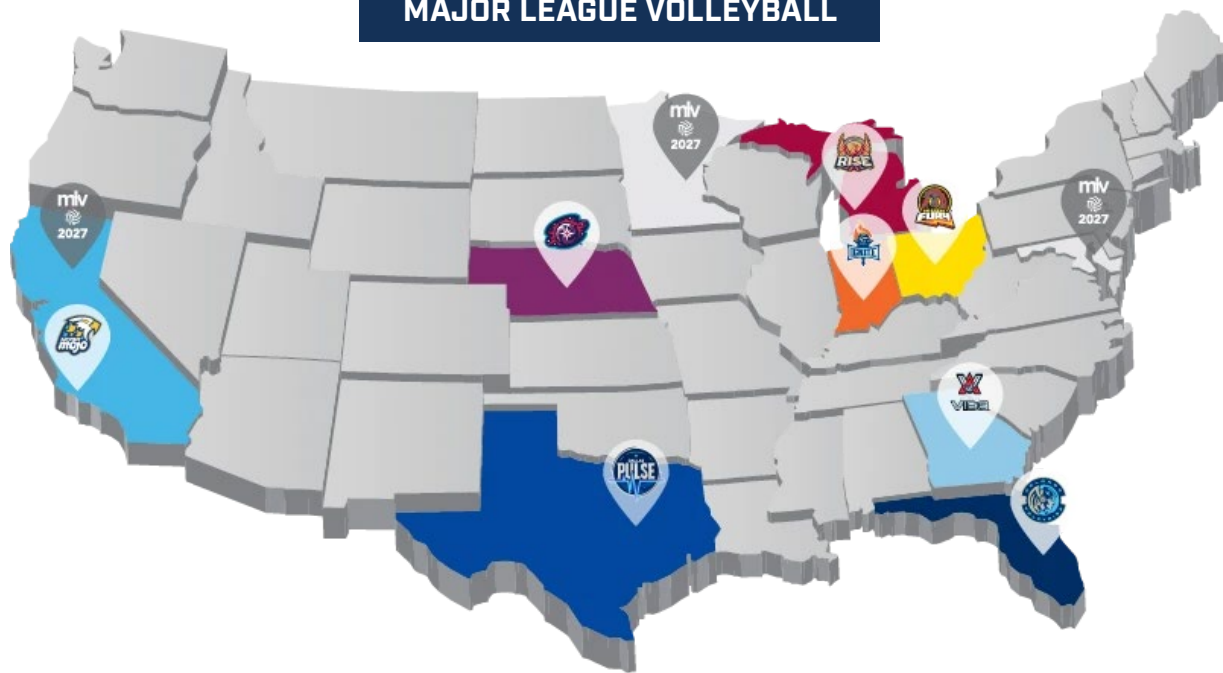

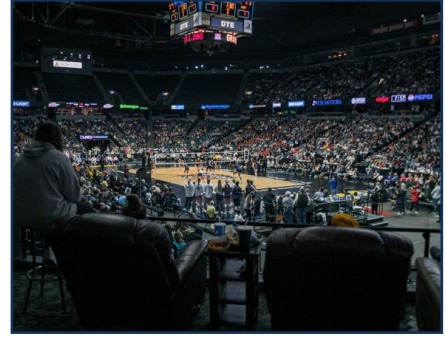

VAN ANDEL ARENA



Van Andel Arena, situated in the vibrant heart of downtown Grand Rapids, Michigan, stands as the region's premier venue for a wide array of entertainment. Since opening its doors on October 8, 1996, this state-of-the-art arena has become a cornerstone of West Michigan's cultural and sports landscape. With a seating capacity of up to 12,000, it has consistently attracted major events and world-renowned performers.

The arena is home to the Grand Rapids Griffins of the American Hockey League [AHL], the Grand Rapids Gold of the NBA G League, and the Grand Rapids Rise of Major League Volleyball. Its diverse programming includes a variety of sports events, family-friendly shows, concerts, and comedy performances. Van Andel Arena has hosted an impressive lineup of events, from NCAA hockey regionals and the AFL Arena Bowl XV to iconic performances by Neil Diamond, Elton John, and Justin Timberlake. The arena is also a regular venue for Disney on Ice, drawing families from across the region.

The names of individuals covering the game must be specified. Freelancers must provide proof of assignment. Credentials will be left at the media/service entrance on the southeast side of Van Andel Arena. Credentials will not be issued to family members, non-working media, or anyone not associated with accredited media organizations. Season credentials will be granted only to media who cover the Rise on a regular basis.

PARKING: Limited reserved parking is available to media in the Louis-Campau parking ramp at 43 Monroe Ave. NW, a few blocks from the arena. To request parking, contact the public relations office a day in advance.

MEDIA ENTRANCE: The media will call table is located at the southeast media/service entrance of Van Andel Arena (off Ionia Street). Media, scouts and broadcasters must use this entrance on game nights and should be prepared to present photo identification if requested. Credentials are available from two hours prior to game time until first serve. After that time, credentials may be picked up at the public will call windows in the main lobby of the arena (Fulton St.).

PRESS BOX: The press box at Van Andel Arena is located on the fourth floor above the upper-level suites on the east side of the building. It can be accessed by taking the elevator at the media entrance to level 3, then turning left and walking up the flight of stairs. All seating is assigned. Complimentary wireless Internet access is available and all notes/match information can be accessed through grrise.com. Some printed copies will also be available.

MEDIA MEAL: Complimentary arena concession vouchers are available to all credentialed media. They may be obtained from the attendant at the media/service entrance from two hours prior to match time until first serve. After that time, please see the Rise PR staff in the press box.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers wishing to cover Rise home matches should follow the aforementioned procedure for media, submitting their emailed request no later than 24 hours prior to match time. Photographers may shoot only from areas designated by the public relations office, and on a space-available basis. Freelance photographers must provide proof of assignment. Fans and others without photo credentials may not use cameras that extend over 80 mm, detachable lenses over 80 mm, or flash.

INTERVIEWS: Requests for all Rise player and coach interviews, pre-match or otherwise, should be made to the Rise public relations office. Post-match interviews will be conducted in an interview room located down the hallway from the team's locker room in the southwest corner of the arena.

PRACTICES: Rise practices are mainly held at MSA Fieldhouse (5435 28th St Ct SE) or Van Andel Arena. They are open to media. Consult the public relations office for exact dates and times and notify them if you plan to attend.

DAN DEVOS
Chief Executive Officer

Dan DeVos is the CEO of West Michigan's first women's major league sports team, the Grand Rapids Rise of the newly formed Major League Volleyball.

The Rise reached the League's inaugural championship match in 2024, despite entering the playoffs as the fourth and final seed. The Rise upset the top-seeded Atlanta Vibe in the semifinals before falling to the No. 2-seeded Omaha Supernovas in the title match in Omaha.

