the program to victory in the 2019 NCAA National Championship.

Before her time on The Farm, Childress served as an assistant coach with the U.S. National Team during the 2018 Pan American Cup, where the U.S. rallied to win gold over host Dominican Republic.

As a player, Childress is regarded as one of the top setters in the world. During her nine-year professional career, she played in the United States, Italy, Turkey, Poland, Puerto Rico and Brazil. Childress spent the 2024 and 2025 seasons with the Vegas Thrill, collecting All-League accolades in 2024 while also earning Most Inspirational Player honors from the league's coaches, and playing in the league's inaugural All-Star Match in 2025.

Childress directed U.S. National Team offensive attacks for six years, helping lead Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio, where she earned Best Setter honors. She was also selected Best Setter of the 2016 NORCECA Olympic Qualification Tournament, guiding the U.S. to gold and an automatic spot in the Rio Games.

A two-time USA Volleyball Indoor Athlete of the Year (2013, 2014), Childress earned gold medals in three consecutive FIVB World Grand Prix Finals (2010, 2011, 2012).

Childress played collegiately at Penn State from 2006–09 for legendary head coach Russ Rose, leading the Nittany Lions to three straight national titles from 2007–09 and posting a 110–2 record during the three-year run. She was a three-time AVCA All-American, three-time All-Big Ten Conference and three-time NCAA Championship All-Tournament selection, and a nominee for the 2009 Honda Volleyball Award.

A four-year starter for the Nittany Lions, she concluded her Penn State career ranked fourth in program history with 5,800 assists and 12.47 assists per set, 13th in hitting percentage at .336 and blocks with 448 and 15th with 465 sets played.

As a prep player, the Leland, Michigan native was a four-year letterwinner at Leland High, earning Michigan Gatorade Player of the Year and Miss Volleyball for the state of Michigan in 2006 after leading the Comets to the 2006 Class D state championship, producing a single-match record of 48 kills in the title match. She was a four-time first-team all-state, all-region and all-conference selection, concluding her high school career as the National and State High School record holder in season aces (296), career aces (937) and career kills (3,584).

A two-sport star, she earned first-team all-state accolades in basketball her junior and senior seasons. Raised in a coaching family, her mother, Laurie Glass, was her high school volleyball coach, and her grandfather, Larry Glass, was her high school basketball coach.

Childress is married to eight-year NBA basketball veteran and Stanford All-American Josh Childress. They have three daughters, Maya, Mina and Amara.


