The Omaha Supernovas have announced an expanded partnership with Kiewit for the 2026 season, strengthening a growing collaboration with one of North America's largest and most respected construction and engineering firms.

The signature Kiewit Court will return to the CHI Health Center, featuring the company's iconic branding emblazoned on Omaha's Taraflex performance court. The logos made their first appearance on the FS1 nationally televised match on Saturday, March 22, 2025, between the Supernovas and Indy Ignite, in which Omaha welcomed 12,929, marking the second-largest crowd in professional volleyball history.

As part of the enhanced partnership, Kiewit's distinctive branding will be showcased on the Supernovas jersey with the CHI Health Center also hosting Kiewit Night for a 2026 home match. The Kiewit-Supernovas strategic partnership will also include a variety of local and national marketing and community activations, featuring prominent branding during matches, on TV, the web and radio to support recruiting, business development and other key stakeholder outreach.

CHI Health Center Omaha



CHI Health Center Construction

Built for \$291 million and finished in the fall of 2003, CHI Health Center Omaha is a key element in the continued renovation and development of Omaha's riverfront. The facility formerly known as Qwest Center Omaha (2003-11) and CenturyLink Center Omaha (2011-18) is located on a 421-acre site of the former Union Pacific Railroad yards.

In 2018, CHI Health agreed to pay \$23.6 million over 20 years for the naming rights to the arena. Among the amenities at CHI Health Center Omaha are seven locker rooms, five dressing rooms and a media interview room. In the summer of 2023, a lighting upgrade project was completed. CHI Health Center Omaha also provides more than 194,000 square feet of exhibition space.

Funding for CHI Health Center Omaha came from private donations, taxes and projected revenue from the facility. The facility has hosted some of America's top sporting events, including the NCAA Men's Basketball Championships (2008, 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2024), NCAA Volleyball Championships (2006, 2008, 2015, 2020 and 2022), U.S. Olympic Team Trials for Swimming (2008, 2012, 2016 and 2021), NCAA Wrestling Finals (2010), the U.S. Figure Skating Championships (2013) as well as four title fights for boxing champion Terence Crawford.

New Scoreboard and LED Displays at CHI Health Center Omaha

MECA is excited to debut CHI Health Center's brand-new, state-of-the-art scoreboard and other new LED displays ahead of the 2025 fall sports season. The new center-hung scoreboard features over 34.8 million pixels, over ten times as many as the old scoreboard, and 2,344 square feet of wraparound video display, including four underbelly displays for those sitting closer to the action.

Other technology refreshes inside the arena include enhanced ribbon displays on each side of the arena, four vomitory displays mounted above each of the entrances to the seating bowl, 16 new courtside scorers' table LED displays, and an end wall video display at the south end of the arena. The CHI Health Center's exterior displays were also included in the upgrades. The marquee display at 10th Street and Capitol Ave, and six parking displays, were upgraded as well. This \$6.5 million improvement keeps the CHI Health Center as one of the best indoor sporting venues in Nebraska and the Midwest, regularly hosting NCAA men's basketball and volleyball national championships.

The new LED displays made their debut during the Nebraska vs. Creighton volleyball match on Tuesday, September 16, 2025.

THE COOPER EFFECT

- Supernovas outside hitter Reagan Cooper has been one of the primary drivers behind Omaha's franchise record five-match winning streak, which began when she entered the starting lineup for the first time against Indy on Jan. 24.
- The second-year Supernova has averaged 4.71 points per set since joining the lineup, including 4.14 kills per set, along with nine blocks and two aces.
- Cooper has already matched her Supernovas career high in kills twice during this five-match run. Her 23 kills and two blocks came up clutch in Omaha's 3-2 win over San Diego on Jan. 30. In the Supernovas most recent outing at Orlando, the Kansas graduate matched her kill total of 23 on a .400 hitting percentage alongside two blocks.

DEFYING THE PASS

- The Supernovas have become an outlier in MLV history when it comes to poor passing, finding ways to win despite passing at 35% positive or lower four times in franchise history.
- Of those 17 matches that the 35% threshold has been met, only six times has that team gone on to win — and Omaha accounts for four of them.
- Among all 17 performances, the Supernovas make up three of the top four hitting percentages, including the top mark of 0.362, which is 77 percentage points higher than San Diego's 0.285.
- Sunday's match against the Valkyries also marked just the seventh time in the 17 contests that a team recorded double-digit blocks. Omaha has reached that mark three times, including the top two totals of 16 and 13 stuffs.
- Of the seven teams that have posted a positive pass percentage of 35% or lower, only three have won their match and Omaha is the only unbeaten team among them (4-0).