In addition to the Rise, Dan is the co-owner, CEO and governor of the Grand Rapids Griffins, and co-owner of West Michigan Soccer, which will begin play at Amway Stadium in 2027 as a member of MLS NEXT Pro. A Grand Rapids native, Dan has guided the Griffins franchise from its West Michigan debut in 1996, through its Calder Cup championships in 2013 and 2017, and now into its 30th season in 2025-26. Dan also serves as chairman of the Orlando Magic and is a member of the NBA Board of Governors. He leads the Orlando Magic Youth Foundation as the organization's chairman.

DeVos serves as chairman and CEO of DP Fox Ventures LLC, an organization founded in 1993 by Dan and his wife, Pamella. DP Fox is a diversified management company with interests in real estate, fashion, transportation, sports and entertainment. He is also a member of the board of directors at Amway, the world's largest direct selling company.

Dan is involved in many philanthropic efforts through his work with the Daniel and Pamella DeVos Foundation, which supports nonprofit organizations focused on the arts, education and community. He serves on the board of trustees for Hope Network Foundation and Northwood University, his alma mater, in Midland, Michigan. Dan also is a vice chair of the Grand Valley University Foundation.

Dan and Pamella have two daughters and one son, and live in West Michigan.

Gortsema and his wife, Suzanne, have two daughters, Danielle and Madelyn, and one son, Justin.

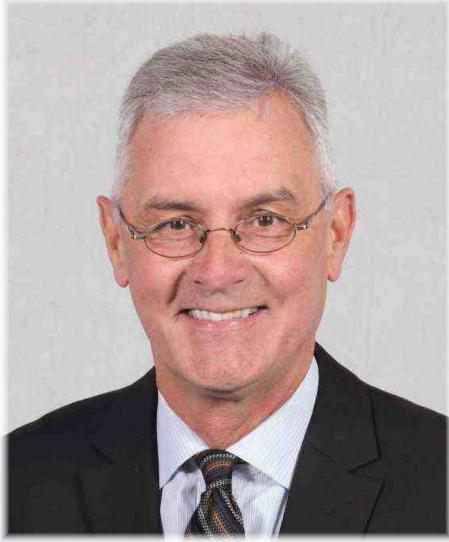
**COLE DEVOS****Director of Strategic Investments**

BIOGRAPHY

The Grand Rapids Rise on March 13, 2023 introduced Cathy George as the team's head coach and director of volleyball operations. Prior to the start of the inaugural 2024 season, George was named VP of Volleyball Operations.

George took the Rise to the Major League Volleyball championship match in her first season at the helm. In the playoff semifinals, the No. 4-seeded Rise upset the top-seeded Atlanta Vibe in five sets. Grand Rapids then lost to the No. 2-seeded Omaha Supernovas in the title match at the CHI Health Center in Omaha, Neb. The Rise finished the 2024 season with a 13-13 record, with a 7-5 record at home inside Van Andel Arena.

The winningest coach in the history of Michigan State University's volleyball program, George led the Spartans for 17 seasons (2005-21) and totaled 35 years as a collegiate head coach, including 11 seasons (1994-2004) at Western Michigan University. Upon her retirement from MSU in January 2022, her

667 career wins (667-457, .593) ranked 15th among active Division I coaches and third in the Big Ten.

At Michigan State, George amassed a 302-233 record (.564) record, qualified for the NCAA tournament 10 times, and reached the NCAA Elite Eight in 2017, when her team's final ranking of No. 8 in the AVCA national poll was the program's highest since the 1996 season. The Spartans made seven consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2011-17 – the second-longest streak in school history – winning at least one game in each tournament and earning the second and third NCAA Sweet 16 berths of George's tenure.

George became the first woman to coach in the NCAA D1 Final Four when she took her University of Texas-Arlington program to the national semifinals in 1989. She has made 15 NCAA tournament appearances, coached 26 AVCA All-Americans, and garnered a slew of coaching honors. George was a three-time Southland Conference Coach of the Year recipient (1989, 1990, 1992), the 2000 Mid-

American Conference Coach of the Year, the 1988 NCAA D2 National Coach of the Year, and a two-time North Central Conference Coach of the Year (1987, 1988).

Prior to her time at MSU, George spent 11 seasons at Western Michigan University from 1994-2004, highlighted by a 2000 campaign in which she earned MAC Coach of the Year honors as the Broncos captured the MAC title and made the NCAA Tournament. WMU made back-to-back MAC Tournament title match appearances in 1999 and 2000, and she concluded her Broncos tenure with a 185-139 mark (0.571).

Throughout her time in the state of Michigan, George's teams have garnered strong fan support. Michigan State ranked in the top 25 in Division I attendance during each of her 17 seasons at the helm (excluding COVID restrictions during spring 2021), while Western Michigan led the MAC in total attendance in eight of her 11 seasons.

George began her D1 coaching career at UT-Arlington in 1989, reaching the Final Four in her first season at the helm and winning three Southland Conference titles (1989, 1990 and 1992) in five years. She finished with an overall ledger of 93-74 (.557), including 37-4 (.902) in conference play.

George got her start as a collegiate head coach at the NCAA D2 level at North Dakota State University, serving from 1987-88. She won the NCAA D2 Coach of the Year award in her second and final season with the Bison after going 43-3 (.935), and she finished her two seasons with an 87-11 (.888) mark.

George began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Central Michigan University in 1986. In addition to her collegiate experience, she enjoyed two stints with USA Volleyball, leading the USA A2 Red team to the USA Adult Open Championship in 2008 and serving as an assistant coach at the 1999 World University Games.

A native of the Chicago suburb of Oak Lawn, Ill., and a 1985 graduate of Illinois State University, George was a four-year letterwinner in volleyball and helped the Redbirds claim three consecutive Missouri Valley Conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances. A team captain and outside attacker, the three-time All-MVC selection was inducted into the Illinois State Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 26, 2019.

George, with her husband Jerry, have two sons, T.J. and Conner, both of whom are MSU graduates.

BIOGRAPHY

Mike Gawlik enters his second season as the associate head coach for the Grand Rapids Rise. Most recently, Gawlik was the head coach for the Central Michigan women's volleyball team for nine season (2016-24). Gawlik is reunited with Cathy George, Rise head coach and VP of volleyball operations, after previously being on her coaching staff at Michigan State for 11 seasons from 2005 to 2015.

Gawlik's best season with Central Michigan came in 2019 when the Chippewas finished 21-9, earning a share of the MAC West title, and advancing to the National Invitational Volleyball Championship. The division crown was CMU's first since 2003. Gawlik was named the MAC Coach of the Year, become the second CMU volleyball coach to achieve such an honor, and first to do so in 11 years.

