VENTURA COUNTY FIRE DEPT.

RECRUITMENT FOR FIRE CADET

THE PURPOSE:

The Fire Cadet Program is intended to expose student grades 11 & 12 to a career in the Fire Service.

THE POSITION:

The position of Fire Cadet is non-paid. Each Fire Cadet is assigned to a battalion or zone and placed under direct supervision of a Fire Captain and crew. Ride along certified Fire Cadets will ride-along on the apparatus to which they are assigned to that day and respond as observers to various types of emergencies including, fires, traffic collisions, medical aids, and calls for public service. Cadets are assigned homework and are required to attend Battalion/Zone Cadet Drills. Cadets are required to attend one mandatory meeting a month and one mandatory drill day a month as well as 10 shifts a month at the fire station.

THE REQUIREMENTS:

The applicant must have a 2.5 GPA from the most recent quarter report card at the time of application, be on track to graduate high school in the expected time frame (if applicable), have a good attendance record at school and be physically fit. The applicant must be able to demonstrate maturity to be considered for the program.

As a representative of the Ventura County Fire Department during the program, cadets are expected to maintain a conservative professional appearance at all times while working at a fire station. The applicant will adhere to the cadet program dress policy and personal grooming expectations. This will include no visible tattoos or body jewelry.

THE EXAMINATION PROCESS:

Please get an application from one of these stations: Station 43 Simi Valley, Station 30 Thousand Oaks, or Station 27 Fillmore.

Applicants must submit an application in person with a copy of the most recent quarter report card and high school transcripts to one of three stations: Fire Station 43, 5874 E. Los Angeles Ave. Simi Valley *OR* Station 30, 325 West Hillcrest Dr., Thousand Oaks Ca 91360 *OR* Station 27, 613 Old Telegraph Rd., Fillmore 93015 no later than 6:00 p.m. on May 5th. (If the student has a current driver's license, a DMV driving record must also be submitted). Upon a successful application review, the applicants that meet the qualifications will be invited to a physical fitness test. The minimum requirements are a one mile run in under eight minutes and thirty seconds, thirty push-ups in a two minute period and thirty sit-ups in a two minute period. If the physical expectations are met, a formal oral interview will follow. If the candidate is successful he or she may be placed on an eligibility list for the spring 2017 school semester.



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


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Drug & Alcohol Prevention Contract