THE SECOND-YEAR SURGE

- After a slow start in January to begin her second professional season, middle blocker Toyosi Onabanjo has become a lethal offensive option for the Supernovas attack.
- In her first four appearances of the season, the Kansas graduate recorded six kills compared to seven errors. Once the calendar moved to February, she's responded with 24 kills and two errors in the last three matches.

- Supernovas outside hitter Brooke Nuneviller has put together the best start in her pro career with eight double-doubles in the first 10 matches.
- Entering Thursday, Nuneviller leads MLV in kills (168) and points (182) while ranking second in kills per set (4.00) as well as fourth in both points per set (4.33) and total digs (132). She's also eighth in digs per set (3.14).
- Her 168 points across the first five weeks of the 2026 season marks the best start for Nuneviller in her Supernovas career. For comparison, she collected 148 points through the first 10 matches in 2025, and 150 points in 2024. That's a 12% total point increase from 2024 to 2026.

LUKA SLABE BEGINS U.S. PRO VB CHAPTER

- Slabe was announced as the new Omaha Supernovas head coach on August 5, 2025, marking a new era for the franchise as it enters the 2026 Major League Volleyball Season.
- Slabe has been a coaching mainstay for USA Volleyball, currently serving as an assistant coach for the U.S. Men's National Team since 2024. Slabe will continue in that role during the Supernovas offseason as he helps lead the U.S. Men into the 2028 L.A. Olympics.
- The Slovenian helped usher in the golden era of women's volleyball for Team USA as the Americans won the country's first-ever gold medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, plus three-straight FIVB Volleyball Nations League titles in 2018, 2019, and 2021.
- Slabe has seven years of head coaching experience with pro teams across Europe from 2008 to 2015. In that time, Slabe's teams won six national and international championships alongside six runner-up finishes.
- Winning an NCAA men's volleyball national title at BYU as a player in 2001, Slabe later served as an assistant coach for his alma mater from 2015 to 2018, aiding the Cougars to a 75–16 record in three years with two national runner-up finishes.
- Slabe served as the head coach for the NC State women's volleyball program for five seasons (2020–2024), leading the Wolfpack to a 78–55 record and its fourth-ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

FAMILIAR FACES

- Reigning MLV Outside Hitter of the Year **Brooke Nuneviller** returns to Omaha as a two-time All-League First Team pick after ranking second in MLV in kills per set (3.77), fourth in kills (381) and sixth in both total digs (348) and digs per set (3.45).
- The 2024 MLV Rookie of the Year, **Reagan Cooper** remains with the Novas for a second-straight season after collecting 265 kills (9th in MLV) and 3.49 kills per set (6th) in 2025. Hard-swinging opposite **Emily Londot** tallied 2.78 kills and 2.17 digs per set across 46 sets in her rookie campaign after getting drafted at No. 10 overall in the second round by the Supernovas.
- Allison Holder** will be one of the best backup liberos in MLV this season. She became Omaha's starter in the last five matches of 2025, finishing with 1.70 digs per set.
- Similar to Holder, middle blocker **Toyosi Onabanjo** came alive in the back half of her rookie season, recording 26 of her 33 season kills in the season's final three matches, including 11 kills and two blocks in the semifinal loss to Indy.
- Finally, 2025 MLV Setter of the Year **Sydney Hilley** re-signed with the Supernovas after spending one season with the Indy Ignite — where she led the franchise to a MLV Runner-Up finish in their first season. She was a part-time starter with Omaha in the 2024 regular season before sparking the Supernovas' inaugural MLV Championship run to earn postseason MVP honors.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE NEBRASKA

- Omaha has always focused on homegrown talent in its roster building and that didn't change in 2026 with a franchise-record six players having Nebraska connections.
- Opposite **Merritt Beason** was one of the Supernovas' biggest signings in the free agency period. Before spending her rookie season in Atlanta as the No. 1 overall pick in the MLV Draft, Beason was an All-American for Nebraska, spending 2023 and 2024 in Lincoln.
- Middle blocker **Leyla Blackwell** became best friends with Beason in their senior season in Lincoln in 2024. The San Diego native became a fourth-round pick of her hometown Mojo where she spent her rookie campaign before returning to Nebraska.
- Outside Hitter **Norah (Sis) TeBrake** has a similar pedigree, tallying two All-America honors in four years at Creighton before becoming the No. 3 overall pick by Orlando where she would help the Valkyries win the 2025 MLV Championship.
- Holder and middle blocker **Elise Goetzinger** share roots in Omaha as each spent their final college seasons at Creighton. Holder helped the Bluejays to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2022 while Goetzinger aided CU to an NCAA Regional Final — the best postseason finish in school history.
- The Supernovas dipped back into the Creighton pipeline for the second-straight year, taking Bluejay All-American middle blocker **Kiara Reinhardt** at No. 8 overall in the first round.