Through his nine seasons with the Chippewas, there have been 17 All-MAC selections earning four spots on the all-freshman team. There have also been over 50

Academic All-MAC selections have shown the programs dedication to success on the court and in the classroom.

With George at Michigan State, Gawlik helped the Spartans reach nine NCAA Tournament appearances, including three trips to the Sweet 16. Gawlik's primary responsibility at MSU was coaching the defensive specialists, serving as the defensive coordinator, and working with the blockers. He also served as the program's recruiting coordinator, prepared scouting reports as well as comprehensive analysis of MSU players. Gawlik was named an Associate Head Coach at MSU in 2015 after spending nine seasons as an assistant coach and one year as a volunteer coach.

In 2010, Gawlik was named to the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) "Thirty Under 30" list, which annually honors up-and-coming coaches who are under age 30. He was part of an MSU staff that landed top-10 recruiting classes in 2008, 2013 and 2014, and he served as the liaison between the AVCA and Big Ten assistant coaches.

Gawlik has coached at collegiate-level volleyball camps, including Michigan State and Nebraska. He also served as a head coach for the Sports Performance Volleyball Club Summer Camp from 2000-04. He plays a significant role as a member of the MSU summer camp staff, assisting with session planning and budget assessment.

In 2013, Gawlik coached with the USA Senior Women's A2 program in Dallas, which provided him an opportunity to work with some of the top talent in the United States.

Gawlik was a four-year starter at setter and libero at Pacific, graduating in 2005 as the program's record holder in games played (382) and digs (849). He was a two-year captain, an All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation selection, was named a Strength and Conditioning All-American in 2005, and earned the Student of the Year Award in 2005 for sports science majors.

Gawlik earned a master's degree in athletic administration from MSU in 2011. He and his wife Katie have a daughter, Wynn.

The Chippewas went 83-62 (.572) during Gawlik's time on the staff, including a 24-7 record in 2024. It was the first time the program recorded at least 24 wins since 1984.

June 5, 2023: The Rise sign **Camila Gómez**, **Marin Grote**, and **Holly Toliver** to contracts for the first season.

June 7, 2023: Rise sign former AVCA All-Americans **Symone Abbott** and **Kayla Caffey**.

June 9, 2023: The Rise ink former Big Ten Conference standouts **Erika Pritchard** and **MacKenzi Welsh-Vazquez**.

June 20, 2023: The Rise sign former USC Trojan **Shannon Scully** and current Team USA member **Ashley Evans**.

July 27, 2023: The Rise announce the hiring of **Bill Walton** as associate head coach.

Aug. 28, 2023: The Grand Rapids Rise sign two-time NCAA national champion **Nia Grant**.

Dec. 29, 2023: **Fingall, Bolding, Sauer, and Basham** are signed to the roster, along with free agent setter **Mac Podraza**.

Jan. 15, 2024: After holding preseason training camp for two weeks, the Rise waive **Toliver** and **Basham** to trim the roster down to 17 players.

Jan. 18, 2024: The Rise waive setter **Bruns**.

Jan. 23, 2024: The Rise assign practice player spots to **Bolding** and **Sauer** to finalize the 14-player active roster.

Jan. 25, 2024: In front of sellout crowd of 7,805 spectators inside Van Andel Arena, the Rise (1-0) sweep the Columbus Fury 3-0 (25-17, 25-23, 25-19) to win the franchise's inaugural season opener. Rise mascot **Ember**, a phoenix inspired by the team's logo, is unveiled for the first time.

Feb. 9, 2024: The Rise improve to 2-0 with a 3-1 road win over the previously unbeaten Atlanta Vibe. **Abbott** (16), **Dimitrova** (13), and **Chaussee** (12) each finished with double-digit kills.

Feb. 12, 2024: The Rise (2-1) suffer their first loss of the season in a four-set marathon home match that lasted two hours and 43 minutes. The Omaha Supernovas eventually came out of top by set scores of 21-25, 33-31, 30-28, 25-21.

Feb. 13, 2024: The Vegas Thrill claim Rise practice player **Sauer** to their active roster.



Feb. 18, 2024: Grand Rapids (3-1) stuns Atlanta again with a 3-2 home victory by set scores of 25-19, 25-18, 23-25, 23-25, 15-11. **Dimitrova** had a season-high 26 kills and 22 digs, plus two blocks and an ace. **Grote** registered a season-high seven blocks.

Feb. 20, 2024: Opposite hitter **Dimitrova** is named the Week 4 Player of the Week after a standout 29-point, 22-dig performance Feb. 18 against the Vibe. In the fifth set, the Rise scored 11 out of their 15 points off kills with **Dimitrova** knocking down seven of them on just eight swings (.875).

Feb. 23, 2024: The Rise couldn't spoil the San Diego Mojo's home opener, as the last-place Mojo (1-4) pulled off a 3-1 upset over the league-leading Rise (3-2) to win their first match in franchise history by set scores of 36-34, 25-27, 25-23, 25-23. The 70 combined

points scored in the opening frame was the most points scored in a single set during the entire 2024 PVF season. Rise libero **Sponcil** had a season-high 26 digs in the match.

March 1, 2024: Despite **Dimitrova** recording a season-high 30 points (26 kills, two aces, two blocks), the Orlando Valkyries prevail in a pair of close sets to win at home, 3-1, by scores of 25-20, 21-25, 32-30, 27-25. The Rise (3-3) bolstered a season-high .298 hitting percentage in the defeat.

March 4, 2024: The Rise (3-4) wrap up a three-match road stretch with a third straight loss to dip below the .500 mark for the first time in franchise history. The Mojo grinded out a five-set win by set scores of 16-25, 25-19, 25-17, 22-25, 15-9.

March 9, 2024: Grand Rapids (4-4) returns to the win column by ending the Fury's run of four straight wins, securing the victory by set scores of 25-15, 13-25, 25-17, 25-23. The Rise asserted their dominance from the start with six blocks in the opening frame. Four Rise players finished with four or more blocks: **Grote** (4), **Evans** (4), **Dimitrova** (3), and **Jensen** (3).

March 17, 2024: On St. Patrick's Day, the Rise (4-5) suffer the League's first reserve-sweep. The Vegas Thrill dropped the first two sets but stormed back to win in five by set scores of 21-25, 21-25, 25-21, 25-16, 15-12. Vegas prevailed in the first meeting between the two PVF franchises despite **Chaussee** notching a season-high 24 kills (.315).

March 20, 2024: The Rise (5-5) continue their winning ways over their regional rival Columbus Fury with a 3-1 road victory. The Rise had lost their previous three away matches but snapped that winless streak by improving to 3-0 against the Fury this season. The Rise won by set scores of 25-20, 25-18, 19-25, 32-30. For the first time this season, Grand Rapids won a set that reached the 30s. The Rise had previously lost the following marathon sets: 36-34 at San Diego (Feb. 23), 33-31 against Omaha (Feb. 12), 32-30 at Orlando (March 1), and 30-28 against Omaha (Feb. 12).

March 26, 2024: Grand Rapids (6-5) dishes out some payback by defeating the Vegas Thrill, 3-1, by set scores of 25-22, 24-26, 25-17, 30-28. Nine days earlier, the Thrill completed a reverse-sweep of the Rise.

March 28, 2024: Seeking a third consecutive road win, the Rise (6-6) came up short in a grueling four-set match against the Omaha Supernovas. Omaha won its three sets by a combined seven points, winning by set scores of 27-25, 20-25, 30-28, 25-22. The Rise, wearing their red jerseys for the first time, tied their season-high mark with six team aces.

April 1, 2024: Grand Rapids (6-7) is denied in their bid to secure a third win over the league-leading Atlanta Vibe this season by suffering a 3-1 loss at Van Andel Arena by set scores of 25-23, 25-10, 18-25, 25-23. **Pritchard** made her first start after recovering from an ACL injury.

April 6, 2024: In the first CBS Sports Network broadcast of , the Rise (6-8) dropped a five-set marathon match to the Orlando Valkyries by set scores of 25-18, 21-25, 25-21, 19-25, 15-9. Grand Rapids dropped three matches in a row for a second time this year. The attendance inside Van Andel Arena was 5,250. It's the second-largest home crowd for the Rise this season, only behind the sellout season opener (7,805) against the Columbus Fury on Jan. 25.

April 11, 2024: The Rise (7-8) earn redemption in the rematch over the Orlando Valkyries by set scores of 25-23, 25-21, 25-22. The first Rise sweep since the season-opening 3-0 triumph over the Columbus Fury helped Grand Rapids end a three-match losing skid and secure its first victory over Orlando this season. Libero **Gómez** made her first start and recorded 13 digs and two assists.

April 13, 2024: Grand Rapids (8-8) prevented the Vegas Thrill from completing another reserve sweep in their home venue, winning by set scores of 25-23, 25-21, 20-25, 22-25, 15-9. In the pivotal fifth set, the Rise strung together seven straight points — a new season high — to put the match out of reach and defeat Vegas for a second time this season. The Rise waived middle blocker and former Rise practice squad player **Bolding** before the match.

April 15, 2024: The Rise sign middle blocker **Molly Lohman**, who had played for six professional organizations in six countries over the last six years. The Mankato, Minnesota, native was an AVCA All-American honorable mention at the University of Minnesota in 2016. Grand Rapids waived middle blocker **Grant** to open a spot on the 14-player active roster for **Lohman**.

April 16, 2024: The league-leading Atlanta Vibe even the season series against the Rise

(8-9) with a four-set home victory by set scores of 23-25, 25-22, 25-22, 25-15. **Lohman** made her Rise debut, notching one kill and a block.

April 18, 2024: Behind a stout defense, the Rise (9-9) upended the Orlando Valkyries, 3-1, by set scores of 25-14, 17-25, 25-20, 25-13. The 12-point margin of victory in the fourth set was a season-high. Grand Rapids picked up 78 digs for the team's second-most in a four-set match this season.

April 20, 2024: Facing both travel fatigue and an untimely injury to one of their star players, the Rise (10-9) push through adversity to defeat the Vegas Thrill by set scores of 25-23, 25-20, 23-25, 25-22. Grand Rapids wrapped up a grueling 6,575-mile multi-stop journey over a week and a half by winning the fourth set against the Thrill without **Dimitrova**. The 17-year veteran missed her first set of the season after injuring her ankle trying to close out on a block late in the third set. **Fingall** stepped up in **Dimitrova's** absence with 11 kills and no attack errors on 15 swings (.733).

April 26, 2024: Mere hours after multiple destructive tornados ripped through Omaha, Nebraska, and across the Great Plains, the Rise [10-10] had to weather a second storm against the Omaha Supernovas inside the notoriously loud CHI Health Center. Omaha prevailed in an intense five-set affair by set scores of 25-22, 23-25, 25-20, 16-25, 15-7. **Fingall** started her first professional match in **Dimitrova's** absence. Setter **Podraza** set a professional new personal best with 33 assists.

April 28, 2024: The Rise [10-11] enter their final regular-season away match with aspirations of securing a fourth consecutive victory against their regional rival. The Columbus Fury, however, thwarted the potential sweep of the season series with a sweep of their own inside Nationwide Arena by set scores of 25-21, 25-15, 25-15. Columbus hit .409 — most by an opponent against Grand Rapids this season — and held the Rise to a season-low .130 attack percentage.



May 4, 2024: Self-inflicted wounds and being turned back at the net resulted in the downfall of the Rise [10-12] against the San Diego Mojo on Star Wars Night. The Rise suffered their third straight loss and remained winless against the Mojo on the season, falling 3-1 inside Van Andel Arena by set scores of 22-25, 25-18, 27-25, 25-15. **Dimitrova** returned to the starting rotation.

May 5, 2024: With a guaranteed spot in the playoffs awaiting the winner, the Rise [11-12] overcame the San Diego Mojo for the first time this season. Grand Rapids prevented San Diego from completing a four-match season series sweep with a 3-0 home victory by set scores of 25-23, 25-18, 25-16. All seven Rise players who started ended up playing the whole match. It's the first time the Rise rotation went untouched during a match.

May 12, 2024: The Rise [12-12], utilizing all 14 players on their roster for the first time this season, prevailed in a five-set showdown over the Supernovas by set scores of 25-16, 23-25, 23-25, 26-24, 15-10. Although the Mother's Day affair on the CBS Sports Network lacked the pressure of determining playoff positions, as both teams were already locked into their respective seeds, the match still offered bragging rights and the psychological advantage of maintaining a win streak heading into the postseason. **Dimitrova**, who was recognized with a retirement ceremony before the match, ended up with nine kills and five digs in her last performance inside Van Andel Arena.

May 14, 2024: announces its yearly awards. **Dimitrova** and **Chaussee** both make the All-League First Team, while **Dimitrova** is named the League's Best Opposite Hitter of the Year.

May 15, 2024: The No. 4-seeded Rise [13-12] upset the top-seeded Atlanta Vibe in the semifinals inside the CHI Health Center

in Omaha. Grand Rapids won the first, third, and fifth sets to prevail by set scores of 25-20, 19-25, 25-20, 23-25, 15-8. Setter **Evans** tied her season high with 54 assists to lead a potent Grand Rapids attack that put down 71 kills [.243]. Four Rise attackers finished with double-digit kills led by outside hitter **Chaussee** [22, .226], who set a team record with 62 attack attempts.