Amy Pauley was recognized as one of the top up-and-coming coaches in college volleyball and was hired as the first head coach of the Orlando Valkyries ahead of the first Major League Volleyball season in 2024. Formerly the associate head coach for USC's women's volleyball program, Pauley also serves as the Vice President of Volleyball Operations.

After an 8-16 2024 season, Pauley changed the trajectory of the franchise with the signing of opposite and 2025 MVP Brittany Abercrombie as well as setter Chompoor Guedpard. Combined with All-League middle Kaz Brown, and the development of rookie ace leader Natalie Foster (64), Orlando marched to the 2025 MLV Championship.

Her national acclaim includes being listed on VolleyballMag.com's 2020 Under 40 Coaching Hotshots and the 2016 AVCA 30 Under 30 list. The Omaha Supernovas are honored to welcome volleyball legend and four-time collegiate national champion John Cook as Co-Owner and General Manager of the organization.


"After more than 30 years of coaching, I knew I wanted the next chapter to be just as impactful and becoming the General Manager of the Omaha Supernovas is exactly that opportunity," said Cook. "I've spent my career helping grow the game at the college level, and now I have the chance to take that knowledge and apply it in a new way, with the world's leading professional volleyball franchise. The energy around our sport has never been higher, and the Supernovas are at the forefront of that momentum. There's no better place than Nebraska, and no better organization than the Supernovas, to help take this sport to the next level."

In what marks the most monumental signing in professional volleyball history, Cook will help lead all team operations, including player and coaching staff signings, as the Supernovas prepare for a run at the MLV Championship, with regular season action set to start in January 2026.

Cook will report to and collaborate closely with Team President Diane Mendenhall, whose continued leadership of the front office and external operations has helped propel the Supernovas to No. 1 in the world in professional volleyball average attendance for two consecutive seasons.

The foundation of this reunion was laid 25 years ago, when Cook hired Mendenhall as he took the reins of Nebraska Volleyball in 2000, first-ever Director of Operations, making her just the third person in NCAA history to hold a dedicated operations role in volleyball.

"I've always cherished my relationship with Coach Cook, and it's incredibly special to be reuniting with him," said Mendenhall. "It's a full-circle moment, as he was the one who brought me to Nebraska when he took over volleyball program in 2000. I was there with him from the beginning and saw firsthand how he built it into the national powerhouse we see today. Being part of that foundation shaped how we approached building the Supernovas, and we leaned on that same blueprint at the pro level. His, vision, experience, and winning mentality is unmatched, and I'm thrilled to be working alongside Coach Cook again as he helps elevate Major League Volleyball to stand shoulder to shoulder with the world's most elite professional sports leagues."



In a landmark move for the sport, Pro Volleyball Federation (PVF) and Major League Volleyball have announced plans for a single, united league poised to elevate professional women's volleyball in the United States. The unified league will be branded as MLV.

MLV will be the longest running professional women's volleyball league and the only one operating with independently owned teams in-market, alongside a league structure built to resemble those at the pinnacle of sports. It will build on its first two successful seasons, which saw outstanding digital engagement, with more than 80 million social impressions, nearly one million total engagements and over 250,000 social followers. In addition, attendance has reached more than 750,000 over the first two campaigns, with 45 nationally-televisioned matches – including an inaugural All-Star Match that drew a peak viewership of 445,000 on CBS network television.

Scheduled to begin play in January 2026, MLV is an evolution of PVF and the upcoming campaign will be recorded as the league's third season.

MLV will feature the following team lineup for 2026 - Atlanta, Columbus, Dallas, Grand Rapids, Indianapolis, Omaha, Orlando and San Diego. In 2027, the league is currently slated to expand with three more franchises with the addition of teams in Minnesota, Washington DC and Northern California, who will use '26 to introduce fans to the league in advance of their inaugural seasons.