May 18, 2024: In the inaugural championship match, the upset-minded Rise [13-13] are swept by the No. 2-seeded Supernovas by set scores of 25-13, 26-24, 25-22. Playing on their home court and in front of a favorable crowd, Omaha lifted the championship trophy, celebrated in the confetti, and collected the \$1 million match-winning bonus.

June 30, 2024: PVF free agency signing period for returning players begins. All players from 2024 PVF season have become free agents, who can sign with any team for 2025.

July 1, 2024: The Rise announce their first signing for the upcoming 2025 season by adding outside hitter **Carli Snyder**, a native of Macomb, Michigan. Snyder returns to Michigan after six seasons in France.

July 2, 2024: The Rise sign 6-foot-5 opposite hitter **Sherridan Atkinson**.

July 8, 2024: Four former Rise players re-sign for the 2025 season: middle blockers **Marin Grote** and **Alyssa Jensen**, and outside hitters **Erika Pritchard** and **Symone Abbott**.

July 9, 2024: Rise sign former San Diego Mojo setter **August Raskie**, who tallied 145 assists, 51 digs, 13 kills, four blocks, and three aces in 20 matches played during the 2024 season.

July 11, 2024: The Rise sign a second player from San Diego, inking Michigan native **Ali Bastianelli**. She was the League's best blocker in 2024 by averaging 1.02 blocks per set.

July 12, 2024: League Champion with the Omaha Supernovas and Michigan native **Paige Briggs-Romine** signs with the Rise.

July 16, 2024: The Rise sign first-year libero **Jena Otec**. The two-time AVCA All-American at Purdue also served as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Western Kentucky women's volleyball team [2023-24].

July 18, 2024: The Rise secure seasoned libero **Valeria León**. The 5-foot-6 defensive specialist from Ponce, Puerto Rico, was a key contributor for the Columbus Fury in 2024.

July 31, 2024: Grand Rapids makes their 12th offseason player signing by retaining former Michigan setter **MacKenzi Vazquez**.



(nee Welsh). One of the first signings the Rise made for the inaugural 2024 season, **Vazquez** later decided to medically retire and became the team's director of volleyball operations. She now signed to return to the court as a player.

Oct. 31, 2024: The Rise reveal their schedule for the 2025 season. The second season features 28 regular-season matches, four more than 2024, due to the addition of an eighth PVF franchise, the Indy Ignite.

Nov. 24, 2024: **Mike Gawlik, Katie Gawlik,** and **Jason Oliver** are announced to the Rise coaching staff for the 2025 season. Mike joins as the associate head coach, Katie as an assistant coach, and Oliver as the assistant head coach. Mike was the head coach at Central Michigan for nine seasons (2016-24) with his wife Katie as a volunteer assistant coach for five seasons. Oliver was the head coach at Toledo for seven seasons (2018-24).

Nov. 25, 2024: The Rise make five selections in the 2024 PVF Draft: **Raven Colvin** (First Round, Selection 7), **Naya Shime** (Second

Round, Selection 13), **Camryn Turner** (Third Round, Selection 22), **Elena Oglivie** (Fourth Round, Selection 29) and **Jess Mruzik** (Fifth Round, Selection 40).

Nov. 26, 2024: The hiring of former Michigan Tech volleyball head coach **Matt Jennings** to the Rise coaching staff is announced. Jennings takes over from **Vazquez** as the team's director of volleyball operations, as well as being an assistant coach.

Dec. 2, 2024: The Rise start preseason training camp for the 2025 season.

Dec. 10, 2024: After coming to preseason training camp on a try-out, opposite hitter **Kaleigh Nelson** signed with the Rise to revitalize her professional career after last playing in 2017-18 with Engelholm VS (Sweden).

Jan. 7, 2025: The Rise finalize their roster ahead of the season opener by waiving **Vazquez** and placing **León** and **Nelson** on the team's practice squad. Four 2024 draftees make the 14-player active roster: **Colvin, Shime, Turner,** and **Oglivie.**

Jan. 10, 2025: The Rise (0-1) opened their second season with a heartbreaker on the road, falling in five sets to the Vegas Thrill despite taking the first two. Grand Rapids couldn't fend off a reverse sweep at the Dollar Loan Center, dropping the season opener by set scores of 25-21, 25-19, 20-25, 21-25, 10-15. The Rise hit .320 through the first two sets but cooled off down the stretch as Vegas surged with a 19-kill performance in the fourth and never trailed in the fifth.

Jan. 12, 2025: In a rematch of the 2024 championship, the Rise (0-2) suffered a straight-set defeat to the Omaha Supernovas at Van Andel Arena by set scores of 25-21, 25-23, 25-22. Despite a record home crowd

of 8,706, Grand Rapids was outperformed in key statistics, including kills [55-39], assists [47-38], digs [68-59], and hitting percentage [.253 to .233]. Notable performances came from **Atkinson** and **Pritchard**, each recording 12 kills, while rookie setter Turner contributed 24 assists in her second professional match.

Jan. 16, 2025: The Rise [0-3] dropped their third consecutive loss, falling in straight sets to the Indy Ignite in their inaugural meeting at the Fishers Event Center. Despite a strong start with a 3-0 lead in the first set, Grand Rapids couldn't maintain momentum, losing 25-18, 28-26, 25-16. The Rise's offense showed improvement, hitting a season-best .284, but service errors and a lack of aces hindered their performance. **Shime** led the team with 12 kills in her first professional start, while **Raskie** recorded a double-double with 34 assists and 11 digs.

Jan. 19, 2025: The Rise [1-3] secured their first win of the season with a straight-set sweep over the Atlanta Vibe at Gas South Arena, posting set scores of 25-23, 25-23, 25-21. Grand Rapids capitalized on Atlanta's errors and showcased improved passing, notably from rookie libero **Oglivie** in her first professional start. **Raskie** achieved her third double-double of the season with 33 assists and 10 digs. Outside hitters **Pritchard** and **Snyder** each contributed 10 kills, while **Shime** added seven kills and 10 digs in her second career start.

Jan. 26, 2025: The Rise [2-3] achieved their first-ever reverse sweep, rallying from a 0-2 deficit to defeat the Columbus Fury 3-2 at Nationwide Arena. After dropping the first two sets 19-25 and 18-25, Grand Rapids surged back to claim the next three sets 25-19, 25-14, and 15-12. **Snyder** led the offense with a season-high 22 points, including 17 kills, while

Shime contributed 14 points with 10 kills and four blocks. **Raskie** was instrumental, recording 45 assists, 10 digs, and a season-high seven kills, narrowly missing the franchise's first triple-double. The Rise's defense tightened in the latter sets, limiting Columbus to a .143 hitting percentage and registering a season-high 63 digs.

Jan. 28, 2025: Rise outside hitter **Snyder** earned her first Player of the Week honor after leading the team's comeback win over Columbus. She scored 22 points with 17 kills [.429 attack], seven digs, three aces, and two blocks, helping the Rise rally from 0-2 to win 3-2.

Jan. 29, 2025: The Rise made four roster moves ahead of their upcoming match against the Orlando Valkyries. Opposite hitter **Nelson** and libero **León** were promoted from the practice squad to the active roster. Libero **Otec** was moved to the practice squad after contributing 31 digs in 12 sets during her first professional season. Opposite hitter **Atkinson** was waived after appearing in three matches, totaling 32 kills, four blocks, and two aces.

Jan. 30, 2025: The Rise [3-3] secured their third consecutive victory in a thrilling five-set match against the Orlando Valkyries at Van Andel Arena by set scores of 24-26, 25-15, 17-25, 25-18, 15-12. Grand Rapids set a new franchise record with 18 blocks and amassed 84 digs, just two shy of their all-time mark. **Pritchard** led the offense with a career-best 27 points, including 21 kills and five blocks, while **Raskie** recorded a season-high 51 assists and matched the franchise's single-match record with 26 digs. **Snyder** had three aces for the second consecutive match. The Rise's dominant defensive performance limited Orlando to a .199 hitting percentage, propelling them to their first three-match regular-season winning streak in team history.

Feb. 2, 2025: The Rise [4-3] achieved a franchise-best fourth consecutive victory with a straight-set sweep over the San Diego Mojo, winning by set scores of 25-19, 25-22, 25-22. This marked Grand Rapids' first home sweep of the season and propelled them above the .500 mark for the first time in 2025. Middle blocker **Bastianelli** tied the team record with seven blocks. **Shime** recorded her first professional double-double with 14 kills on a .333 hitting percentage and 11 digs.

Feb. 4, 2025: Rise outside hitter **Pritchard** earned her first PVF Player of the Week after scoring 41 points in two wins, including 27 points with five blocks in a five-set victory over Orlando. Her play helped extend the Rise's franchise-best four-match winning streak.



Feb. 7, 2025: The Rise [4-4] saw their franchise record four-match winning streak snapped in a marathon five-set loss to the Columbus Fury at Nationwide Arena. Columbus secured their first win of the season by set scores of 21-25, 25-21, 26-24, 22-25, 15-8, in what became the longest match in Rise history at 2 hours and 49 minutes. Despite a standout performance from **Snyder**, who tallied 20 kills on .383 hitting, 20 digs, two blocks, and her team-leading 10th ace, the Rise were limited to a season-low .190 attack percentage. **Nelson** made her professional debut, stepping in for the injured **Shime**, and immediately contributed with a kill to open the match.

Feb. 11, 2025: Rise players **Grote**, **Raskie**, and **Snyder** are selected to participate in the inaugural All-Star Match on Feb. 22 at the Fishers Event Center in Indianapolis. **Grote** and **Raskie** will compete for Team Collier, while **Snyder** will represent Team Shondell. The teams are coached by volleyball legends Dave Shondell and Michelle Collier, respectively.

Feb. 13, 2025: The Rise [4-5] dropped their second straight match, falling 3-1 to the Atlanta Vibe by set scores of 25-21, 18-25, 22-25, 19-25. Grand Rapids started strong, hitting .393 in the opening set with 11 kills on 28 error-free swings and outblocking Atlanta, 6-0. **Pritchard** led the offense with 15 kills on a .382 hitting percentage, adding one block and an ace. **Raskie** extended her double-double streak to seven matches, recording 33 assists and 10 digs.

Feb. 15, 2025: The Rise [4-6] suffered their third consecutive loss, falling in straight sets to the Orlando Valkyries at Addition Financial Arena by set scores of 25-18, 25-23, 26-24. Despite a team-high 11 kills from **Pritchard** and a ninth double-double of the season from **Raskie** (31 assists, 13 digs), Grand Rapids couldn't overcome Orlando's balanced attack.

The Valkyries outperformed the Rise in hitting percentage (.207 to .161), aces (3-1), and blocks (11-9).

Feb. 20, 2025: The Rise (4-7) fought hard but fell in a thrilling five-set battle against the Columbus Fury. After scoring the first nine points of the match, highlighted by three aces from **Snyder**, Grand Rapids ultimately lost by set scores of 16-25, 27-25, 22-25, 25-22, 13-15. **Colvin** made her first professional start and racked up 15 points, while **Pritchard** matched her season-high 21 kills.

Feb. 22, 2025: The inaugural All-Star Match took place at the Fishers Event Center in Indianapolis, featuring three Grand Rapids Rise players: **Snyder**, **Grote**, and **Raskie**. **Snyder**, representing Team Shondell, emerged victorious as her team swept Team Collier by set scores of 25-22, 25-20, 15-10. **Snyder** contributed five points, including a match-high nine digs and one of the two aces in the match. **Raskie**, playing for Team Collier, recorded four points, two blocks, two digs, and seven assists, while **Grote** added three points and one block. The match was the first televised PVF event on CBS.

Feb. 28, 2025: The Rise (4-8) fell to the San Diego Mojo in four sets at Viejas Arena by set scores of 25-11, 18-25, 25-23, 25-21. San Diego snapped a six-match losing streak, while the Rise extended their own to five. **Snyder** contributed her 15th ace of the season, while **Briggs-Romine** led the Rise with 14 points, including 12 kills.

March 2, 2025: The Rise (5-8) snapped a five-match losing streak with a dominant 3-0 road sweep over the Vegas Thrill at Lee's Family Forum. The Rise set a new record with 18 blocks in a three-set match, tying their franchise record. The set scores were 25-18,



25-17, 25-23. **Pritchard**, filling in as the team's opposite hitter, led all scorers with 16 points, including 14 kills and two blocks. **Bastianelli** contributed six blocks, while **Oglivie** recorded a match-high 17 digs. The Rise held the Thrill to a .085 hitting percentage, the lowest allowed by Grand Rapids this season. The match lasted just 88 minutes, marking the fastest victory in Rise history.

March 5, 2025: The Rise (6-8) secured their second consecutive sweep, defeating the San Diego Mojo 25-20, 26-24, 25-20 at Van Andel Arena. This victory marked the first time in franchise history the Rise have won back-to-back straight-set matches. **Snyder** led the team with 13 kills and five digs, while **Raskie** contributed 13 assists, eight digs, and three blocks. **Briggs-Romine** added a double-double with 10 kills and a team-high 15 digs.

March 9, 2025: The Rise (7-8) picked up their first-ever road victory over the San Diego Mojo with a 3-1 win at Viejas Arena by set scores 25-17, 28-30, 25-15, 25-18. The Rise tied their franchise record with 18 blocks. Opposite hitter **Shime**, returning from injury, contributed 12 kills and 8 digs. **Bastianelli** added 11 kills on

16 attempts (.688 hitting percentage) and five blocks. **Jensen** posted six blocks and six kills, marking her third consecutive match with at least five blocks.

March 13, 2025: The Rise [7-9] were defeated by the Atlanta Vibe in a four-set match at Van Andel Arena by set scores of 25-23, 25-27, 25-16, 25-22. The match featured a combined 179 digs, with the Vibe recording 94 and the Rise 85, just one shy of their team record for a four-set match. **Grote** reached her 200th career kill for the Rise during the match.

March 15, 2025: The Rise [7-10] fell in four sets to the Indy Ignite by set scores of 25-22, 20-25, 19-25, 22-25. **Snyder** posted 18 kills and 11 digs for her fifth double-double of the season and set a new franchise single-season ace record with her 18th. **Briggs-Romine** added nine kills, reaching the 100-kill mark on the season, while the Rise totaled 15 team blocks in the loss.

March 20, 2025: The Rise [7-11] dropped a tightly contested four-set match to the Vegas Thrill by set scores of 31-29, 25-27, 22-25, 25-27. Grand Rapids mounted a remarkable comeback in the opening set, erasing a 24-

19 deficit and fending off 10 set points before **Raskie** secured the set with a decisive block. Despite hitting a franchise-tying .298 and outblocking Vegas 15-4, the Rise couldn't maintain momentum, dropping the next three sets.

March 27, 2025: The Rise added rookie opposite hitter **Devyn Robinson** off waivers from the San Diego Mojo. A first-round pick in the 2024 PVF Draft, Robinson played briefly for San Diego this season and was a standout at Wisconsin.

March 28, 2025: The Rise [8-11] snapped a three-match skid with a thrilling five-set victory over the Columbus Fury by set scores of 22-25, 25-23, 25-22, 22-25, 15-13. The nearly three-hour match set multiple franchise records, including longest duration [2:54] and most team aces in a match [9]. **Turner**, in her first professional start, dished out a team-record 55 assists and added 20 digs. Fellow rookie **Oglivie** posted a franchise-best 28 digs. **Snyder** led the offense with 18 kills and six aces, surpassing the team's single-season and career ace record mark.

March 30, 2025: The Rise [8-12] fell to the Omaha Supernovas in four sets at CHI Health Center by set scores of 20-25, 25-17, 19-25, 22-25. Despite **Snyder's** 26-point performance — comprising 20 kills, four blocks, and two aces — and a team hitting percentage of .235, Grand Rapids couldn't overcome Omaha's defensive prowess. The Rise outperformed the Supernovas in kills [57-54], blocks [12-6], and aces [4-3], but Omaha's 83 digs proved decisive.

April 1, 2025: The Rise signed outside/opposite hitter **Eleanor Holthaus**. A former standout at Iowa State with 1,516 kills, Holthaus is a three-year pro with experience in Puerto Rico and Germany.

April 5, 2025: The Rise [9-12] delivered a dominant performance on Eras Night, sweeping the Vegas Thrill 25-17, 25-16, 25-17 for their largest margin of victory in franchise history. Grand Rapids held Vegas to just 50 total points and a .057 hitting percentage, both season lows for a Rise opponent. **Briggs-Romine** led the offense with 13 kills and 12 digs, while **Snyder** added nine kills and 10 digs. Newcomer **Holthaus** contributed nine kills in her Rise debut.

April 8, 2025: **Briggs-Romine** earns her first PVF Player of the Week honors after leading a 3-0 sweep of the Vegas Thrill with 13 kills, a block, an ace, and 12 digs. The Rise held Vegas to a franchise-low 50 points and a .057 hitting percentage.

April 10, 2025: The Rise [9-13] fell in four sets to the Orlando Valkyries at Addition Financial Arena by set scores of 18-25, 25-18, 18-25, 15-25. Grand Rapids responded to an opening-set loss by hitting .378 and recording five blocks in the second set, leveling the match. However, Orlando's defense tightened, limiting the Rise to a .182 hitting percentage in the third set and -.053 in the fourth.

April 12, 2025: The Rise [10-13] secured their first-ever win over the Indy Ignite with a gritty five-set victory at Fishers Event Center, 25-17, 22-25, 21-25, 25-18, 15-11. Grand Rapids tied the single-match record with 24 blocks and set a franchise-best with 93 digs. **Bastianelli** led the defensive effort, recording a team-record nine blocks, along with 10 kills and seven digs. **Oglivie** anchored the back row with 24 digs, while **Snyder** and **Briggs-Romine** contributed 16 and 12 kills, respectively.

April 17, 2025: The Rise [10-14] suffered a 3-0 road defeat to the Omaha Supernovas by set scores of 16-25, 23-25, 24-26. Despite late surges in the second and third sets, Grand Rapids couldn't overcome Omaha's early dominance. **Holthaus** led the Rise with seven kills, while **Snyder** and **Pritchard** each added six.

April 19, 2025: The Rise [11-14] kept their playoff hopes alive with a 3-1 victory over the Indy Ignite, winning by set scores of 25-27, 25-21, 25-18, 25-22. **Bastianelli** led the defensive effort, matching her own team record with nine blocks, while the team collectively posted 21 blocks — the second-most in franchise history.

RISE MYTHOLOGY

April 26, 2025: The Rise [11-15] fell in a heartbreaking five-set battle to the Atlanta Vibe, 25-23, 25-22, 21-25, 23-25, 15-13, despite setting a franchise record with 103 digs. **Bastianelli** led the way with a season-high 20 kills and three blocks, while **Turner** set a franchise assist record with 58 and added 21 digs. Libero **Oglivie** also broke the team record with 30 digs. The loss extended Atlanta's PVF-record winning streak to 12 and put the Rise's playoff hopes in jeopardy ahead of their final two regular-season matches.

April 29, 2025: **Bastianelli** claims her first PVF Player of the Week honors after a season-high 20 kills and three blocks against the Atlanta Vibe. She leads the league with 84 blocks this season and holds the PVF career record with 146.

April 30, 2025: The Rise [11-16] surrendered a 2-0 lead and lost in five sets to the Orlando Valkyries at home, 19-25, 17-25, 25-23, 25-21, 14-16. **Briggs-Romine** posted 18 kills and 19 digs, while **Snyder** added 17 kills and 15 digs. **Bastianelli** had 11 kills and four blocks, and **Turner** tallied 56 assists and 23 digs. The Valkyries racked up 111 digs as a team, the most ever for an opponent against the Rise.



May 2, 2025: The Rise [11-17] concluded their 2025 season with a 3-1 loss to the Omaha Supernovas at Van Andel Arena by set scores of 19-25, 25-17, 25-20, 25-21. Despite the electric atmosphere created by 6,509 fans — the third-largest crowd in franchise history — the Rise couldn't overcome Omaha's offensive depth. **Holthaus** led Grand Rapids with 18 kills, while **Snyder** and **Briggs-Romine** each added 10.

May 6, 2025: **Snyder** and **Bastianelli** are named to the 2025 PVF All-League Second Team. **Snyder** led the team with 388 points and set a franchise record for aces [33], while **Bastianelli** topped the league with 89 blocks.

May 7, 2025: **Bastianelli** is named the 2025 PVF Middle Blocker of the Year. She led the league with 89 blocks during the regular season, set a Rise single-match record with nine blocks twice, and recorded a PVF-record 20 kills by a middle blocker in a match. Following the Rise's final regular-season match on May 2, **Bastianelli** officially announced her retirement from professional volleyball, concluding a six-year career that included two seasons in PVF.

May 20, 2025: Middle blocker **Colvin** is named to the U.S. Women's U23 National Team training camp for the NORCECA Pan American Cup. A 2025 rookie and Purdue standout, Colvin recorded 31 kills and nine blocks in her first pro season with the Rise.

Aug. 5, 2025: In a landmark move for the sport, Pro Volleyball Federation and Major League Volleyball announce plans for a single, unified league poised to elevate professional women's volleyball in the United States. The unified league is branded as MLV.

Aug. 7, 2025: The MLV free agency period opens and the Rise sign U.S. National Team setter **Saige Ka'aha'aina-Torres** and former Florida four-time AVCA All-American middle

blocker **Rhamat Alhassan**. Also, **Snyder** and **Briggs-Romine** return to the Rise, having signed two-year contracts the season before.

Aug. 8, 2025: Hometown middle blocker **Jensen** signs for a third season with the Rise. She becomes the only player to be with the team since its inaugural season.

Aug. 9, 2025: The Rise sign three more players for their 2026 roster: former Vegas Thrill opposite hitter **Lauren Jardine-Clark**, and a pair of 2024 Rise draft selections in setter **Turner** and libero **Oglivie**.

Aug. 12, 2025: The Rise bolster the team's frontcourt by signing 6-foot-3 middle blocker **Leah Meyer**. She had a decorated collegiate career at Duke and Kentucky and brings four years of professional experience competing at the highest levels in France and Romania.

Aug. 13, 2025: Two more players sign for the Rise for the 2026 season. Romanian international opposite hitter **Elizabet Inneh** joins for her 11th pro season after playing overseas in Europe and Asia. Colombian libero **Camila Gómez** also returns to Grand Rapids after spending the 2025 season with the Omaha Supernovas.

Aug. 20, 2025: Grand Rapids makes its last free agency signing of the summer by bringing in veteran outside hitter **Allison Mayfield**. A native of Overland Park, Kansas, Mayfield will enter her 10th professional season after competing in leagues across Europe, South America, and North America, including the last two years with the Vegas Thrill and Omaha Supernovas in the United States.

Sept. 22, 2025: Rise libero **Oglivie** helps the U.S. Women's National Team win gold at the NORCECA Final Six tournament.



Nov. 12, 2025: Rise Head Coach and Vice President of Volleyball Operations **Cathy George** signs a two-year contract extension through the 2027 MLV season.

Nov. 14, 2025: Former All-Star middle blocker **Berkeley Oblad** joins the Rise after spending the last two seasons with the now-inactive Vegas Thrill.

Nov. 17, 2025: **Brady Compton** rejoins the organization as an assistant coach after previously serving as a data analyst for the Rise during the team's inaugural 2024 season.

Nov. 18, 2025: Former Marquette standout **Jenna Reitsma** is named the team's new director of volleyball operations.

Nov. 24, 2025: The Rise make four selections in the 2025 MLV Draft: **Alexis Shelton** (First Round, Selection 4), **Candela Alonso-Corcelles** (Second Round, Selection 11), **Jordan Wilson** (Third Round, Selection 18), and **Hattie Bray** (Fourth Round, Selection 25).

Dec. 1, 2025: Grand Rapids starts training camp for the 2026 MLV season.

Dec. 11, 2025: The Rise sign former Ferris State opposite hitter **Olivia Henneman-Dallape** after joining training camp as a tryout player.

Jan. 5, 2026: Grand Rapids announces the 16-player roster for the start of the 2026 MLV season with **Wilson** and **Henneman-Dallape** being waived.

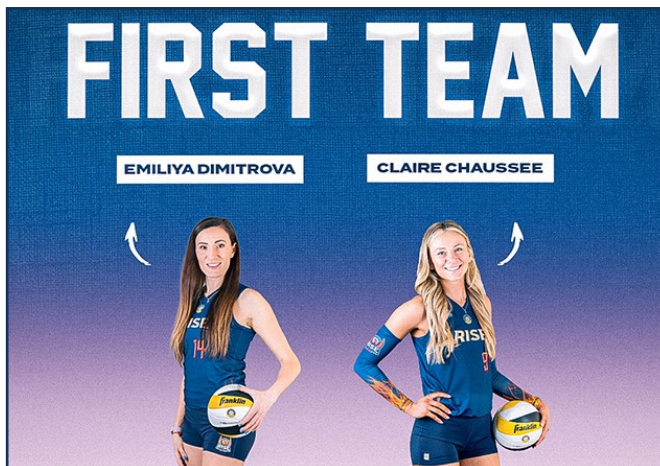

INFORMATION

There have been three collegiate player drafts for Major League Volleyball with the draft being held in the fall the year prior to that season starting in January. The first draft was a snake format with Grand Rapids selecting in the middle of the seven teams. The second draft used the 2024 regular-season final standings to determine the first round order before using a random lottery to generate the draft order for Rounds 2-5. New franchise Indy Ignite was granted the No. 1 overall selection. The 2025 draft order slotted teams into two groups (playoff and non-playoff teams) and used reverse regular-season records in the first round followed by rotating the order within the two groups for Rounds 2-4. Trades can be made for players, draft picks, future considerations, or any combination thereof.

DRAFT ELIGIBILITY

Any player drafted must be at least 18 years or older on the day of the draft and must be defined as a collegiate athlete, which is defined as a female volleyball player who is:

- Enrolled in a four-year college or university in the United States and who (i) did not graduate prior to August of the draft year and (ii) who has remaining eligibility to play collegiately during the current college indoor season; or
- Enrolled in a two-year junior college or community college in the United States and (i) who did not graduate prior to August of the draft year and (ii) who has remaining eligibility to play collegiately during the current college indoor season.

Any athlete who meets the criteria of a collegiate player is eligible to be drafted during the respective year's MLV Draft.
